8	TO SUPPORT THE AUTHORIZATION OF CERTAIN STATE
9	AGENCIES AND INSTITUTIONS TO PROVIDE POSTSECONDARY

11	C.F.R. SECTION 600.9 AND 600.9(A)(1)(i) AND (ii).

15	TO SUPPORT THE AUTHORIZATION OF CERTAIN
16	STATE AGENCIES AND INSTITUTIONS TO
17	PROVIDE POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION AND
18	COMPLAINT PROCEDURES PURSUANT TO 34
19	C.F.R. SECTION 600.9 AND 600.9(A)(1)(i)
20	AND (ii).

23	WHEREAS, on October 29, 2010, the United States Department of Education
24	released Final Regulations on Program Integrity Issues in an effort to
25	strengthen federal student aid programs at postsecondary institutions, and
26	one provision seeks to clarify the minimum a state must do to authorize a
27	postsecondary institution so that the institution is able to participate in
28	federal student aid and other federal funding programs; and
29	
30	WHEREAS, specifically, 34 C.F.R. Section 600.9 was amended to require
31	that a postsecondary institution is either established:
32	(1) Under 34 C.F.R. $600.9(a)(1)(i)$ by name as an educational
33	institution by a state through a charter, statute, constitutional provision,
34	or other action issued by an appropriate state agency, or state entity and is
35	authorized to operate educational programs beyond secondary education,
36	including programs leading to a degree or certificate; or



1	(2) Under 34 C.F.R. $600.9(a)(1)(ii)$ by a state on the basis of
2	an authorization to conduct business in the state or to operate as a
3	nonprofit charitable organization; and
4	
5	WHEREAS, specifically, 34 C.F.R. Section 600.9(a)(1)(ii) further
6	stipulates that postsecondary institutions authorized to conduct business
7	must be approved or licensed, by name, by the state to offer programs beyond
8	secondary education, including programs leading to a degree or certificate;
9	and
10	
11	WHEREAS, the State of Arkansas wishes through this resolution and
12	legislative enactment to authorize certain agencies, boards, institutions,
13	career schools, and colleges including the Arkansas State Board of Massage
14	Therapy, the State Board of Barber Examiners, the Cosmetology Technical
15	Advisory Committee, the Department of Career Education, the State Board of
16	Private Career Education, and the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating
17	Board to operate educational programs beyond secondary education, including
18	programs leading to a degree, diploma, or certificate, in accordance with 34
19	C.F.R. Section 600.9(a)(1)(i) and (ii); and
20	
21	WHEREAS, each of the state agencies, boards, institutions, career
22	schools, and colleges named in the preceding paragraph is legally authorized
23	or is taking steps to be legally authorized, by the State of Arkansas to
24	coordinate or approve the operation of educational programs beyond secondary
25	education, including programs leading to a degree, diploma, or certificate;
26	and
27	
28	WHEREAS, the state has a process to review and appropriately act on
29	complaints concerning the state agencies, boards, institutions, career
30	schools, and colleges, including enforcing applicable state laws; and
31	
32	WHEREAS, career schools or colleges comply with applicable state
33	approval or licensure requirements and are established by the state on the
34	basis of an authorization to conduct business in the state,

36	NOW THEREFORE,

1	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-NINTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE
2	STATE OF ARKANSAS:
3	
4	THAT the Senate supports the authorization of certain state agencies,
5	boards, institutions, career schools, and colleges to provide postsecondary
6	education and complaint procedures pursuant to 34 C.F.R. Section
7	600.9(a)(l)(i) and (ii), including the Arkansas State Board of Massage
8	Therapy, the State Board of Barber Examiners, the Cosmetology Technical
9	Advisory Committee, the Department of Career Education, the State Board of
10	Private Career Education, and the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating
11	Board.
