20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

22	SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. There is hereby appropriated, to the			
23	Department of Education, to be payable from the Department of Education			
24	Public School Fund Account, for grants and aid to local school districts and			
25	special programs of the Department of Education which shall be supplemental			
26	and in addition to those funds appropriated in Section 1 of Act 1309 of 2013,

- effective date of this Act, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall
 transfer on his or her books and those of the State Treasurer and the Auditor
 of the State the sum of forty-three million dollars (\$43,000,000) from the
 unobligated funds in the General Improvement Fund to the Department of
 Education Public School Fund Account to provide funds for the payment of
 grants and aid to local school districts and special programs for Additional
- 6 grants and aid to local school districts and special programs for Additional
 7 Public School Employee Health Insurance.

SECTION 3. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on the date of its passage and approval is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond the date of its passage and approval could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore,

an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval. If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house overrides the veto. /s/Joint Budget Committee
