1	(3) Beginning with the 1993-1994 school year, any schools $\underline{\Lambda}$		
2	$\underline{\text{school}}$ located in a school district in which twenty percent (20%) or more of		
3	the students enrolled in the school on October 1 of the preceding school year		
4	were eligible for free or reduced-price meals shall establish a school		
5	breakfast program.		
6	(b) Nothing in this section shall be interpreted to prevent a school		
7	district not covered herein from implementing a school breakfast program or		
8	to prevent a school district from implementing a school breakfast program		
9	during an earlier year than required under this section.		
10	(b)(1) As used in this subsection (b):		
11	(A) "Breakfast-After-the-Bell School Nutrition Program"		
12	means a school breakfast program that provides the free breakfast required by		
13	this section after the first bell of the instructional day to all students		
14	enrolled in the school; and		
15	(B) "School" means a public school or open-enrollment		
16	public charter school.		
17	(2) Beginning with the 2014-2015 school year, a school in which		
18	seventy percent (70%) or more of the students enrolled in the school on		
19	October 1 of the preceding school year were eligible for free or reduced-		
20	price meals shall operate a Breakfast-After-the-Bell School Nutrition		
21	Program.		
22	(3) The school may determine the model of serving the breakfast		
23	based on the needs of its students, including without limitation:		
24	(A) Breakfast in the classroom;		
25	(B) A grab-and-go breakfast; or		
26	(C) A breakfast after first period.		
27	(4)(A) The school may determine the time the breakfast shall be		
28	served, as long as it occurs after the first bell of the instructional day.
