SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 31 32 DIRECTOR'S OFFICE/OFFICE OF CHIEF COUNSEL - PURCHASE OF EVIDENCE. Upon 33 approval by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, the Chief Counsel for the 34 Department of Human Services may transfer an amount up to but not to exceed 35 \$12,000 and deposit same in a bank account for the purpose of purchasing

- SERVICES RENOVATION FUND. Department of Human Services Renovation Fund.

 (a) There is established on the books of the Treasurer of State, Auditor
- of State, and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State a fund to be known as the
- 14 Department of Human Services Renovation Fund.
- 15 (b) This fund shall be used for constructing, acquiring, renovating,
- 16 maintaining, repairing, and equipping facilities of the Department of Human
- 17 Services and for paying disallowances by the federal government.
- 18 (c) The fund shall consist of:
- 19 (1) Federal reimbursement received by the Department of Human Services and
- 20 deposited in the various fund accounts of the department; and

- 22 Division of Behavioral Health, and the Division of Developmental Disabilities
- 23 Services for the purposes of repairing, renovating, equipping, acquiring and

- of five million dollars (\$5,000,000). The projects for which these transfers
- 26 are authorized must be projects which were unanticipated during the preceding
- 27 regular session of the Arkansas General Assembly and must be projects which,
- 28 if not carried out in the interim period between regular sessions of the
- 29 Arkansas General Assembly would cause greater harm to the facilities, clients
- 30 or programs of the Department of Human Services than to wait until the next
- 31 regular session.
- 32 (3) Other non-general revenue funds as may be available within the Department
- 33 of Human Services that can be used for the purposes of this fund.
- 34 (d)(1) At the request of the Director of the Department of Human Services,
- 35 and upon certification of the availability of such funds, the Chief Fiscal
- 36 Officer of the State shall initiate the necessary transfer documents to

- 1 reflect the transfer on the books of record of the Treasurer of State, the
- 2 Auditor of State, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, and the Department
- 3 of Human Services.
- 4 (2) The Director of the Department of Human Services shall submit any

The Director of the Department of Human Services, 5 with the approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, is authorized to 6 effect inter-agency and inter-divisional fund transfers for the purpose of 7 providing the State's matching share for payments made to that Division or 8 Office or its service providers for services eligible for federal 9 reimbursement under programs administered by the Department of Human 10 Services. The Department of Human Services shall report to the Legislative 11 Council or Joint Budget Committee on a quarterly basis all fund transfers 12 made in accordance with the authority granted by this section; and 13 (c) YOUTH SERVICES - HOUSING AND SEPARATION APPROPRIATION PROVISIONS. 14 Division of Youth Services (DYS) is authorized to fulfill its responsibility 15 to house offenders between the ages of 18 and 21 and to separate juvenile 16 offenders by age and seriousness of offense by either employing additional 17 state employees and providing the corresponding operating expenses or 18 entering into professional services contracts. If the Division of Youth 19 Services determines that the Division needs to employ state employees to 20 fulfill the housing and separation requirements, they may transfer up to the 21 total amount appropriated for the DYS - Residential Services Program appropriation to the appropriate DYS appropriation and line items, upon 22 23 approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, and prior review by the 24 Legislative Council; and 25 (d) REALLOCATION OF RESOURCES: (1) The Department of Human Services (DHS) 26 provides hundreds of different services to over 1 million Arkansans. The 27 specific mix of service needs and the funding and staffing required to 28 provide them can vary significantly based on many factors, including natural 29 disasters, changing federal mandates and funding sources, demographic shifts, 30 fluctuating court-ordered services, social trends, and job market variations
- 32 any fiscal year make it very difficult for the Department to accurately

33 predict the exact needs for funding, appropriation and positions in each of

such as nursing shortages. The impact of these factors through the course of

- 34 its over 100 different appropriations. To ensure that it can respond quickly
- 35 to changing client needs and make the most effective use of the resources
- 36 allocated to it, the Department of Human Services shall be authorized to

1 utilize the reallocation of resource authority to make the proper adjustments 2 to the budgets within the Department. Therefore, upon determination by the Director of the Department of Human Services that a reallocation of resources 3 4 within the department is necessary for the efficient and effective operation 5 of the department, the director, with approval of the Governor, shall have 6 the authority to request, from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, a 7 transfer of positions, appropriations, line item appropriations, and funds 8 within or between existing and newly created divisions, offices, sections, or 9 units of the department. Provided, however, that no transfer of funds or 10 appropriation that provides direct support or matching support for the 11 Arkansas Medicaid Program shall be made to any other fund account or 12 appropriation that does not directly support the Arkansas Medicaid Program. 13 Further, no positions, funds, or appropriation authorized during the budget 14 process for the Division of Children and Family Services compliance with 15 initiatives established under the Angela R. consent decree shall be 16 transferred to any other division. Nothing in this provision is intended to 17 prevent the one-time transfers of savings in any other program to the 18 Arkansas Medicaid Program, with the exception of the provisions previously 19 cited for the Division of Children and Family Services - Angela R. consent 20 decree. The Division of Developmental Disabilities - Grants to Community 21 Providers line item of the Developmental Disabilities Services - Grants-in-22 Aid appropriation may not be decreased. The appropriation, funding, and 23 positions provided for the five Human Development Centers shall remain at a 24 level sufficient to ensure quality care for the Centers' residents. The 25 exemptions provided in this subsection whereby certain DHS Programs and 26 Divisions are protected from appropriation, fund, or position transfers are 27 applicable only to the reallocation or transfer authority granted herein, and 28 not by any reductions which are applicable to all state programs. 29 The Director of the Department of Human Services shall submit any requests 30 for transfers to and must receive approval of the requests for transfers from 31 the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, the Governor, and the Arkansas 32 Legislative Council prior to the effective date of the transfers. Provided, 33 however, that the Department of Human Services shall be limited to submitting 34 no more than two reallocation of resources transfer requests during any 35 fiscal year. In each Departmental request no single division will request 36 reallocation for more than one purpose as listed in this section. Transfer

- 13 vi). Restructuring efforts as deemed necessary to comply with new and/or
- 14 unanticipated federal or state mandates
- 15 vii). Redirecting internal resources, both direct and/or indirect, to meet
- 16 client needs and services
- 17 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of
- 18 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year
- 19 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by
- 20 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and
- 21 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by
- 22 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly has
- 23 determined that the Department of Human Services may operate more efficiently
- 24 if some flexibility is provided to the Department of Human Services
- 25 authorizing broad powers under the Reallocation of Resources provisions
- 26 herein. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General

- 14 Services is hereby authorized to pay from State and Federal Funds
- 15 appropriated in each division Act. This program is for eligible nursing
- 16 students who are attending accredited nursing institutions to become
- 17 Registered or Licensed Practical Nurses, as well as Certified Nursing
- 18 Assistants, Residential Care Assistants, Residential Care Technicians,
- 19 Residential Care Supervisors and Behavioral Health Aides.
- The stipend is \$5,000 per person per year. Any student who is awarded and
- 21 accepts a stipend is under employment commitment to the respective DHS
- 22 Division and is required to work for that division, in a full-time employee
- 23 status effective immediately upon graduation. The student employment
- 24 commitment is equal to the number of years the stipend was awarded and
- 25 accepted. In the event of Employee/Student default of the employment
- 26 commitment, the Employee/Student will be considered in breach of contract and
- 27 repayment of the stipend will be required as specified in the Stipend
- 28 Contract.
- 29 Each division participating in the Education Stipend Program shall
- 30 determine on an annual basis, the number of student stipends available.
- 31 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, $\frac{2013}{1}$
- 32 2014 through June 30, 2014 2015.

- 34 SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 35 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
- 36 NURSING/DIRECT CARE RECRUITMENT/RETENTION BONUSES. Special provision to

- 1 provide Nursing/Direct Care Recruitment and Retention Bonuses for the
- 2 Department of Human Services is hereby authorized to pay from State and
- 3 Federal funds appropriated for each respective division. Nursing/direct care
- 4 service recruitment/retention bonuses are in addition to the maximum annual
- 5 amounts provided in the Regular Salaries Section of the respective Division
- 6 Act for Registered Nurse, Licensed Practical Nurse, Certified Nursing
- 7 Assistant, Residential Care Assistant, Residential Care Technician,
- 8 Residential Care Supervisor and Behavioral Health Aide. New hire nurses must
- 9 be licensed by the Arkansas State Board of Nursing. The total
- 10 recruitment/retention bonus payment commitment for eligible nurses shall not
- 11 exceed \$4,000 per Registered Nurse and \$2,000 per Licensed Practical Nurse
- 12 and \$1,000 per Certified Nursing Assistant, Residential Care Assistant,
- 13 Residential Care Technician, Residential Care Supervisor and Behavioral
- 14 Health Aide.
- 15 The lump sum bonus payments and employment commitment to the State will be
- 16 made in partial payments as follows:

- 19 \$1,000 after completing 6 months probationary employment
- 20 \$1,500 after completing 1st year employment
- 21 \$1,500 after completing 2nd year employment

- 31 \$ 500 after completing 6 month probationary employment

- 34 Any qualified person hired and offered bonus payment described herein will
- 35 forfeit the balance of the payments if he/she voluntarily resigns or is
- 36 terminated for cause from employment from the Department of Human Services

1 prior to completing the required employment commitment time periods outlined 2 above.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2013 4 2014 through June 30, 2014 2015.

SECTION 20. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

SECTION 22. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2014 is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2014 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2014.
