19	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 17-42-303(a)(1), concerning education h	ours
20	for real estate brokers, is amended to read as follows:	
21	(a) The Arkansas Real Estate Commission shall establish educationa	.1
22	education requirements for licensure, including the standards and procedu	res
23	for approval of educational education programs, subject to the following	
24	conditions:	
25	(1) <u>(A)</u> The maximum number of educational most education hour	s to
26	be required of an applicant for a broker's license shall not exceed one	
27	hundred twenty (120) hours within the thirty-six (36) months immediately	
28	preceding the date of application ; and .	
29	(B) Effective on May 1, 2014, an applicant for a broke	r's
30	license shall complete at least forty-five (45) of the required education	<u>L</u>
31	hours in a course developed by the commission; and	
32		
33	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 17-42-307 is amended to read as follows	:
34	17-42-307. Expiration and renewal.	
35	(a) Every license , both active and inactive, shall expire on a dat	e
36	established by the Arkansas Real Estate Commission.	



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1	(b)(1) A broker or salesperson shall complete annually:
2	(A) Six (6) classroom hours of continuing education;
3	(B) The distance education equivalent of continuing
4	education; or
5	(C) A course that the commission has determined to
6	demonstrate mastery of an acceptable real estate subject.
7	(2) A licensee who satisfies subdivision (b)(1) of this section
8	completes the continuing education requirements for the licensing year.
9	(3) If a licensee files for renewal of a license but fails to
10	provide proof of continuing education, the licensee's license is inactive
11	until proof is provided to the commission.
12	(c)(l) To renew or reactivate a license, a licensee shall complete:
13	(A) Six (6) classroom hours of continuing education; or
14	(B) The distance education equivalent of continuing
15	education for each inactive year. The total continuing education shall not
16	exceed thirty (30) hours under this subdivision (c)(1).
17	(2) An inactive license is not subject to the education
18	requirements of this section.
19	(3) The commission may waive all or part of the requirements of
20	subdivision (c)(l) if a licensee is unable to complete the continuing
21	education due to extenuating circumstances.
22	(b) (d)(1) For each active licensee, the commission shall issue a new
23	license for each ensuing renewal period in the absence of $\frac{1}{2}$ a reason or
24	condition that might may warrant the refusal of a license, upon receipt of a
25	<u>the:</u>
26	<u>(A)</u> written Written request for license renewal at least
27	no later than ninety (90) days prior to <u>before</u> the expiration of the license
28	upon forms provided by the commission together with; and
29	(B) with the renewal <u>Renewal</u> fee.
30	(2)(A) For any <u>A</u> broker or salesperson who does not wish to
31	engage in the real estate business, may renew the \underline{a} license shall be renewed
32	on inactive status, in the absence of any <u>a</u> reason or condition that might
33	may warrant the refusal of a license, upon receipt of the:
34	<u>(1)</u> written Written request of the applicant no later than <u>at</u>
35	<u>least</u> ninety (90) days prior to <u>before</u> the expiration of the license upon
36	forms provided by the commission together; and

(2) with the renewal Renewal fee.

2 (B) However, the <u>The</u> commission may limit the number of 3 renewal periods in which a license may be renewed on inactive status.

4 (C) The renewal fee for inactive status shall be <u>is</u> the 5 same as for renewal of an active license.

6 (3) An application for renewal filed after the date established 7 by the commission to renew a license shall be <u>is</u> treated as an application to 8 renew an expired license.

9 (c) (e) If any a person to whom a valid license has been issued 10 permits the license to expire for a period not in excess of that established 11 by the commission, the commission shall issue to the person a current license 12 without requiring the person to submit to any an examination if the person 13 furnishes such information as the commission requires the information 14 required by the commission, including proof of completion of appropriate 15 continuing education requirements, and pays such the fee required by as the 16 commission requires.

17 (d) (f)(1) New salesperson and broker licensees shall complete post-18 licensure education in accordance with under § 17-42-303(c).

19 (2) If the licensee fails to complete the post-licensure 20 education requirements within twelve (12) months after the date the license 21 was issued, the commission shall place the license on inactive status until 22 the commission receives documentation that the licensee has completed the 23 post-licensure education requirements.

25 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code Title 17, Chapter 42, Subchapter 5, is 26 amended to read as follows:

27 17-42-501. Renewal or reactivation requirements <u>Real estate education</u>
28 program.

29 (a) As a condition precedent to renewal or activation of licenses,
30 licensees shall meet the following requirements:

31 (1)(Λ) Licensees on inactive status are not required to comply
32 with this subchapter during their inactive status.

33 (B) Prior to activation of a license on inactive status,

34 the licensee shall satisfactorily complete six (6) classroom hours or

35 equivalent continuing education units or equivalent correspondence work of

36 continuing education for each year inactive not to exceed thirty (30)

1	classroom hours. However, that will satisfy the requirements only for that
2	particular license year and not for the following license year;
3	(2)(A)(i) Persons licensed as real estate brokers or
4	salespersons shall successfully complete annually six (6) classroom hours or
5	equivalent continuing education units or equivalent distance education of
6	continuing education or a course that the Arkansas Real Estate Commission has
7	determined demonstrates a mastery of an acceptable real estate subject.
8	(ii) No more than one (1) hour or equivalent
9	continuing education unit shall be in a specific topic or topics as
10	identified by the commission in § 17-42-502.
11	(B) Those persons shall be deemed to have successfully
12	completed the continuing education requirements for the licensing year
13	following the year in which first licensed in Arkansas; and
14	(3) A nonresident licensee may meet the Arkansas continuing
15	education requirements by taking courses which meet the continuing education
16	requirements of his or her resident state for the licensing year in question,
17	provided that:
18	(A) The course or courses consist of no fewer than six (6)
19	elassroom hours or equivalent continuing education units of real estate-
20	related subjects and otherwise comply with the minimum requirements of this
21	subchapter; and
22	(B) Evidence of such compliance satisfactory to the
23	commission is submitted in form, manner, and content prescribed by the
24	commission.
25	(b) The commission may waive all or part of the requirements of
26	subsection (a) of this section for any licensee who submits satisfactory
27	evidence of inability to meet the continuing education requirements due to
28	health reasons or other hardship or extenuating circumstances beyond the
29	licensee's control.
30	(c) Licenses for persons who apply for renewal of their licenses and
31	who do not provide to the commission evidence of meeting the continuing
32	education requirements but who have otherwise met all requirements for
33	license renewal shall be placed on inactive status until the evidence is
34	provided to the commission. The Arkansas Real Estate Commission shall
35	establish an education program for real estate licensees to ensure that
36	education is available and accessible to an applicant or a licensee. The

1	education program is intended to fulfill the education requirements for a
2	real estate license and to provide real estate courses intended to fulfill
3	the education requirements for a real estate license.
4	
5	17-42-502. Gurriculum Definitions.
6	(a)(1) The Arkansas Real Estate Commission may establish the
7	continuing education curriculum by identifying subject matter topics.
8	(2) The commission may identify a specific topic or topics of
9	not more than one (1) hour to be included in the six-classroom-hour annual
10	continuing education requirement.
11	(3) The commission shall not require licensees to complete
12	specific courses within the subject matter topics.
13	(4) Changes in the curriculum shall be applicable beginning with
14	the license renewal period subsequent to the curriculum change.
15	(b) The State Board of Private Career Education shall approve
16	continuing education courses and may approve only those continuing education
17	courses which meet the criteria prescribed by the commission. In establishing
18	such criteria, the commission shall give due consideration to the advice and
19	recommendations of the board.
20	(c) The board shall determine the classroom hour equivalency of
21	correspondence courses.
22	<u>As used in this subchapter:</u>
23	(1) "Accredited college or university" means a state-supported
24	institution of higher education or a nonpublic, not-for-profit college or
25	university currently incorporated and recognized by the Arkansas Higher
26	Education Coordinating Board as an Arkansas independent institution of higher
27	education operating under the applicable laws of this state;
28	(2) "Administrator" means a person employed by a real estate
29	trade or professional association licensed by the Arkansas Real Estate
30	<u>Commission;</u>
31	(3) "Approved course" means a course of instruction approved by
32	the commission that satisfies the education requirements for prelicense
33	education, postlicense education, or continuing education for a real estate
34	<u>license;</u>
35	(4) "Associate instructor" means a person who is licensed by the
36	<u>commission to teach real estate courses while under the supervision of an</u>

1	administrator or principal instructor that satisfy the education requirements
2	for a real estate license;
3	(5) "Association license" means a license granted by the
4	commission to a real estate trade or professional association offering
5	approved education that satisfies education requirements for a real estate
6	<u>license;</u>
7	(6) "Branch school" means a school affiliated with a main school
8	to which the commission has issued a school license;
9	(7) "Classroom course" means a real estate course that:
10	(A) Is presented at a facility in person by an instructor
11	and attended in person by the student; or
12	(B) Connects by contemporaneous, two-way audio and visual
13	technology an instructor and a student who are separated by distance;
14	(8) "Distance education" means a real estate course that is
15	delivered through an electronic medium that allows the instructor and student
16	to be separated by both distance and time;
17	(9) "Guest speaker" means a person who is not licensed by the
18	commission who teaches a part of a course approved by the commission;
19	(10) "Instructional site" means a physical place where education
20	courses approved by the commission are conducted apart from the main school
21	or branch school;
22	(11) "Main school" means an institution or organization that is
23	the primary school location to which the commission has issued a school
24	<u>license;</u>
25	(12) "Nonqualified offering" means a course in real estate
26	education that has not been approved by the commission but is offered to
27	persons intending to apply for a real estate license;
28	(13) "Postlicense education" means real estate education
29	required to be successfully completed within a time frame established by the
30	commission after a real estate license is issued;
31	(14) "Prelicense education" means real estate education required
32	to be successfully completed by an applicant before sitting for the
33	examination for a broker or salesperson license;
34	(15)(A) "Principal instructor" means a person who is licensed by
35	the commission for each licensed school that is responsible for the education
36	courses at a main school and the acts necessary to comply with this

1	subchapter and rules enacted by the commission.
2	(B) A principal instructor may:
3	(i) Contract with or employ an associate instructor
4	or guest speaker;
5	(ii) Supervise an associate instructor or guest
6	speaker;
7	(iii) Submit an education course to the commission
8	<u>for approval;</u>
9	(iv) Advertise as being engaged in the business of
10	offering real estate education courses; and
11	(v) Charge tuition and fees for real estate
12	education courses;
13	(16) "Satisfactory completion" means, as determined by a
14	principal instructor, successful completion of a required course that is
15	approved by the commission;
16	(17) "School license" means a license granted by the commission
17	to a proprietary education institution offering education courses approved by
18	the commission that fulfill mandatory education requirements for attaining or
19	maintaining a real estate license; and
20	(18) "Student" means an applicant or licensee who attends real
21	estate education courses approved by the commission.
22	
23	17-42-503. Nonqualifying courses or events Exemptions.
24	(a) The following do not qualify as continuing education The licensing
25	requirements of this subchapter do not apply to:
26	(1) Courses of instruction designed to prepare a student for
27	passing the real estate broker or salesperson examinations, except as
28	provided in § 17-42-501(a) The National Association of Realtors, the National
29	Association of Real Estate Brokers, or other associated entities if each
30	association identifies an administrator;
31	(2) Sales promotions or other meetings held in conjunction with
32	the general business of the licensee An accredited college or university; and
33	<u>or</u>
34	(3) Time devoted to breakfasts, luncheons, and dinners <u>An</u>
35	instructor associated with an entity listed in subdivision (a)(1) or (2) of
36	this section if the course is developed by or for those specific entities.

1	(b) The same course may not be used to meet the continuing education
2	requirement two (2) times during the same license year. The requirement for
3	course approval by the Arkansas Real Estate Commission under this subchapter
4	does not apply to:
5	(1) A classroom course in a real estate-related subject
6	identified by the commission as an approved topic if it is offered by the
7	National Association of Realtors, the National Association of Real Estate
8	Brokers, or other associated entities;
9	(2) A course of at least three (3) semester hours or equivalent
10	in a real estate subject that is approved by the commission and offered by an
11	accredited college or university;
12	(3) A course in a real estate-related subject offered by the
13	<pre>commission;</pre>
14	(4) A course or a conference in a real estate-related subject
15	approved by the commission and offered annually on a limited basis in
16	Arkansas; or
17	(5) A course that is not used to fulfill the education
18	requirements of this subchapter for attaining a real estate license.
19	
20	17-42-504. Qualifying courses <u>Requirements — Mandatory real estate</u>
21	education.
22	The following courses and their instructors are not required to obtain
23	the approval of the State Board of Private Career Education in order to
24	qualify as continuing education courses in this subchapter:
25	(1) Courses in real estate related subjects offered by the
26	National Association of Realtors, the National Association of Real Estate
27	Brokers, or their societies, institutes, or councils;
28	(2) Courses in real estate-related subjects offered or approved
29	by the Arkansas Real Estate Commission; and
30	(3) Courses of at least three (3) semester hours or equivalent
31	in real estate subjects acceptable to the commission offered by colleges or
32	universities.
33	(a) A person shall not practice as a provider of real estate education
34	for real estate licensure unless the person holds a real estate license under
35	this subchapter.
36	(b) A person or school shall not represent that an offered real estate

1	course satisfies the education requirements for real estate licensure unless
2	the course is approved by the Arkansas Real Estate Commission.
3	(c)(l) It is a violation of this subchapter to fail to obtain:
4	(A) A license to practice as a provider of real estate
5	education for real estate licensure; or
6	(B) Approval for a real estate education course by the
7	commission.
8	(2) A real estate education course offered in violation of this
9	subchapter is a nonqualified offering.
10	
11	17-42-505. Instructor credentials Civil penalties - Jurisdiction.
12	(a) Except as provided in this subchapter, instructors in continuing
13	education courses shall file credentials with the State Board of Private
14	Career Education showing the necessary specialized preparation, training, and
15	experience to ensure competent and qualified instruction. If after notice
16	and a hearing under this subchapter and the Arkansas Administrative Procedure
17	Act, § 25-15-201 et seq., the Arkansas Real Estate Commission finds that a
18	person has offered a nonqualified offering, the commission may impose a civil
19	penalty of no more than five thousand dollars (\$5,000) and assess costs
20	against the person.
21	(b) The board will prescribe instructor qualification credentials and
22	education requirements based upon advice and recommendation of the Arkansas
23	Real Estate Commission. The fact that a person offers to provide or provides
24	a course offering without the appropriate license or course approval from the
25	commission is prima facie evidence that the person is offering a nonqualified
26	offering.
27	(c) In addition to civil penalties imposed under this section, the
28	commission may require a person who offered a nonqualified offering to
29	reimburse compensation, fees, or other remuneration collected for the
30	nonqualified offering.
31	
32	17-42-506. Credit — Certificate of attendance <u>Powers and duties</u> .
33	(a) Credit shall be carned on the basis of attendance <u>The Arkansas</u>
34	Real Estate Commission may adopt rules as necessary to implement this
35	<u>subchapter</u> .
36	(b) (l) A certificate of attendance which states the name of the

1 student, the name of the school or sponsor of the course, the date the course 2 was completed, the number of classroom hours of instruction covered by the 3 individual course, and such other information as the Arkansas Real Estate 4 Commission may require shall be presented to each attendee upon completion of 5 the course. 6 (2) No certificate of attendance shall be issued to a licensee who is absent for more than ten percent (10%) of the classroom hours. 7 8 (3) Either a copy of the certificate or other proof of 9 satisfactory completion of the course acceptable to the commission shall be 10 furnished to the commission by the licensee. 11 (4) It is the licensee's responsibility to establish his or her 12 successful completion of a continuing education course. The commission shall 13 license, approve, and regulate schools, associations, principal instructors, and associate instructors offering commission-approved prelicense, 14 15 postlicense, and continuing education courses offered to satisfy education requirements for real estate licensure. 16 17 (c) The commission shall establish the licensing or education 18 requirements for: 19 (1) A school or association that applies for a license to offer 20 real estate courses that satisfy the education requirements for real estate 21 licensure; 22 (2) Principal and associate instructors of courses approved by 23 the commission; 24 (3) Courses that satisfy the education requirements for 25 applicants for real estate licensure and licensees; and 26 (4) Guest speakers of courses approved by the commission. 27 (d) The commission shall: 28 (1) Establish procedural guidelines for licensed schools and 29 their locations and those providing real estate education designed for 30 students to meet the education requirements for a real estate license; (2) Charge fees and pay the necessary expenses to develop, 31 32 approve, sponsor, contract for, or conduct real estate courses and seminars 33 for real estate licensees or instructors of real estate education; 34 (3) Maintain in electronic format a list of the names of real estate schools, associations, administrators, instructors, and courses 35

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36 <u>approved under this subchapter;</u>

1	(4) Publish in electronic format the names of the persons,
2	associations, or schools that have been sanctioned by formal hearing or
3	consent order under this subchapter;
4	(5) Periodically monitor courses offered or taught by the
5	licensed schools and instructors; and
6	(6) Establish course requirements with respect to:
7	(A) Accessibility;
8	(B) Attendance;
9	(C) Satisfactory completion; and
10	(4) Curricula.
11	
12	17-42-507. Monitoring courses Disposition of funds.
13	The Arkansas Real Estate Commission or its designee is authorized to
14	attend and monitor any courses of instruction offered or to be offered as
15	meeting the requirements of this chapter Except as otherwise provided in this
16	subchapter, the fees, charges, fines, and penalties collected by the Arkansas
17	Real Estate Commission under this subchapter are deposited into the Arkansas
18	Real Estate Commission Fund and spent under § 17-42-204.
19	
20	17-42-508. Subpoenas and subpoenas duces tecum.
21	<u>The Arkansas Real Estate Commission may issue subpoenas and subpoenas</u>
22	duces tecum with both its investigations and hearings of persons, entities,
23	and courses under § 17-42-205.
24	
25	<u>17-42-509. Issuance or denial of license.</u>
26	<u>(a) The Arkansas Real Estate Commission shall issue a license to an</u>
27	applicant instructor of real estate education who:
28	(1) Is twenty-one (21) years of age or older;
29	(2) Has successfully completed the real estate education
30	requirements under this subchapter;
31	(3) Has sufficient experience as determined by the commission;
32	(4) Has no record of unprofessional conduct; and
33	(5) Shows evidence of a reputation of honesty, trustworthiness,
34	and integrity sufficient to safeguard the interest of the public.
35	(b) The commission shall determine what constitutes proof of meeting
36	the requirements of subsection (a) of this section.

1	(c) A person or entity shall not be issued a license under this
2	subchapter if:
3	(1) The person or entity has had a real estate or other
4	professional or occupational license suspended or revoked for disciplinary
5	reasons;
6	(2) The person has been refused a renewal of a license issued by
7	this state or any other jurisdiction;
8	(3) The person or entity has pleaded guilty or nolo contendere
9	to or been found guilty of a felony or misdemeanor involving fraud,
10	misrepresentation, or dishonest or dishonorable dealing in a court of
11	competent jurisdiction; or
12	(4) The person or entity fails to pay the appropriate fees.
13	(d)(1) Subsection (c) of this section may be waived by the commission
14	on request of an affected applicant for licensure.
15	(2) Circumstances for which a waiver may be granted include:
16	(A) The applicant's age at the time the action occurred;
17	(B) The circumstances surrounding the action;
18	(C) The length of time since the action;
19	(D) Work history;
20	(E) Employment references;
21	(F) Character references; and
22	(G) Other evidence demonstrating that the applicant does
23	not pose a threat to the public.
24	
25	<u>17-42-510. Education fees.</u>
26	(a) The Arkansas Real Estate Commission may charge and collect the
27	following fees annually:
28	(1) An original license fee for each main school not to exceed
29	five hundred dollars (\$500);
30	(2) An original license fee for each branch of a main school not
31	to exceed three hundred dollars (\$300);
32	(3) A renewal fee for each main school not to exceed four
33	hundred dollars (\$400);
34	(4) A renewal fee for each branch of a main school not to exceed
35	two hundred dollars (\$200);
36	(5) An administrator license application fee not to exceed two

1	hundred dollars (\$200);
2	(6) An administrator renewal fee not to exceed one hundred
3	<u>dollars (\$100);</u>
4	(7) A principal instructor license application fee not to exceed
5	two hundred fifty dollars (\$250);
6	(8) A principal instructor license renewal fee not to exceed one
7	hundred fifty dollars (\$150);
8	(9) An associate instructor license application fee not to
9	exceed two hundred dollars (\$200);
10	(10) An associate instructor license renewal fee not to exceed
11	one hundred dollars (\$100);
12	(11) A license amendment fee not to exceed one hundred dollars
13	<u>(\$100);</u>
14	(12) A license reissuance fee not to exceed fifty dollars
15	<u>(\$50.00);</u>
16	(13) A course approval fee not to exceed one hundred dollars
17	(\$100) for each approved course;
18	(14) A course approval renewal fee not to exceed fifty dollars
19	(\$50.00) for each approved course;
20	(15) A late renewal fee for a license or course approval not to
21	exceed two hundred fifty dollars (\$250); and
22	(16) An appeal of the dismissal of a complaint by the Executive
23	Director of the Arkansas Real Estate Commission, a filing fee not to exceed
24	one hundred dollars (\$100).
25	(b) Except for the fees for course approval and course approval
26	renewal, state agencies and full-time accredited college or university
27	instructors are exempt from the fees in this subchapter.
28	
29	17-42-511. License application procedure.
30	(a) Applications for licensure are submitted on forms provided by the
31	<u>Arkansas Real Estate Commission.</u>
32	(b) An applicant for licensure shall pay the fees required under this
33	<u>subchapter.</u>
34	(c) An applicant for licensure or course approval shall furnish
35	contact information on forms provided by the commission.
36	(d)(1) An applicant, administrator, or licensee is required to

1	maintain current contact information with the commission.
2	(2) Contact information includes physical and mailing addresses,
3	home and business telephone numbers, and home and business email.
4	
5	
6	17-42-512. Term of license.
7	(a) A license is issued for a term of one (1) year.
8	(b)(1) The Arkansas Real Estate Commission shall issue approval for
9	renewal of a license in the absence of a reason or condition that may warrant
10	the refusal of the renewal on receipt of a renewal request thirty (30) days
11	before the expiration of the license.
12	(2) A late fee applies to applications received after the
13	renewal deadline.
14	(c)(l) A licensee who has not applied for renewal or whose renewal
15	application did not meet the requirements for renewal shall be notified by
16	the commission.
17	(2) An application for renewal of a license that has been
18	submitted but not renewed by the date of expiration is considered a new
19	applicant.
20	
21	17-42-513. Approval of courses and course content.
22	(a) Except for courses exempted in § 17-42-503(b), a real estate
23	course that is intended to satisfy the education requirements for a real
24	estate license shall first be approved by the Arkansas Real Estate
25	Commission.
26	(b) An application for course approval shall be submitted on the form
27	required by the commission with the required fees.
28	(c) Requirements for course approval are determined by the commission.
29	
30	<u>17-42-514. Curricula.</u>
31	(a) The Arkansas Real Estate Commission may:
32	(1) Identify subject matter topics for continuing education
33	courses;
34	(2) Identify a specific topic of not more than three (3) hours
35	to be included in the education requirement of six (6) hours of continuing
36	education annually;

1	(3) Develop and require a specific curriculum for continuing
2	education courses for licensed brokers or their designees; and
3	(4) Identify subject matter topics for which licensed schools
4	and instructors may develop courses that fulfill the annual continuing
5	education requirements.
6	(b) The commission may develop the curricula for prelicense and
7	postlicense education.
8	
9	<u>17-42-515. Violations.</u>
10	An applicant for a real estate educator license or a licensee is
11	subject to disciplinary action under this subchapter if the applicant for a
12	real estate educator license or a licensee pleads guilty or nolo contendere
13	to or is found guilty of any of the following:
14	(1) Obtaining a real estate educator license or real estate
15	education course approval by fraud, misrepresentation, or concealment;
16	(2) Violating this subchapter, the rules adopted by the Arkansas
17	Real Estate Commission, or an order issued by the commission;
18	(3) Committing an act, felony, or crime involving moral

32	(9) Utilizing an instructor or guest speaker who does not meet
33	the requirements of this subchapter;
34	(10) Making a substantial misrepresentation of a material fact
35	to the commission;
36	(11) Advertising in a false, misleading, or deceptive way;

1	(12) Being unworthy or incompetent to act or operate as a real
2	estate education school or association or a real estate educator; or
3	(13) Other conduct that constitutes improper, fraudulent, or
4	dishonest dealing.
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6	<u> 17-42-516. Investigation of complaint — Penalties.</u>
7	(a)(l) The Arkansas Real Estate Commission may on its own motion and
8	shall on the complaint in writing of a person, if the complaint and evidence
9	presented make a prima facie case, investigate the action of a person or
10	entity engaged in the business or acting in the capacity of a real estate
11	school, association, or instructor licensed by the commission.
12	(2) A student's inability to pass the real estate exam does not
13	in and of itself make a prima facie case.
14	(3) If the complaint fails to state a prima facie case or if the
15	Executive Director of the Arkansas Real Estate Commission determines there is
16	insufficient proof of a violation of this subchapter, the executive director
17	shall dismiss the complaint.
18	(4) If the executive director determines that there is
19	sufficient proof of a violation of this subchapter, the person or entity
20	responsible shall be notified of the charges and ordered to appear for a
21	hearing.
22	(5) If the person or entity is found to have violated this

7	imposition of any sanction.
8	(d) The license of an instructor, school, or association with
9	outstanding disciplinary fines or student reimbursements is suspended until
10	the moneys owed the commission or amounts ordered to be paid by the
11	commission are paid.

13	<u> 17-42-517. Dismissal of complaint - Appeal.</u>
14	(a) A person whose complaint against a licensed school, administrator,
15	or instructor is dismissed by the Executive Director of the Arkansas Real
16	Estate Commission without a hearing may appeal the dismissal to the Arkansas
17	Real Estate Commission subject to the following:
18	(1) The request for appeal is in writing and received by the
19	commission within sixty (60) days following the date of dismissal by the
20	executive director;
21	(2) The request for appeal is accompanied by a filing fee as the
22	commission may require under this subchapter; and
23	(3)(A)(i) The appellant shall pay the cost of preparing the
24	record for the commission's review.
25	(ii) The appellant shall pay the costs within thirty
26	(30) days after notification of the amount, or the appeal is dismissed.
27	(B) If the commission's review results in a hearing being
28	ordered, the filing fee and the cost of preparing the record are refunded to
29	the appellant.

33	is indeed indigent, the filing fee or cost of the record may be waived.
34	(b)(1) An appeal perfected under subsection (a) of this section is
35	presented to and decided by the commission on the written record.
36	(2) The decision by the commission may be to affirm the

1	executive director's dismissal, to order additional investigation, or to
2	order a hearing.
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4	17-42-518. Hearings.
5	(a) Proceedings under this subchapter are conducted under the Arkansas
6	Administrative Procedure Act, § 25-15-201 et seq.
7	(b) Except in the case of a person or entity obtaining a license or
8	course approval by false or fraudulent representation, the Arkansas Real
9	Estate Commission shall not investigate the actions of or conduct a
10	disciplinary hearing regarding a licensed school, administrator, or
11	instructor unless the complaint is filed or the investigation begins within
12	three (3) years from the date of the actions.
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14	SECTION 4. TEMPORARY LANGUAGE. DO NOT CODIFY. Effective January 1,
15	2014, the Arkansas Real Estate Commission has the authority to issue and
16	renew real estate education licenses under this subchapter. It is the intent
17	of this section to cure any gap in applicable law resulting from the
18	transition from licensing under prior law with the State Board of Private
19	Career Education to this subchapter.
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
