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34	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE
35	STATE OF ARKANSAS AND BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, A MAJORITY OF ALL
36	MEMBERS ELECTED TO EACH HOUSE AGREEING THERETO:



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2 That the following is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of 3 the State of Arkansas, and upon being submitted to the electors of the state 4 for approval or rejection at the next general election for Representatives 5 and Senators, if a majority of the electors voting thereon at the election 6 adopt the amendment, the amendment shall become part of the Constitution of 7 the State of Arkansas, to wit:

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SECTION 1. Amendment 35, §§ 1 and 2, of the Constitution of Arkansas 9 10 are amended to read as follows:

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§ 1. Commission created - Members - Powers.

12 The control, management, restoration, conservation, and regulation of 13 birds, fish, game, and wildlife resources of the State, including hatcheries, 14 sanctuaries, refuges, reservations, and all property now owned, or used for 15 said purposes and the acquisition and establishment of same, and the 16 administration of the laws now and/or hereafter pertaining thereto, shall be 17 are vested in a Commission commission to be known as the "Arkansas State Game 18 and Fish Commission", to consist of eight members. Seven of whom shall be 19 active and one an associate member who shall be the Head of the Department of 20 Zoology at the University of Arkansas, without voting power.

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§ 2. Qualifications and appointment of members — Terms of office of 23 first commission - Changes in congressional districts.

24 (a) Commissioners shall have knowledge of and interest in wildlife 25 conservation. All shall be appointed by the Governor. The first members of 26 the Commission shall be appointed by the Covernor for terms as follows: One 27 for one year, one for two years, one for three years, one for four years, one for five years, one for six years, and one for seven years. Each 28 29 Congressional District must be represented on the Commission. 30 (b)(1) Two (2) members of the commission shall be elected from each 31 congressional district in the state. 32 (2)(A) The initial members elected under this subsection shall 33 determine their terms by lot as follows: 34 (i) Two (2) of the initial members shall serve for a 35 term of two (2) years;

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(ii) Two (2) of the initial members shall serve for

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1	<u>a term of four (4) years;</u>
2	(iii) Two (2) of the initial members shall serve for
3	a term of six (6) years; and
4	(iv) Two (2) of the initial members shall serve for
5	a term of eight (8) years.
6	(B) Each successive member elected under this subsection
7	shall serve for a term of eight (8) years.
8	(c)(l) One (l) member of the commission shall be elected statewide and
9	shall serve as the chair of the commission.
10	(2) The chair shall serve for a term of four (4) years.
11	(d) The initial members of the commission shall be elected at the
12	November 2016 general election for a term of office to begin January 1, 2017.
13	(e) A member of the commission shall not serve more than one (1) term.
14	(f) If the most recent decennial census results in an increase or
15	decrease in the number of congressional districts in the state and any one
16	(1) or more of the newly drawn congressional districts has:
17	(1) Three (3) or more members of the commission with their
18	primary residence in the same congressional district, the number of members
19	of the commission in excess of two (2) who have the shortest terms of office
20	remaining shall retire from the commission; or
21	(2) Fewer than two (2) members of the commission, each vacancy
22	shall be filled in accordance with Section 6 of this amendment.
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24	SECTION 2. Amendment 35, § 3, of the Constitution of Arkansas is
25	repealed.
26	§ 3. Term of office of members.
27	Upon the expiration of the foregoing terms of the said Commission, a
28	successor shall be appointed by the Governor for a term of seven years, which
29	term of seven years shall thereafter be for each member of the Commission. No
30	Commissioner can serve more than one term and none can succeed himself.
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32	SECTION 3. Amendment 35, §§ 5 and 6, of the Constitution of Arkansas
33	are amended to read as follows:
34	§ 5. Removal of members — Hearing — Review and appeal.
35	A Commissioner <u>commissioner</u> may be removed by the Governor only for the
36	same causes as apply to other Constitutional Officers, and only after a

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1 hearing which that may be reviewed by the Chancery Court for the First 2 District Pulaski County Circuit Court with right of appeal therefrom to the Supreme Court, such review and appeal to be without presumption in favor of 3 4 any finding by the Governor or the trial court. 5 6 § 6. Vacancies - Filling - Chairman of commission. 7 Vacancies on the Commission due to resignation or death shall be filled 8 by appointment of the Governor for the unexpired term within thirty days from 9 date of such vacancy; upon failure of the Covernor to fill the vacancy within 10 thirty days, the remaining Commissioners shall make the appointment for the 11 unexpired term. A chairman shall be elected annually from the seven members 12 of the Commission to serve one year. Vacancies on the commission shall be filled in accordance with Amendment 29 of the Arkansas Constitution. 13 14 15 SECTION 4. Amendment 35 of the Constitution of Arkansas is amended to 16 add an additional section to read as follows: 17 § 9. Members ineligible for civil office. 18 A member of the commission shall not be appointed or elected to a civil 19 office in this state during the term for which he or she was elected. 20 21 SECTION 5. Amendment 42, § 2, of the Constitution of Arkansas is 22 amended to read as follows: 23 § 2. Qualifications and appointment Election of members - Terms of 24 office of first commission. 25 Within ten days after the convening of the General Assembly of the 26 State of Arkansas in the year 1953, the Governor, by and with the advice and 27 consent of the Senate, shall appoint five persons who are qualified electors 28 of the State to constitute the State Highway Commission for terms of two, four, six, eight and ten years respectively. The terms of the persons so 29 30 appointed shall be determined by lot. The Commissioners to be appointed from the State at large; provided, however, that no two Commissioners shall be 31 32 appointed from any single Congressional District. 33 In the event of rejection by the Senate of a person whose name has been so submitted, the Governor shall within five days after receipt of written 34 35 notice from the Secretary of the Senate of such rejection submit the name of 36 another appointee to fill such vacancy. In the event the Governor should

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1	within five days thereafter fail to appoint or fail to submit to the Senate
2	for confirmation the name of any person to be appointed, the Senate shall
3	proceed to make the appointment of its own choice.
4	(a)(1) Two (2) members of the commission shall be elected from each
5	congressional district in the state.
6	(2)(A) The initial members elected under this subsection shall
7	determine their terms by lot as follows:
8	(i) Two (2) of the initial members shall serve for a

10	(ii) Two (2) of the initial members shall serve for

1 Upon the expiration of the foregoing terms of said Commissioners, a 2 successor shall be appointed by the Governor in the manner provided for in Section 2 for a term of ten years, which term shall thereafter be for each 3 4 member of the Commission.

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SECTION 7. Amendment 42, §§ 4 and 5, of the Constitution of Arkansas 7 are amended to read as follows:

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§ 4. Removal of members - Hearing - Review and appeal.

9 A Commissioner may be removed by the Governor only for the same causes 10 as apply to other constitutional officers and only after a hearing which that 11 may be reviewed by the Chancery Court for the First District Pulaski County 12 Circuit Court with right of appeal therefrom to the Supreme Court, such review and appeal to be without presumption in favor of any finding by the 13 14 Governor or the trial court, and provided further, in addition to the right 15 of confirmation hereinabove reserved to the Senate, the Senate may upon the 16 written request of at least Five (5) of its members that a member or members 17 of the Commission should be removed therefrom, proceed, when in session, to 18 hear any and all evidence pertinent to the reasons for removal. The member or 19 members whose removal is so requested shall be entitled to be heard in the 20 matter and to be represented before the Senate by legal Counsel. These 21 proceedings conducted by the Senate shall be public and a transcript of the 22 testimony so heard shall be prepared and preserved in the journal of the 23 Senate. The taking of evidence either orally or by deposition shall not be 24 bound by the formal rules of evidence. Upon the conclusion of the hearing, the Senate, sitting as a body in executive session, may remove said member or 25 26 members of the Commission by a majority vote conducted by secret ballot. 27

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5. Vacancies - Filling.

29 Vacancies on the Commission due to resignations, death or removal shall 30 be filled by appointment of the Covernor for the unexpired term within thirty days from the date of such vacancy. Upon failure of the Governor to fill the 31 32 vacancy within thirty days, the remaining Commissioners shall make the 33 appointment for the unexpired term. Vacancies on the commission shall be 34 filled in accordance with Amendment 29 of the Arkansas Constitution. 35

SECTION 8. Amendment 42 of the Constitution of Arkansas is amended to

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1	add an additional section to read as follows:
2	§ 7. Members ineligible for civil office.
3	A member of the commission shall not be appointed or elected to a civil
4	office in this state during the term for which he or she was elected.
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
