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33	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
34	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that specific laws applicable to		
35	the County Voting System Grant Fund need to be revised to bring them into		
36	conformance with sound public fiscal policy; that this revision is of great		



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1	importance to citizens of Arkansas; and that this act is immediately		
2	necessary to maintain an orderly system of fund transfers between the		
3	Secretary of State and the Treasurer of State. Therefore, an emergency is		
4	declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the		
5	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective		
6	<u>on:</u>		
7	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
8	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
9	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
10	bill; or		
11	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
12	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.		
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
