8	(1) "Caregiver services" are services provided to an individual	
9	in the State of Arkansas to assist the recipient of the services in the	
10	activities of daily living, and the recipient of services is either:	
11	(A) Fifty (50) years of age or older at the time the	
12	services are provided; or	
13	(B) Regardless of age, suffering from a physical or mental	
14	incapacitation that prevents the individual from caring for himself or	
15	herself;	
16	(2) "Trained Personal Care Assistant" means an individual who	
17	has met the requirements of this subchapter and provides caregiver services;	
18	(3) "Compensation" means money or another type of property of	
19	value received by a provider of caregiver services in exchange for the

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25	20-77-2103. Training requirement.	
26	(a) A person who applies for employment to provide caregiver services	
27	in this state for compensation shall provide documentation to an in-home	
28	services agency of successful completion of training as a Trained Personal	
29	Care Assistant under this subchapter.	
30	(b) The Department of Human Services may issue documentation of	
31	successful completion of training as a <i>Trained Personal</i> Care Assistant under	
32	this subchapter to a person if the person:	
33	(1) Is eighteen (18) years of age or older;	
34	(2) Has not been convicted of a felony unless the conviction has	
35	been expunged or pardoned; and
