  31 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
- 32 DIRECTOR'S OFFICE/OFFICE OF CHIEF COUNSEL PURCHASE OF EVIDENCE. Upon
- 33 approval by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, the Chief Counsel for the

The Department of Human Services shall report to the Legislative 11 Council or Joint Budget Committee on a quarterly basis all fund transfers 12 made in accordance with the authority granted by this section; and (c) YOUTH SERVICES - HOUSING AND SEPARATION APPROPRIATION PROVISIONS. 13 14 Division of Youth Services (DYS) is authorized to fulfill its responsibility 15 to house offenders between the ages of 18 and 21 and to separate juvenile 16 offenders by age and seriousness of offense by either employing additional 17 state employees and providing the corresponding operating expenses or 18 entering into professional services contracts. If the Division of Youth 19 Services determines that the Division needs to employ state employees to 20 fulfill the housing and separation requirements, they may transfer up to the 21 total amount appropriated for the DYS - Residential Services Program 22 appropriation to the appropriate DYS appropriation and line items, upon 23 approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, and prior review by the 24 Legislative Council; and 25 (d) REALLOCATION OF RESOURCES: (1) The Department of Human Services (DHS) 26 provides hundreds of different services to over 1 million Arkansans. The 27 specific mix of service needs and the funding and staffing required to 28 provide them can vary significantly based on many factors, including natural 29 disasters, changing federal mandates and funding sources, demographic shifts, 30 fluctuating court-ordered services, social trends, and job market variations 31 such as nursing shortages. The impact of these factors through the course of 32 any fiscal year make it very difficult for the Department to accurately 33 predict the exact needs for funding, appropriation and positions in each of 34 its over 100 different appropriations. To ensure that it can respond quickly

to changing client needs and make the most effective use of the resources

allocated to it, the Department of Human Services shall be authorized to

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1 utilize the reallocation of resource authority to make the proper adjustments 2 to the budgets within the Department. Therefore, upon determination by the Director of the Department of Human Services that a reallocation of resources 3 4 within the department is necessary for the efficient and effective operation 5 of the department, the director, with approval of the Governor, shall have 6 the authority to request, from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, a 7 transfer of positions, appropriations, line item appropriations, and funds 8 within or between existing and newly created divisions, offices, sections, or 9 units of the department. Provided, however, that no transfer of funds or appropriation that provides direct support or matching support for the 10 11 Arkansas Medicaid Program shall be made to any other fund account or 12 appropriation that does not directly support the Arkansas Medicaid Program. Further, no positions, funds, or appropriation authorized during the budget 13 14 process for the Division of Children and Family Services compliance with 15 initiatives established under the Angela R. consent decree shall be transferred to any other division. Nothing in this provision is intended to 16 17 prevent the one-time transfers of savings in any other program to the 18 Arkansas Medicaid Program, with the exception of the provisions previously 19 cited for the Division of Children and Family Services - Angela R. consent 20 decree. The Division of Developmental Disabilities - Grants to Community 21 Providers line item of the Developmental Disabilities Services - Grants-in-22 Aid appropriation may not be decreased. The appropriation, funding, and 23 positions provided for the five Human Development Centers shall remain at a 24 level sufficient to ensure quality care for the Centers' residents. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds 15 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 16 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and 17 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 18 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 19 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 20 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 21 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 22 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds. 23 24 SECTION 25. 5	programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and Sections 1
6	through 19 and 24 through 25 of this Act being necessary for the immediate
7	preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force
8	and effect from and after July 1, 2014.
9	(b) It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of
10	Arkansas that a clarification of voting procedures is necessary to implement
11	the intent of the General Assembly in establishing the Arkansas Health
12	Insurance Marketplace Board of Directors; the maintenance of an appropriate
13	balance to determine the proper course for the Arkansas Health Insurance
14	Marketplace is immediately necessary; that the citizens of this state will be
15	best served by the change in voting procedures of the board required by this
16	act; that the reporting provisions of this act are essential for the
17	assessment and administration of the outcomes-based system mandated by
18	Arkansas Code § 20-47-705 and episodes of care; that in order to meet the
19	deadlines established by this act, the affected providers and state agencies
20	need as much time as possible to assemble and report the required
21	information; and that Sections 20 through 23 of this act are immediately
22	necessary for the administration of important programs and to provide
23	information necessary to make reasoned and prudent decisions concerning the
24	provision of health care for the citizens of this state. Therefore, an
25	emergency is declared to exist, and Sections 20 through 23 of this act, being
26	immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and
27	safety, shall become effective on:
28	(1) The date of this act's approval by the Governor;
29	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
30	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
31	bill; or
32	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
33	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
