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20 21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
22	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 6-18-209 is amended to read as follows:
23	6-18-209. Adoption of student attendance policies — Effect of
24	excessive <u>unexcused</u> absences.
25	(a) The board of directors of each school district in this state shall
26	adopt student attendance policies.
27	(b) Each school district, as a part of its six-year educational plan,
28	shall develop strategies for promoting maximum student attendance, including,
29	but not limited to, the use of alternative classrooms and in-school
30	suspensions in lieu of suspension from school.
31	(c) A student attendance policy may include <del>excessive</del> <u>unexcused</u>
32	absences as a mandatory basis for denial of promotion or graduation.
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34	SECTION 2. The catchline of Arkansas Code § 6-18-222 is amended to

36	6-18-222. Penalty for <del>excessive</del> <u>unexcused</u> absences — Revocation of

Arkansas Code § 6-18-222(a)(1), concerning excessive 4 absences from school, is amended to read as follows: 5 (a)(l)(A)(i) The board of directors of each school district in this 6 state shall adopt a student attendance policy, as provided for in § 6-18-209, 7 which shall include a certain number of excessive unexcused absences that may 8 be used as a basis for denial of course credit, promotion, or graduation. 9 (ii) However, excessive <u>unexcused</u> absences shall not 10 be a basis for expulsion or dismissal of a student. 11 (B) The legislative intent is that a student having 12 excessive unexcused absences because of illness, accident, or other 13 unavoidable reasons should be given assistance in obtaining credit for the 14 courses. 15 16 SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 6-18-222(a)(4)(A)(i), concerning excessive 17 absences from school, is amended to read as follows: 18 (4)(A)(i) A student's parent, guardian, or person in loco 19 parentis and the community truancy board, if the community truancy board has 20 been created, shall be notified when the student has accumulated excessive 21 <u>unexcused</u> absences equal to one-half  $(\frac{1}{2})$  the total number of absences 22 permitted per semester under the school district's or the State Board of 23 Career Education's student attendance policy. 24 25 SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 6-18-222(a)(5)(A), concerning excessive 26 absences from school, is amended to read as follows: 27 (5)(A) When a student exceeds the number of excessive unexcused 28 absences provided for in the district's or the State Board of Career 29 Education's student attendance policy, or when a student has violated the 30 conditions of an agreement granting special arrangements under subdivision 31 (a)(4)(D) of this section, the school district or the adult education program 32 shall notify the prosecuting authority and the community truancy board, if a community truancy board has been created, and the student's parent, guardian, 33 34 or person in loco parentis shall be subject to a civil penalty through a 35 family in need of services action in circuit court, as authorized under 36 subdivision (a)(6)(A) of this section, but not to exceed five hundred dollars

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
