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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:	
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18	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 20-27-1501 is amended to read as follows:	:
19	20-27-1501. Definitions.	
20	As used in this subchapter:	
21	(1) "Artist" means any person other than a licensed physician	
22	who performs body art on a human;	
23	(2) "Artist in training" means a person who:	
24	(A) Is in training under the supervision of an artist	
25	trainer or a physician; and	
26	(B) Shall not independently perform body art;	
27	(3) "Artist trainer" means an artist who:	
28	(A) Is licensed by the Department of Health;	
29	(B) Has worked in a body art establishment licensed by t	he
30	department for at least three (3) years and been in compliance with	
31	department rules governing body artists;	
32	(C) Has completed the course required under § 20-27-1506	, ;
33 34	and (D) Is a registered instructor with the State Board of	
35	(D) Is a registered instructor with the State Board of Private Career Education;	
36	(4) "Body art" means procedures that include:	

1	(A) Tattooing;
2	(B) Body piercing;
3	(C) Branding; or
4	(D) Permanent cosmetics;
5	(5)(A) "Body piercing" means the creation of an opening in the
6	body of a human being for the purpose of inserting jewelry or other
7	decoration the puncturing of a part of the body of a live human being to
8	create a hole for ornamentation or decoration or a single-point perforation
9	of a body part to insert an anchor with a single stud protruding or flush
10	with the skin.
11	(B) "Body piercing" shall not include piercing an ear lobe
12	with a presterilized, disposable, single-use stud or solid needle that is
13	applied using a mechanical device to force the needle or stud through the ear
14	<pre>lobe;</pre>
15	(6) "Branding" means a permanent mark made on human tissue by
16	burning with a hot iron or other instrument;
17	(7) "Dermal implanting" means the insertion of an object under
18	the skin of a live human being for ornamentation or decoration;
19	(7)(8) "Establishment" means any place or facility:
20	(A) Where body art is performed; and
21	(B) That has a body artist licensed in Arkansas on staff;
22	(8)(9) "Guest artist" means a body artist from a state other
23	than Arkansas or a country other than the United States who holds a license
24	from the body art regulatory board or agency in that state or country;
25	$\frac{(9)(10)}{(10)}$ "Permanent cosmetics" means the application of permanent
26	or semipermanent pigmentation by the penetration of the skin with a needle or
27	instrument to:
28	(A) The face for cosmetic purposes; or
29	(B) Any part of the body for scar coverage or other
30	corrective purposes;
31	(11) "Scarification" means injury of the skin involving
32	scratching, etching, or cutting of designs to produce a scar on a human being
33	for ornamentation or decoration; and
34	$\frac{(10)(A)(12)(A)}{(12)(A)}$ "Tattooing" means any method of placing designs,
35	letters, scrolls, figures, symbols, or any other marks upon or under the skir
36	by introducing pigments or by the production of scars to form indelible marks

1	with the aid of needles or other instruments.
2	(B) "Tattooing" does not include permanent cosmetics.
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4	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Title 20, Chapter 27, Subchapter 15, is
5	amended to add an additional section to read as follows:
6	20-27-1510. Prohibited practices.
7	An artist licensed by the Department of Health shall not perform or
8	attempt to perform:
9	(1) The insertion of a dermal implant; or
10	(2) Scarification.
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
