4	SECTION 7. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
5	CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. MANDATORY
6	FUNDING PROVISION. The Department of Education shall expend or have
7	committed for expenditure funds in the Department of Education Public School
8	Fund Account in the amount of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) to
9	provide funding for grants and aid to local school districts for the
10	International Baccalaureate Program as appropriated herein.
11	The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
12	<u>2013 through June 30, 2014.</u>

14	SECTION 8. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

16	ALLOCATION. The appropriation for the Isolated Funding line item in Section 1

35	SCHOOL DISTRICTS. For the purposes of distributing the Grants To School
36	Districts appropriation in Section 1 of this Act, "school district" means a
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1 school district which contracts with a school district in an adjoining state 2 for the education of some of the pupils within the Arkansas school district 3 because the portion of the school district wherein such pupils live is 4 completely separated from the remainder of the school district by a reservoir 5 covering at least 12,000 acres at normal water level, and where to attend 6 school in their own district, the pupils of said portion would be required to 7 travel or to be transported a distance (measured by the nearest highway or 8 road route) of more than 35 miles round trip and pass through another school 9 district or districts. The Department of Education shall distribute the 10 monies appropriated for Grants to School Districts in Section 1 of this Act 11 to such school districts as reimbursement for expenses incurred in educating 12 the pupils residing in the separated portion of the school district. The 13 payments are to be limited to the amount of available appropriation. Such 14 school districts shall file a request for reimbursement with the Department 15 of Education and provide the Department of Education with such documentation 16 as is deemed necessary.

17 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2012
18 <u>2013</u> through June 30, 2014.

20 SECTION 10. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 21 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SPECIAL 22 EDUCATION SERVICES. The funds appropriated in the line item "Special 23 Education Services" in Section 1 of this Act shall be used to provide 24 extended year summer programs for handicapped students in need of such 25 services, to provide special education services to foster children who are 26 wards of the State, and to provide funds for the payment of salaries of 27 special education supervisors. Upon the receipt of such certification, the State 4 Treasurer, after making those deductions as set out in Arkansas Code 19-5-5 202(b)(2)(B), shall also deduct from the net general revenues the amount 6 certified and transfer this amount to the Department of Education Public 7 School Fund Account there to be used exclusively for payment of or 8 reimbursement for expenses incurred from the Department of Education Public 9 School Fund Account under any "Desegregation Settlement Agreement".

SECTION 12. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
 CONSOLIDATION INCENTIVE. The appropriation contained herein for Consolidation
 Incentive shall be allocated in accordance with rules and regulations
 established by the State Board of Education.

17 <u>2013</u> through June 30, 2014.

SECTION 13. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
 RESIDENTIAL CENTERS/JUVENILE DETENTION. The funds appropriated herein for
 Residential Centers/Juvenile Detention shall be allocated in accordance with
 rules and regulations established by the State Board of Education.
 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2012
 <u>2013</u> through June 30, 2014.

27 SECTION 14. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 28 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER 29 AUTHORITY. The Commissioner of the Department of Education, with the approval 30 of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and after approval by the Arkansas 31 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee, is hereby authorized to 32 request necessary appropriation transfers and any other budget related 33 adjustments necessary within the Department of Education. Provided, however, 34 that the Department of Education shall be limited to submitting no more than 35 two transfer requests during any fiscal year.

36 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of

1 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year 2 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by 3 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and 4 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by 5 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly 6 has determined that the Department of Education may operate more efficiently 7 if some flexibility is provided to the Commissioner of the Department of 8 Education authorizing broad powers under the Transfer Authority provision 9 herein. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General 10 Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of the Legislative 11 Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this section. The 12 requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee 13 is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of approval by 14 the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional 15 by a court jurisdiction, this entire section is void.

16 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2012 17 <u>2013</u> through June 30, 2014.

19 SECTION 15. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 20 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. AETN 21 DOCUMENTED QUIZ BOWL COSTS. Of the total amount of appropriation and funds 22 authorized herein to the Department of Education for the Quiz Bowl each 23 fiscal year, an amount not to exceed forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) each 24 fiscal year may be made available to the Department of Education -25 Educational Television Division for its documented costs associated with the 26 Quiz Bowl.

30 SECTION *16*. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 31 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 32 INTERVENTION BLOCK GRANTS FUNDING RESTRICTION. The Department of Education 33 shall make available from the Intervention Block Grants appropriation 34 authorized by this Act, one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) each fiscal 35 year for the annual expenses of the Quiz Bowl, thirteen thousand five hundred 36 dollars (\$13,500) each fiscal year for Creativity in Arkansas, Inc. for

1 grants up to \$1,000 each for students and chaperones, thirteen thousand five 2 hundred dollars (\$13,500) each fiscal year for Destination Imagination, one 3 hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) each fiscal year for the State History 4 Day Competition, and seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) each fiscal year 5 for a grant to the Arkansas Science Fair Association for grants to regional 6 and the state science fairs. The Department of Education shall allocate 7 General Revenue funding totaling no less than three hundred two thousand 8 dollars (\$302,000) each fiscal year from the Department of Education Public 9 School Fund Account to support the annual expenses of the Quiz Bowl, the 10 Creativity in Arkansas, Inc. for grants up to \$1,000 each for students and 11 chaperones, Destination Imagination, the State History Day Competition, and 12 the Arkansas Science Fair Association for grants to regional and state 13 science fairs. The Department shall either expend or have committed for 14 expenditure the monies allocated for the Quiz Bowl, Creativity in Arkansas, 15 Inc., Destination Imagination, the State History Day Competition, and 16 Arkansas Science Fair Association grants as authorized herein in order to 17 fulfill the provisions of this section.

18 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,  $\frac{2012}{2013}$  through June 30,  $\frac{2013}{2014}$ .

21 SECTION 17. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 22 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EAST 23 FUNDING PROVISION. Of the total amount appropriated for Technology Grants 24 each fiscal year, an amount of not less than two million dollars (\$2,000,000) 25 or eighteen percent (18%), whichever is greater each fiscal year, shall be 26 awarded through a grant or professional services contract for EAST 27 infrastructure, personnel, and operating expenses. The EAST infrastructure 28 grant or contract for personal services and operating expenses shall be 29 awarded to an entity that has personnel or experience, or both, in 30 implementing the EAST Initiative.

 36 FOR QUALITY TEACHING AND LEARNING FUNDING PROVISION. Of the total

1 appropriation authorized by this Act for Technology Grants the Department of 2 Education shall make available one hundred eighty-seven thousand five hundred 3 seventy-five dollars (\$187,575) each fiscal year for Center for Quality 4 Teaching and Learning initiatives to teach students computer repair in a 5 hands-on environment. The Department of Education shall allocate General 6 Revenue funding totaling no less than one hundred eighty-seven thousand five 7 hundred seventy-five dollars (\$187,575) each fiscal year from the Department 8 of Education Public School Fund Account to support the Center for Quality 9 Teaching and Learning. The Department shall either expend or have committed 10 for expenditure the monies allocated for the Center for Quality Teaching and 11 Learning in order to fulfill the provisions of this section.

12 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 13 2012 2013 through June 30, 2013 2014.

14

15 SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 16 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 17 DISTRESSED SCHOOL DISTRICT SUPPORT. The funds appropriated in the line item 18 "Distressed School District Support" in Section 1 of this Act may be used for 19 technical assistance offered by the Department of Education to school 20 districts in academic distress that can include, but is not limited to, 21 teacher specialists, principal specialists, and other personnel assigned by 22 the department. These funds may also be used for alternative research-based 23 technical assistance or programs. Criteria for selecting and approving 24 alternative research-based technical assistance or programs are to be 25 promulgated as a rule by the State Board of Education, provided that 26 alternative staffing and/or compensation programs for teachers shall be 27 approved by at least a majority of the teachers in the school, schools, or 28 school district participating in the program.

29 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,  $\frac{2012}{30}$ 30  $\frac{2013}{2013}$  through June 30,  $\frac{2014}{2014}$ .

Of the total amount appropriated for Professional 35 Development Funding, four million dollars (\$4,000,000) may be authorized by 36 the Commissioner of the Department of Education to be used by the Department

1 of Education to develop and implement statewide professional development 2 support systems for teachers that will benefit student achievement. 3 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,  $\frac{2012}{1}$ 4 2013 through June 30, 2013 2014. 5 6 SECTION 21. Specifically, the Department is requested to calculate the Average Teacher Salary amount using the National 29 30 Education Association definitions for Average Salary for Classroom Teachers. 31 The Arkansas Department of Education shall submit this data annually to the 32 National Education Association in accordance with that organization's 33 deadlines for submission for their report "Rankings and Estimates" which 34 includes state-by-state teacher salary comparisons.

SECTION 25. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
