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- SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 17-87-103(11), concerning exceptions to the nurse practice act, is amended to read as follows:
- 8 (11)(A) The administration of <u>insulin</u>, or glucagon, or both to a
- 9 student who is suffering from with type 1 diabetes or the provision of
- 10 <u>assistance with self-administration of insulin by a student with diabetes</u> by
- 11 trained volunteer school personnel designated as care providers in a plan
- developed under Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, 29 U.S.C. §
- 701 et seq., or the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, 20 U.S.C. §
- 14 1400 et seq., as it existed on July 1, 2011 as each existed on January 1,
- 15 2013, who have been trained by a licensed nurse employed by a school district
- 16 or other health-care professional to administer glucagon to a child with type
- 17 diabetes in an emergency situation or to administer insulin to a child with
- 18 <u>diabetes</u>.
- 19 (B)(i) A licensed nurse employed by a school district or

14	with diabetes from attending a school on the basis that:		
15	(a) The student has diabetes;		
16	(b) The school does not have a full-time
