AND OPERATING EXPENSES FOR THE NATIONAL PARK  
COMMUNITY COLLEGE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30,  
2015; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

## Subtitle

AN ACT FOR THE NATIONAL PARK COMMUNITY  
COLLEGE APPROPRIATION FOR THE 2014-2015  
FISCAL YEAR.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - OPERATIONS. There is hereby established  
for the National Park Community College for the 2014-2015 fiscal year, the  
following maximum number of regular employees.

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SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP - OPERATIONS. There is hereby authorized, for the National Park Community College for the 2014-2015 fiscal year, the following maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be known as "Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes: four hundred two (402) temporary or part-time employees, when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the appropriate classification.

SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - STATE OPERATIONS. There is hereby appropriated, to the National Park Community College, to be payable from the National Park Community College Fund, for personal services and operating expenses of the National Park Community College for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015, the following:

SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION - CASH FUNDS. There is hereby appropriated, to the National Park Community College, to be payable from cash funds as defined by Arkansas Code 19-4-801 of the National Park Community College, for personal services and operating expenses of the National Park Community College for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015, the following:

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17       SECTION 5. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds  
 18 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency  
 19 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and  
 20 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and  
 21 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary  
 22 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures  
 23 Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this  
 24 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of  
 25 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied  
 26 with in disbursement of said funds.

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28       SECTION 6. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General  
 29 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations  
 30 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for  
 31 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive  
 32 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget  
 33 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or  
 34 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative  
 35 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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1        SECTION 7. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General  
2 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the  
3 appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the  
4 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2014 is essential to the operation of  
5 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in  
6 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the  
7 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2014 could work irreparable harm  
8 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental  
9 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act  
10 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health  
11 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2014.
