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SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 23-79-129(a)(2), concerning insurance coverage for newborn infants, is amended to read as follows: (2) The coverage of newborn children shall be the same as is provided for other members of the insured's family and shall include: (A) Coverage for illness, injury, congenital defects, and premature birth; (B) Coverage for tests for hypothyroidism, phenylketonuria, galactosemia, sickle-cell anemia, and all other genetic disorders of metabolism for which screening is performed by or for the State of Arkansas, as well as any testing of newborn infants hereafter mandated by law; and (C) Subject to minimum benefits required by § 23-99-404, coverage to pay for routine nursery care and pediatric charges for a well newborn child for up to five (5) full days in a hospital nursery or until the mother is discharged from the hospital following the birth of the child, whichever is the lesser period of time.
