The 25 payments are to be limited to the amount of available appropriation. The Commissioner of the Department of Education, with the approval 6 of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and after approval by the Arkansas 7 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee, is hereby authorized to 8 request necessary appropriation transfers and any other budget related 9 adjustments necessary within the Department of Education. Provided, however, 10 that the Department of Education shall be limited to submitting no more than 11 two transfer requests during any fiscal year.

12 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of 13 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year 14 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by 15 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and 16 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by 17 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly 18 has determined that the Department of Education may operate more efficiently 19 if some flexibility is provided to the Commissioner of the Department of 20 Education authorizing broad powers under the Transfer Authority provision 21 herein. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General 22 Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of the Legislative 23 Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this section. When the Department of Education uses a new 22 methodology or technology to recalculate square miles to determine student 23 transportation distance, density ratio, total area, or bus route miles for the purpose of determining the amount of isolated funding a school district 24 receives under Ark. Code Ann. § 6-20-601 et seq., the school district shall 25 26 receive an amount of isolated funding that is not less than the amount of 27 isolated funding the school district would have received based on the school district's square miles calculated in the prior school year; provided that 28 29 the school district remains eligible for isolated funding under § 6-20-601 et 30 seq.

## <u>The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,</u> 2012 through June 30, 2014.

34 SECTION *37*. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds 35 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 36 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and

the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

8 SECTION 38. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General 9 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 10 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for 11 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 12 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget 13 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or 14 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative 15 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 16

17 SECTION 39. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General 18 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the 19 appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the 20 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2013 is essential to the operation of 21 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided; with the 22 exception that SECTIONS 33, 34 and 36 in this Act shall be in full force and 23 effect from and after the date of its passage and approval, and that in the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the effective 24 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2013 could work irreparable harm upon the 25 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs, with 26 27 the exception that SECTIONS 33, 34 and 36 in this Act shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval. Therefore, an 28 29 emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the 30 immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2013; with the exception that 31 32 SECTIONS 33, 34 and 36 in this Act shall be in full force and effect from and 33 after the date of its passage and approval. 34 35 /s/Joint Budget Committee 36

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
