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18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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20	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 6-17-1601, concerning definitions for the
21	Master School Principal Program, is amended to read as follows:
22	6-17-1601. Definitions.
23	As used in this subchapter:
24	(1) "High-need public school" means an Arkansas public school
25	that, at the time a master principal first becomes entitled to a high-need
26	school salary bonus, is identified as failing to meet certain established
27	levels of academic achievement under rules adopted by the State Board of
28	Education;
29	(2) "High-need school salary bonus" means an annual bonus to a
30	master principal serving as a principal of a <u>high-need</u> public school in phase
31	two (2) or phase three (3) school-improvement status or located in a school
32	district in academic distress;
33	(2)(3) "Hold-back longevity bonus" means a portion of the high-
34	need school salary bonus held back to be paid at the end of three (3) years
35	and five (5) years of serving as a principal of the same <u>high-need</u> public
36	school—in phase two (2) or phase three (3) school—improvement status or

1 located in a school district in academic distress; and 2 (3)(4) "Incentive bonus" means a bonus paid to a master 3 principal serving as a principal of any public school in the state. 4 5 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-17-1604 is amended to read as follows: 6 6-17-1604. High-need school salary bonus and hold-back longevity 7 bonus. 8 The Department State Board of Education shall promulgate rules and 9 regulations for an additional high-need school salary bonus, including a 10 hold-back longevity bonus, for each principal receiving master school 11 principal status and serving as a principal of a high-need public school in 12 phase two (2) or phase three (3) school-improvement status or located in a 13 school district in academic distress. 14 (b)(1) The department Department of Education shall pay a high-need 15 school salary bonus of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for every 16 school year for no more than five (5) years to any building-level principal 17 who: 18 (A) Receives a master school principal designation from 19 the Arkansas Leadership Academy; and 20 (B) Is, at the time of receiving the bonus of twenty-five 21 thousand dollars (\$25,000), employed full time as a building-level principal 22 in a high-need an Arkansas public school district that is or was: 23 (i) A public school in phase two (2) or phase three (3) school improvement status at the time that the master school principal 24 25 began his or her employment as a master school principal of the school; or 26 (ii) A public school located in a school district in 27 academic distress at the time that the master school principal began his or 28 her employment as a master school principal of the school. 29 (2) The high-need school salary bonus under subdivision (b)(1) 30 of this section shall be paid as follows: 31 (A) Twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) for each school year 32 a master principal is employed in a high-need public school; and 33 (B) An additional five thousand dollars (\$5,000) to be set

5	(3) The high-need school salary bonus with the hold-back
6	longevity bonus payable under this section shall be paid in addition to the
7	five-year incentive bonus allowed under § 6-17-1603, if the master principal
8	is within the time frame for eligibility for the five-year incentive bonus.
9	(c) Regardless of a person's past participation in the Master School
10	<u>Principal Program,</u> No \underline{a} person shall \underline{not} receive either a yearly incentive
11	bonus, a salary bonus, or a longevity bonus, regardless of the person's past
12	participation in the Master School Principal Program, if the person leaves
13	the full-time employment as a principal of an Arkansas public school
14	district.
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16	SECTION 3. TEMPORARY LANGUAGE. DO NOT CODIFY. A master principal
17	eligible for and receiving a high-need salary bonus as of May 1, 2013, for
18	serving as a principal of a public school in school improvement shall remain
19	eligible for a high-need school salary bonus and hold-back longevity bonus
20	while serving as principal of that same public school.
