8	(1) "Caregiver services" are services provided to an individual			
9	in the State of Arkansas to assist the recipient of the services in the			
10	activities of daily living, and the recipient of services is fifty (50) years			
11	of age or older at the time the services are provided;			
12	(2) "Trained In-Home Assistant" means an individual who has met			
13	the requirements of this subchapter and provides caregiver services;			
14	(3) "Compensation" means money or another type of property of			
15	value received by a provider of caregiver services in exchange for the			
16	services of the provider without regard to the source of payment of the money			
17	or other type of property; and			
18	(4) "Successful completion" means completion of training in			
19	acceptable core competencies in the physical skills under § 20-77-2103.

21	20-77-2103. Training requirement.			
22	(a) A person who applies for employment to provide caregiver services			
23	in this state for compensation shall provide documentation to an in-home			
24	services agency of successful completion of training as a Trained In-Home			
25	Assistant under this subchapter.			
26	(b) The Department of Health may issue documentation of successful			
27	<u>completion of training as a Trained In-Home Assistant under this subchapter</u>			
28	to a person if the person:			
29	(1) Is eighteen (18) years of age or older;			
30	(2) Has not been convicted of a felony that would prevent the			
31	person from working in a long-term care facility under § 20-38-101 et seq.			
32	unless the conviction has been expunged or pardoned; and			
33	(3)(A) Has successfully completed a caregiver training course			
34	addressing the following core competencies approved by the department			
35	including not less than forty (40) hours of training in:
