SECTION 6. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND ALLOCATION. The appropriation for the Isolated Funding line item in Section 1 of this Act may be fully funded. Any funding and appropriation for Isolated

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- 1 Funding that is not utilized shall be transferred to the appropriation for
- 2 Special Needs Isolated Funding in Section 1 of this Act and shall be used
- 3 there for fully funding each subsection (c) through (f) of Arkansas Code

The funds appropriated herein for 5 Residential Centers/Juvenile Detention shall be allocated in accordance with 6 rules and regulations established by the State Board of Education. 7 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, -20128 2013 through June 30, 2013 2014. 9 SECTION 12. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 10 11 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER 12 AUTHORITY. The Commissioner of the Department of Education, with the approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and after approval by the Arkansas 13 14 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee, is hereby authorized to 15 request necessary appropriation transfers and any other budget related 16 adjustments necessary within the Department of Education. Provided, however, 17 that the Department of Education shall be limited to submitting no more than 18 two transfer requests during any fiscal year. 19 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of 20 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year 21 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by 22 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and 23 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by 24

amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly has determined that the Department of Education may operate more efficiently if some flexibility is provided to the Commissioner of the Department of Education authorizing broad powers under the Transfer Authority provision herein. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this section. requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a court jurisdiction, this entire section is void. The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2012

SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 13 14 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 15 INTERVENTION BLOCK GRANTS FUNDING RESTRICTION. The Department of Education 16 shall make available from the Intervention Block Grants appropriation 17 authorized by this Act, one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) each fiscal 18 year for the annual expenses of the Quiz Bowl, thirteen thousand five hundred 19 dollars (\$13,500) each fiscal year for Creativity in Arkansas, Inc. for 20 grants up to \$1,000 each for students and chaperones, thirteen thousand five 21 hundred dollars (\$13,500) each fiscal year for Destination Imagination, one 22 hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) each fiscal year for the State History 23 Day Competition, and seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) each fiscal year 24 for a grant to the Arkansas Science Fair Association for grants to regional 25 and the state science fairs. The Department of Education shall allocate 26 General Revenue funding totaling no less than three hundred two thousand 27 dollars (\$302,000) each fiscal year from the Department of Education Public 28 School Fund Account to support the annual expenses of the Quiz Bowl, the 29 Creativity in Arkansas, Inc. for grants up to \$1,000 each for students and 30 chaperones, Destination Imagination, the State History Day Competition, and 31 the Arkansas Science Fair Association for grants to regional and state 32 science fairs. The Department shall either expend or have committed for 33 expenditure the monies allocated for the Quiz Bowl, Creativity in Arkansas, Inc., Destination Imagination, the State History Day Competition, and 34 35 Arkansas Science Fair Association grants as authorized herein in order to 36 fulfill the provisions of this section.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, $\frac{2012}{2013}$ through June 30, $\frac{2013}{2014}$.

- 35 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
- 36 DISTRESSED SCHOOL DISTRICT SUPPORT. The funds appropriated in the line item

- 1 "Distressed School District Support" in Section 1 of this Act may be used for
- 2 technical assistance offered by the Department of Education to school
- 3 districts in academic distress that can include, but is not limited to,
- 4 teacher specialists, principal specialists, and other personnel assigned by
- 5 the department. These funds may also be used for alternative research-based
- 6 technical assistance or programs. Criteria for selecting and approving
- 7 alternative research-based technical assistance or programs are to be
- 8 promulgated as a rule by the State Board of Education, provided that
- 9 alternative staffing and/or compensation programs for teachers shall be
- 10 approved by at least a majority of the teachers in the school, schools, or

- 25 SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 26 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
- 27 RETIREMENT MATCHING. Beginning with the 1996-97 school year, Local School
- 28 Districts shall pay the teacher retirement employer contribution rate for any

- 31 Teacher Retirement Matching each fiscal year shall be used to provide the
- 32 employer matching for employees of the Cooperative Education Services Areas,
- 33 Vocational Centers, Arkansas Easter Seals and the school operated by the
- 34 Department of Correction.
- 35 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July $1, \frac{2012}{1}$
- 36 <u>2013</u> through June 30, <u>2013</u> <u>2014</u>.

SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. OPEN-ENROLLMENT VIRTUAL CHARTER SCHOOL FUNDING RESTRICTIONS.

Regardless of any provision of law to the contrary, no school district shall receive state funding for the 2012-2013 2013-2014 school year for those students who are included in the district's average daily membership for the previous school year but who are attending any open-enrollment charter school that uses internet, long-distance, or virtual technology as the primary method of teaching.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, $\frac{2012}{2013}$ through June 30, $\frac{2013}{2014}$.

SECTION 21. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. BETTER CHANCE PROGRAM ADMINISTRATIVE FEES. The Department of Education is hereby authorized to expend a maximum of two percent (2%) of available funds for administration of the Better Chance Program. Up to 1.8% of available funds shall be used to administer the program and to monitor program grantees to ensure compliance with programmatic standards. Prior to the utilization of the remaining 0.2% of available funds, the Department of Education shall seek prior review and approval of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee by providing a written request to include the following: a) the Department's reason(s) for the use of the funds and b) the amount of funds that will be expended. The Department may contract with the Division of Child Care and Early Childhood Education to administer the program.

Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this section. The requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section.

- 1 If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget
- 2 Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction,
- 3 this entire section is void.
- 4 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, $\frac{2012}{1}$

- 9 TEACHER SALARY. The Arkansas Department of Education is requested to
- 10 calculate Average Teacher Salary in the Department's Annual Statistical
- 11 Report to not include extra duty funds. Specifically, the Department is
- 12 requested to calculate the Average Teacher Salary amount using the National
- 13 Education Association definitions for Average Salary for Classroom Teachers.
- 14 The Arkansas Department of Education shall submit this data annually to the
- 15 National Education Association in accordance with that organization's
- 16 deadlines for submission for their report "Rankings and Estimates" which
- 17 includes state-by-state teacher salary comparisons.

- 19 SECTION 23. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 20 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CARRY
- 21 FORWARD. Any unexpended balance of monies allocated for the Arkansas Better
- 22 Chance for School Success Program remaining on June 30, 2013, in the
- 23 Department of Education Public School Fund Account shall be designated and
- 24 retained for the Arkansas Better Chance for School Success Program.
- 25 Any carry forward of unexpended balance of funding as authorized herein,
- 26 may be carried forward under the following conditions:
- 27 (1) Prior to June 30, -2013 2014 the Agency shall by written statement set
- 28 forth its reason(s) for the need to carry forward said funding to the
- 29 Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget;
- 30 (2) The Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget shall
- 31 report to the Arkansas Legislative Council all amounts carried forward by the
- 32 September Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee meeting
- 33 which report shall include the name of the Agency, Board, Commission or

The Employee Benefits Division of the 18 Department of Finance and Administration may use up to eleven dollars and 19 twenty cents (\$11.20) from each contribution made under Arkansas Code 20 §6-17-1117 (a) to offset the cost of health insurance premiums to eligible 21 members electing to participate in the public school employees' health 22 insurance program as a retiree.

SECTION 25. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
ARKANSAS/STRIVE PROGRAM TRANSFER. The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State
shall transfer on his books and those of the State Treasurer and the State

- Auditor, the sum of two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) during each fiscal year from the Department of Education Public School Fund Account to
- 30 the University of Arkansas at Little Rock Fund, specifically to provide

When the Department of Education uses a new methodology or technology to recalculate square miles to determine student transportation distance, density ratio, total area, or bus route miles for the purpose of determining the amount of isolated funding a school district receives under Ark. Code Ann. § 6-20-601 et seq., the school district shall receive an amount of isolated funding that is not less than the amount of isolated funding the school district would have received based on the school district's square miles calculated in the prior school year; provided that the school district remains eligible for isolated funding under § 6-20-601 et seq.

SECTION 33. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

SECTION 34. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

SECTION 35. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the

1	General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
2	the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
3	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2013 is essential to the operation of
4	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided; with the
5	exception that SECTION 32 in this Act shall be in full force and effect from
6	and after the date of its passage and approval, and that in the event of an
7	extension of the legislative session, the delay in the effective date of this
8	Act beyond July 1, 2013 could work irreparable harm upon the proper
9	administration and provision of essential governmental programs, with the
10	exception that SECTION 32 in this Act shall be in full force and effect from
11	and after the date of its passage and approval. Therefore, an emergency is
12	hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate
13	preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force
14	and effect from and after July 1, 2013; with the exception that SECTION 32 in
15	this Act shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its
16	passage and approval.
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
