4	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
5	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that property of our citizens is		
6	often condemned by political subdivisions of the state; that citizens often		
7	do not have the means by which to obtain legal representation; and that this		
8	act is immediately necessary because it will create a mechanism by which our		
9	citizens would have more protection for their property rights guaranteed by		
10	the Arkansas Constitution. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and		
11	this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public		
12	peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:		
13	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
14	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
15	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
16	<pre>bill; or</pre>		
17	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
18	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
