The positions established shall not be considered as part of the total number of authorized positions for an agency and shall only 34 35 be considered as placeholders for payments to individuals who are board or 36 commission members or elected officials of the State that do not otherwise

receive salaries or wages as defined in §19-4-521 for their personal
 services. Further, none of the positions established under this section
 shall imply eligibility for state retirement or state health insurance
 benefits. The establishment of such positions shall not exceed 250 positions
 in any fiscal year.

7 SECTION 77. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 8 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER 9 AUTHORIZED - BURN CENTER. The Arkansas Children's Hospital may request the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State to transfer the sum of not to exceed 10 11 \$1,000,000 each fiscal year from the Miscellaneous Agencies Fund Account from 12 funds made available by this Act for the Arkansas Children's Hospital Burn Center to the Department of Human Services Grants Fund Account. 13 The 14 transferred funds shall be used to match federal funds used for supplemental 15 Medicaid payments to Arkansas Children's Hospital.

17 SECTION 78. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 18 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 19 INNOVATION AND PROJECT DEVELOPMENT FUND TRANSFERS. The Department of 20 Information Systems is a cost recovery agency subject to the requirements of 21 the United States Office of Management and Budget Circular A-87 Cost 22 Principles for State, Local and Indian Tribal Government (A-87) and Cost 23 Principles for Developing Cost Allocation Plans and Indirect Cost Rates for 24 Agreements with the Federal Government Implementation Guide for the Office of 25 Management and Budget Circular A-87 (ASMBC-10). To comply with these federal 26 rules, it is necessary to establish an Innovation and Project Development 27 appropriation and general revenue fund account within the Department of 28 Finance and Administration Disbursing Officer for the Department of 29 Information Systems. This fund shall be used for state enterprise innovation 30 projects that would enhance the technology operations of the State that 31 cannot be cost allocated to federal programs. The Department of Information 32 Systems will maintain documentation for projects billed for these purposes. 33 Fund transfers may be made from the General Revenue Fund Account, upon the 34 approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and prior review of the 35 Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee, to reimburse the 36 Department of Information Systems for the amounts billed.

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1 SECTION 79. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 2 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. WORK 3 FORCE 2000 DISTRIBUTION. After the amounts to be made available to the 4 5 various technical institutes or comprehensive lifelong learning centers have 6 been determined as set out in Arkansas Code 26-51-205(d)(2)(A) and 26-51-7 205(d)(2)(B), such documents as may be necessary shall be processed so that 8 funds may be transferred from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund to the 9 State Treasury fund or fund account from which the technical institute or 10 comprehensive lifelong learning center draws its general revenue support. 11 Such funds as may be transferred shall not exceed 6.309% of the total funds 12 available from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund during each fiscal year. 13 In the event that a technical college, community college or educational 14 institution which receives support from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund 15 as determined by law transfers from the Arkansas Technical College and 16 Community College System for which Work Force 2000 Development Fund monies 17 are determined by law, then the actual amount of support from the Work Force 18 2000 Development Fund in the preceding fiscal year for such educational 19 institution shall be made available irrespective of any other provision of 20 law which sets out maximum levels of support from such fund. 21 The Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall submit a report for 22 review to the Arkansas Economic Development Commission prior to July 1, 2014 23 of the proposed distribution of the increase in the amount of funds in the Work Force 2000 Development Fund as set out in Arkansas Code 26-51-24 25 205(d)(2)(C) in excess of those amounts collected and distributed prior to June 30, 2014. The funds distributed under Arkansas Code 26-51-205(d)(2)(C) 26 27 in excess of those amounts collected and distributed prior to June 30, 2014 shall be used only for the operation, support, and improvement of 28 29 occupational, vocational, technical, and workforce development programs. The distributions of funds under Arkansas Code 21-51-205(d)(2)(C) in excess of 30 those amounts collected and distributed prior to June 30, 2014 shall not 31 apply to proceeds allocated to schools, colleges and educational institutions 32 under Arkansas Code 26-51-205(d)(2)(A) and 26-51-205(d)(2)(B). 33 34 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2013 35 2014 through June 30, 2014 2015. 36

PROCEDURES - EXTRA HELP. In the event that there is not sufficient 3 4 appropriation provided for by the General Assembly for payment of Extra Help 5 for any state agency for the period ending June 30, 2014 2015, said agency 6 may request a transfer from appropriations provided for Extra Help in Section 7 2, Miscellaneous Transfers, herein, from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the 8 State, stating clearly the amount required. Upon approval of the Chief 9 Fiscal Officer of the State, and after seeking prior review by the Arkansas 10 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee, the State Auditor shall be 11 notified as to the amount and the purposes for which said appropriation is to 12 be made. The appropriation shall then be established upon the books of the Department of Finance and Administration and the State Auditor. Provided 13 14 further, that if desired, said appropriation shall be supplemental to those 15 regularly appropriated for such purposes by the General Assembly for the 16 agency.

17 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2013
18 2014 through June 30, 2014 2015.

20 SECTION 81. SPECIAL LANGUAGE - CODE AMENDMENT - EMPLOYEE SALARIES.
 21 Arkansas Code § 21-5-211(b), concerning adjustments to state employee
 22 salaries, is amended to read as follows:

(b)(1)(A) The maximum annual rate of compensation for which an
employee is eligible on July 1, 2013, July 1, 2014, shall be determined by
increasing the employee's June 30, 2013, June 30, 2014, salary by two percent
(2%) one percent (1%).

27 (B) The line item maximum annual salary rates established by the
 28 Eighty-Ninth General Assembly for nonclassified positions may be increased by
 29 one percent (1%), and the resulting salary shall represent the maximum annual
 30 salary rate for the 2015 fiscal year.

31 (2) The additional salary increase of two percent (2%) on July 1, 32 2013, authorized by subdivision (b)(1)(A) of this section shall not allow an 33 employee's compensation to exceed the maximum pay level amount set out for 34 the position unless the employee is eligible for the career pay level as 35 established in § 21-5-214.

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(3) If an employee does not meet the service requirements in § 21-

5-214, the increase shall be paid as a lump sum on the last pay period of the 1 2 fiscal year of the year in which the increase is to occur. 3 (4)(A) An employee compensated at the highest pay level rate 4 authorized for the grade assigned to his or her classification may receive 5 the July 1, 2013, July 1, 2014, salary increase of two percent (2%) one 6 percent (1%) authorized in this section as a lump-sum payment. 7 (B) However, the salary increase shall be paid as a lump sum on 8 the last pay period of the fiscal year of the 2015 fiscal year in which the 9 increase is to occur, and the payment shall not be construed as exceeding the 10 maximum salary of the employee. 11 12 SECTION 82. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. Uncodified Item (B) of Section 10 of 13 House Bill 1007 of the 2014 Fiscal Session, concerning Reappropriations to 14 the Department of Education - State Library, is amended to read as follows: 15 16 (B) Effective July 1, 2014, the balance of the appropriation provided 17 in Item (A) Section 1 of Act 632 of 2013, for grants to public libraries for 18 personal services and operating expenses, land acquisition, improvements, 19 construction, renovation, major maintenance, and purchase of equipment or 20 grants to the North Central Arkansas Economic Development District Inc., in a 21 22 23 SECTION 83. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. As 24 25 referenced in Section 1(A) of Act 632 of 2013, Section 3(c) of Act 1518 of 2013 and Section 3(c) of Act 1519 of 2013, the authorized funding for the 26 27 Department of Education - State Library for grants to public libraries for personal services and operating expenses, land acquisition, improvements, 28 29 construction, renovation, major maintenance, and purchase of equipment shall be deemed to also include grants to the North Central Arkansas Economic 30 31 Development District Inc. 32 33 SECTION 84. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds

34 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 35 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and 36 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and

Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

7 SECTION 85. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General 8 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 9 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for 10 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 11 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget 12 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative 13 14 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 15

16 SECTION 86. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the 17 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits 18 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2014 is essential to the operation of 19 20 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the 21 22 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2014 could work irreparable harm 23 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental 24 programs.
