14	TO AMEND ARKANSAS LAWS GOVERNING EDUCATOR	
15	LICENSURE.	
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18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:	
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20	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 6-17-403(c), concerning provisional	
21	licensure for teachers trained and licensed in other states, is amended to	
22	read as follows:	
23	(c) The state board shall issue a standard five-year teaching licen	se
24	to an individual who furnishes the Department of Education proof of the	
25	following:	
26	(1) A valid, standard teaching license or its Arkansas	
27	equivalent that:	
28	(A) Was issued in another state; and	
29	(B) Has been in good standing during the most recent two	0
30	(2) years of the applicant's teaching experience;	
31	(2) Successful completion of the criminal records checks and	
32	Child Maltreatment Central Registry check under § 6-17-410;	
33	(3) Higher education transcripts evidencing the award of at	
34	least a baccalaureate degree;	
35	(4) Reports evidencing test scores required for licensing by	the
36	licensing state, unless the individual has three (3) years of documented	

T	teaching experience;
2	(5) Reports evidencing passing test scores on the appropriate
3	basic-skills assessment mandated by the state board for educator licensure or
4	its substantial equivalent, unless the individual has three (3) years of
5	documented teaching experience;
6	(6) Completion of a program for:
7	(A) Teacher education at a regionally accredited
8	institution of higher education;
9	(B) Teacher education accredited by the National Council
10	for Accreditation of Teacher Education, Teacher Education Accreditation
11	Council, or Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation; or
12	(C) Certification from the National Board of Professional
13	Teaching Standards; and
14	(6)(7) Payment of applicable licensure fees.
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16	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-17-409(e)(3), concerning nontraditional
17	licensure, is amended to read as follows:
18	(3) The state board may require an applicant who meets the
19	criteria of subdivision (e)(l) of this section to submit proof of the
20	following academic eligibility:
21	(A) A passing Passing scores, as set by the state board,
22	on a state-required <u>basic-skills</u> , pedagogical, and content-area assessments,
23	or their substantial equivalents; and
24	(B)(i) If required by state board rules for the grade
25	level and content area for which the applicant seeks licensure, successful
26	completion of courses in Arkansas History or Methods of Teaching Reading
27	reading and writing in content areas, or both.
28	(ii) An applicant who has successfully completed the
29	two-year Teach for America program is exempt from the Methods of Teaching
30	Reading requirement of courses in reading and writing in content areas;
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32	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 6-17-409(f), concerning nontraditional
33	licensure, is amended to read as follows:
34	(f)(l) The state board shall issue a <u>nonrenewable</u> three-year
35	provisional professional teaching license to an applicant who submits to the
36	department the following:

1	(A) higher education transcripts evidencing the award of
2	at least a baccalaureate degree;
3	(B) Evidence of a minimum of three (3) years of employment
4	experience in the content area that the applicant seeks to teach;
5	(C) Evidence of an offer of employment to teach classes
6	for credit in an Arkansas public school;
7	(D) A statement of justification from the applicant
8	relating the applicant's experience to teaching in the content area in which
9	the applicant seeks to teach;
10	(E) Two (2) professional letters of recommendation
11	submitted by the applicant's references;
12	(F) A passing score Passing scores on the state-required
13	$\underline{\text{basic-skills and}}$ content knowledge $\underline{\text{and pedagogical}}$ tests for the content area
14	in which the applicant seeks to teach; and
15	(G) Successful completion of the criminal background
16	checks and Child Maltreatment Central Registry check under § 6-17-410.
17	(2)(A)(i) An individual who receives a three-year provisional
18	teaching license under this subsection shall pass the Praxis II Pedagogy
19	Assessment or have thirty (30) have in the first year of provisional
20	<u>licensure twenty-four (24)</u> hours of training in pedagogy <u>as determined by the</u>
21	<u>Department of Education</u> .
22	(ii) The thirty (30) <u>twenty-four (24)</u> hours of
23	training in pedagogy are in addition to and not considered a part of the
24	sixty (60) hours of professional development required for teachers by their
25	employing school district or public school.
26	(3) At the end of three (3) years <u>each year</u> of provisional
27	licensure, the licensee shall undergo a summative evaluation as required by
28	Arkansas law.
29	(4) $\frac{(A)}{(A)}$ The At the end of three (3) years of provisional
30	<u>licensure</u> , the state board shall issue a standard five-year teaching license
31	to the licensee if the licensee successfully completes a performance-based
32	assessment that includes student achievement:
33	(A) Submits passing scores on the state-required
34	pedagogical assessment or its substantial equivalent for the content area in
35	which the applicant seeks to teach;
36	(B) Is identified by the employing school district as

T	proficient or above on a summative evaluation under § 6-17-2803 for the third
2	year of provisional licensure; and
3	(C) Is recommended for full licensure by the
4	superintendent of the employing school district.
5	(B) The performance-based assessment shall be:
6	(i) Approved by the state board;
7	(ii) Paid for by the state; and
8	(iii) Administered no earlier than the completion of
9	the first academic school year of teaching and before the expiration of the
10	three year provisional license.
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12	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 6-17-428(k), concerning ethical violations,
13	is amended to read as follows:
14	(k) The ethics subcommittee shall complete its investigation of an
15	ethics complaint and take action:
16	(1) Within one hundred fifty (150) days of authorizing the
17	investigation of the ethics complaint; or
18	(2) If a hearing is conducted, within one hundred eighty (180)
19	days of receiving the ethics complaint authorizing the investigation of the
20	ethics complaint.
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22	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 6-17-919(a), concerning warrants void
23	without valid license and contract, is amended to read as follows:
24	(a) All warrants issued in payment of teachers' salaries are void
25	unless:
26	(1)(A) The teacher is licensed to teach in the State of Arkansas
27	by a license issued by the State Board of Education; or
28	(B) The public school district employing the teacher has
29	other documentation from the Office of Professional Licensure of the
30	Department of Education authorizing employment of the teacher under the
31	conditions set forth by the department in the documentation teacher is a
32	substitute teacher employed under § 6-15-1004 and rules of the State Board of
33	Education;
34	(2) The teacher has been employed by a valid written contract;
35	and
36	(3) Copies of such contract are on file in the office of the

1	county treasurer or the school district treasurer if the school district ha
2	its own treasurer.
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4	SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 6-17-422(h)(1), concerning the duties of
5	the Professional Licensure Standards Board, is amended to read as follows:
6	(1) Develop and recommend for adoption to the State Board of
7	Education minimum college level preparatory and grade point average
8	requirements for all teachers applying for initial licensure or additional
9	licensure after July 1, 2007, that shall include minimum requirements for:
10	(A) Course of study;
11	(B) Program approval;
12	(C) Range of approved hours; and
13	(D) In-class teaching internships or practice teaching
14	hours;
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
