- 33 SECTION 40. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
- 34 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
- 35 appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
- 36 <u>effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2013 is essential to the operation of</u>

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     the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided; with the
     exception that SECTIONS 34, 35 and 37 in this Act shall be in full force and

     effect from and after the date of its passage and approval, and that in the

     event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the effective
 4
     date of this Act beyond July 1, 2013 could work irreparable harm upon the

     proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs, with

     the exception that SECTIONS 34, 35 and 37 in this Act shall be in full force

     and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval. Therefore, an

     emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the

     full force and effect from and after July 1, 2013; with the exception that
