6	SECTION 2. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement	of funds	
7	authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency		
8	and funds made available by law for the support of such app	ropriations; and	
9	the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and		
10	Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary		
11	Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal		
12	control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by		
13	the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized	l by law, shall be	
14	strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

16	SECTION 3. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of t	the General	
17	Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of th	e appropriations	
18	contained in this act shall be in compliance with the state	d reasons for	
19	which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requ	ests, Executive	
20	Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained i	n the budget	
21	manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administr	ation, letters, or	
22	summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Ar	kansas Legislative	
23	Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passa	ge and adoption.

25	SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determi	ned by the General	
26	Assembly, that funds provided by the General Assembly for t	the operations of	
27	the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department ar	e, due to	
28	unforeseen circumstances, insufficient for the Arkansas Sta	ite Highway and	
29	Transportation Department to continue to provide essential	<u>governmental</u>	
30	services; that the provisions of this act will provide the	necessary monies	
31	for the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Departmen	it to continue such	
32	services; and that a delay in the effective date of this Ac	t could work	
33	irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential		
34	governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby de	clared to exist	
35	and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation	of the public	
36	peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect	from and after the	

1	date of its passage and approval.
2	If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall
3	become effective on the expiration of the period of time during which the
4	Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the
5	veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the date the last house
6	overrides the veto.
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
