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17	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-20-2305(b)(4)(D)(i), concerning a school		
18	district report on the expenditure of national school lunch state categorical		
19	funds, is amended to read as follows:		
20	(D)(i) By the end of each school year, each school		
21	district shall submit to the Department of Education a report listing that:		
22	(a) Lists each program upon which funds		
23	allocated under this subdivision (b)(4) were expended;		
24	(b) Identifies the amount expended, for each		
25	program;		
26	(c) Documents the specific benefit of the		
27	program to the academic progress of low-income students; and		
28	(d) Includes any other information required by		
29	the Department of Education.		
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31	SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
32	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that under its constitutional duty		
33	to provide an equal opportunity for an adequate education for all public		
34	school students, the state provides national school lunch state categorical		
35	funding for the purpose of improving the achievement levels of students in		
36	powerty: that this act directs the use and evaluation of the use of that		

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1	funding for more than half of all public school students in this state; and		
2	that this is immediately necessary for the State Board of Education to		
3	promulgate rules for the 2013-2014 school year for the use of this funding.		
4	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately		
5	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall		
6	become effective on:		
7	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
8	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
9	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
10	bill; or		
11	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
12	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
