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VOTER ID

1 RULES AND REGULATIONS AND REPORTING. The Secretary of State shall promulgate 2 rules and regulations regarding the issuance of a voter identification card 3 that may be requested by an individual to be used as proof of identity when 4 appearing to vote in person upon prior review by the Administrative Rules and 5 Regulations Subcommittee of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget 6 Committee. In addition, the Secretary of State shall also report for review 7 by the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee a report 8 outlining in detail the total amount of monies expended by the Secretary of 9 State to implement the voter identification program. Further, the Secretary 10 of State shall also report to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint 11 Budget Committee within 60 days after the next General Election, the number 12 of persons who obtained a Voter ID.

13 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, <u>2013</u>
14 <u>2014</u> through June 30, <u>2014</u> <u>2015</u>.

16 SECTION 18. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds 17 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 18 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and 19 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 20 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 21 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 22 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 23 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 24 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

26 SECTION 19. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General 27 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 28 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for 29 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 30 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget 31 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or 32 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative 33 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 34

35 <u>SECTION 20. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the</u>
 36 <u>General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits</u>

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1	the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
2	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2014 is essential to the operation of
3	the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
4	the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
5	effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2014 could work irreparable harm
6	upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
7	programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
8	being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
9	and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2014.
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
