For the purposes of distributing the Grants To School 10 Districts appropriation in Section 1 of this Act, "school district" means a 11 school district which contracts with a school district in an adjoining state 12 for the education of some of the pupils within the Arkansas school district 13 because the portion of the school district wherein such pupils live is 14 completely separated from the remainder of the school district by a reservoir 15 covering at least 12,000 acres at normal water level, and where to attend 16 school in their own district, the pupils of said portion would be required to 17 travel or to be transported a distance (measured by the nearest highway or 18 road route) of more than 35 miles round trip and pass through another school 19 district or districts. The Department of Education shall distribute the 20 monies appropriated for Grants to School Districts in Section 1 of this Act 21 to such school districts as reimbursement for expenses incurred in educating 22 the pupils residing in the separated portion of the school district. The 23 payments are to be limited to the amount of available appropriation. Such 24 school districts shall file a request for reimbursement with the Department 25 of Education and provide the Department of Education with such documentation 26 as is deemed necessary. 27 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2012 28 2013 through June 30, 2013 2014. 29 30 SECTION 11. - 1 SECTION 15. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER 2 AUTHORITY. The Commissioner of the Department of Education, with the approval 3 4 of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and after approval by the Arkansas 5 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee, is hereby authorized to 6 request necessary appropriation transfers and any other budget related 7 adjustments necessary within the Department of Education. Provided, however, 8 that the Department of Education shall be limited to submitting no more than 9 two transfer requests during any fiscal year.
- 10 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of 11 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year 12 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by 13 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and 14 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by 15 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly 16 has determined that the Department of Education may operate more efficiently 17 if some flexibility is provided to the Commissioner of the Department of 18 Education authorizing broad powers under the Transfer Authority provision 19 herein. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General 20 Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of the Legislative 21 Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this section. 22 requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee 23 is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of approval by 24 the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional 25 by a court jurisdiction, this entire section is void.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, $\frac{2012}{2013}$ through June 30, $\frac{2013}{2014}$.

Of the total amount of appropriation and funds 32 authorized herein to the Department of Education for the Quiz Bowl each 33 fiscal year, an amount not to exceed forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) each 34 fiscal year may be made available to the Department of Education -Educational Television Division for its documented costs associated with the 35 36 Quiz Bowl.

1 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, -20122 2013 through June 30, 2013 2014. 3 SECTION 17. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 4 5 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 6 INTERVENTION BLOCK GRANTS FUNDING RESTRICTION. The Department of Education shall make available from the Intervention Block Grants appropriation 7 8 authorized by this Act, one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) each fiscal 9 year for the annual expenses of the Quiz Bowl, thirteen thousand five hundred 10 dollars (\$13,500) each fiscal year for Creativity in Arkansas, Inc. for 11 grants up to \$1,000 each for students and chaperones, thirteen thousand five 12 hundred dollars (\$13,500) each fiscal year for Destination Imagination, one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) each fiscal year for the State History 13 14 Day Competition, and seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) each fiscal year 15 for a grant to the Arkansas Science Fair Association for grants to regional 16 and the state science fairs. The Department of Education shall allocate 17 General Revenue funding totaling no less than three hundred two thousand 18 dollars (\$302,000) each fiscal year from the Department of Education Public 19 School Fund Account to support the annual expenses of the Quiz Bowl, the 20 Creativity in Arkansas, Inc. for grants up to \$1,000 each for students and 21 chaperones, Destination Imagination, the State History Day Competition, and 22 the Arkansas Science Fair Association for grants to regional and state 23 science fairs. The Department shall either expend or have committed for 24 expenditure the monies allocated for the Quiz Bowl, Creativity in Arkansas, 25 Inc., Destination Imagination, the State History Day Competition, and 26 Arkansas Science Fair Association grants as authorized herein in order to 27 fulfill the provisions of this section. 28 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, $\frac{2012}{1}$ 29 2013 through June 30, 2013 2014. 30 31 SECTION 18. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 32 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 33 FUNDING PROVISION. Of the total amount appropriated for Technology Grants

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each fiscal year, an amount of not less than two million dollars (\$2,000,000) or eighteen percent (18%), whichever is greater each fiscal year, shall be awarded through a grant or professional services contract for EAST

- 25 SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 26 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
- 27 DISTRESSED SCHOOL DISTRICT SUPPORT. The funds appropriated in the line item
- 28 "Distressed School District Support" in Section 1 of this Act may be used for
- 29 technical assistance offered by the Department of Education to school
- 30 districts in academic distress that can include, but is not limited to,
- 31 teacher specialists, principal specialists, and other personnel assigned by
- 32 the department. These funds may also be used for alternative research-based
- 33 technical assistance or programs. Criteria for selecting and approving
- 34 alternative research-based technical assistance or programs are to be
- 35 promulgated as a rule by the State Board of Education, provided that
- 36 alternative staffing and/or compensation programs for teachers shall be

- 1 approved by at least a majority of the teachers in the school, schools, or
- 2 school district participating in the program.
- The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2012 4 2013 through June 30, 2013.
