5	of "tariff rate" under the Arkansas Public Safety Communications Act of 1985,
6	is amended to read as follows:
7	(26)(A) "Tariff rate" means the rate or rates billed by a
8	service supplier as stated in the service supplier's tariffs, and approved by
9	the Arkansas Public Service Commission, which represents price lists,
10	customer contracts, or other methods of publishing service offerings that
11	represent the service supplier's recurring charges for exchange access
12	facilities, exclusive of all:
13	(i) Taxes;
14	(ii) Fees;
15	(iii) Licenses; or
16	(iv) Similar charges whatsoever.

23	primary use within the State of Arkansas.
24	(ii)(a) A commercial mobile radio service provider
25	may determine, bill, collect, and retain an additional amount to reimburse
26	the commercial mobile radio service provider for enabling and providing 911
27	and enhanced 911 services and capability in the network and for the
28	facilities and associated equipment.
29	(b) The commercial mobile radio service
30	provider may add any amounts implemented under this subdivision (b)(l)(A)(ii)
31	to the sixty-five cents (65¢) levied in subdivision (b)(l)(A)(i) of this
32	section so that the commercial mobile radio service emergency telephone
33	service charges appear as a single line item on a subscriber's bill.
34	(B)(i) There is levied a service charge of sixty-five
35	cents (65¢) per month on prepaid wireless telephone service subscribers whose
36	mobile set telephone numbers are assigned to the State of Arkansas.

Arkansas Code Title 12, Chapter 10, Subchapter 3, is 34 amended to add an additional section to read as follows: 12-10-326. Prepaid wireless E911 service charges. 35 36 (a) As used in this section:

wireless E911 charges under § 12-10-326 may be utilized by the board to

1	(1) "Consumer" means a person who purchases prepaid wireless			
2	telecommunications service in a retail transaction;			
3	(2) "Occurring in this state" means a retail transaction that			
4	<u>is:</u>			
5	(A) Conducted in person by a consumer at a business			
6	location of a seller in this state; or			
7	(B) Treated as occurring in this state for purposes of the			
8	gross receipts tax provided under § 26-52-521(b);			
9	(3) "Prepaid wireless E911 charge" means the charge for prepaid			
10	wireless telecommunications service that is required to be collected by \underline{a}			
11	seller from a consumer under subsection (b) of this section;			
12	(4) "Provider" means a person that provides prepaid wireless			
13	telecommunications service under a license issued by the Federal			
14	Communications Commission;			
15	(5)(A) "Retail transaction" means each purchase of prepaid			
16	wireless telecommunications service from a seller for any purpose other than			
17	resale.			
18	(B) "Retail transaction" includes a separate purchase of			
19	prepaid wireless telecommunications service that is paid contemporaneously			
20	with another purchase of prepaid wireless telecommunications service if			
21	separately stated on an invoice, receipt, or similar document provided by the			
22	seller to the consumer at the time of sale;			
23	(6) "Seller" means a person who sells prepaid wireless			
24	telecommunications service to another person; and			
25	(7) "Wireless telecommunications service" means a commercial			
26	mobile radio service as defined under § 12-10-303.			
27	(b)(1) For each retail transaction occurring in this state, the seller			
28	shall collect from the consumer a prepaid wireless E911 charge of sixty-five			
29	cents (65¢) plus or minus an increase or decrease provided by subsection (c)			
30	of this section.			
31	(2)(A) The amount of the prepaid wireless E911 charge shall be			
32	either separately stated on an invoice, receipt, or similar document that is			
33	provided to the consumer at the time of sale by the seller or otherwise			
34	disclosed to the consumer.			
35	(B) If the amount of the prepaid wireless E911 charge is			
36	separately stated on an invoice, receipt, or similar document provided to the			

- l consumer at the time of sale by the seller, the amount of the prepaid
- 2 wireless E911 charge shall not be included in the base for measuring any tax,
- 3 fee, surcharge, or other charge that is imposed by the state, a political
- 4 subdivision of the state, or an intergovernmental agency.
- 5 (c)(1) The prepaid wireless E911 charge shall be increased or
- 6 decreased by the amount of an increase or decrease to the commercial mobile
- 7 radio service emergency telephone service charge imposed under § 12-10-
- 8 318(b)(1)(A)(i).
- 9 (2) The increase or decrease is effective on the later of:
- 10 (A) The effective date of the change to the charge imposed
- 11 under § 12-10-318(b)(1)(A)(i); or
- 12 <u>(B) The first day of a calendar month sixty (60) days</u>
- 13 after the change to the charge.
- 14 (3) The Department of Finance and Administration shall provide
- 15 <u>notice of an increase or decrease under this subsection:</u>
- 16 <u>(A) At least thirty (30) days before the increase or</u>
- 17 <u>reduction on the department's website; and</u>
- 18 (B) As provided by law or rule of the department.
- (d)(1) Except as provided in subdivision (d)(2) of this section, a
- 20 <u>seller shall remit prepaid wireless E911 charges according to registration</u>
- 21 and payment procedures established by the department that substantially
- 22 coincide with the registration and payment procedures for the gross receipts

- 30 prepaid wireless telecommunications service to document that a sale is not a

- 32 (2) The procedures shall be substantially similar to the
- 33 procedures for documenting sale for resale transactions under the gross
- 34 receipts tax imposed by the Arkansas Gross Receipt Act of 1941, § 26-52-101
- 35 <u>et seq.</u>
- 36 (g)(1) Except as provided in subdivision (g)(2) of this section, the

1	department shall pay all remitted prepaid wireless E911 charges within thirty		
2	(30) days of receipt to the Arkansas Emergency Telephone Services Board for

4	(2) The department may deduct and retain no more than two		
5	percent (2%) of collected charges to reimburse the department's direct costs

8	(h) A provider or seller is not liable for damages to a person		
9	resulting from or incurred in connection with:		
10	(1) Providing or failing to provide 911 or E911 service;		
11	(2) Identifying or failing to identify the telephone number,		
12	address, location, or name associated with a person or device that is		
13	accessing or attempting to access 911 or E911 service; or		
14	(3) Providing lawful assistance to a federal, state, or local		
15	investigator or law enforcement officer conducting a lawful investigation or		
16	other law enforcement activity.		
17	(i) A provider or seller is not liable for civil damages or criminal		
18	liability in connection with:		
19	(1) The development, design, installation, operation,		
20	maintenance, performance, or provision of 911 service; or		
21	(2) The release of subscriber information to a governmental		
22	entity as required by the Arkansas Public Safety Communications Act of 1985,		
23	§ 12-10-301 et seq.		
24	(j)(1) The prepaid wireless E911 charge imposed by this section shall		
25	be the only E911 funding obligation imposed for prepaid wireless		
26	telecommunications service in this state.		
27	(2) A tax, fee, surcharge, or other charge shall not be imposed		
28	by the state, a political subdivision of the state, or an intergovernmental		
29	agency for E911 funding purposes upon a provider, seller, or consumer for the		
30	sale, purchase, use, or provision of prepaid wireless telecommunications		
31	service.
