17 SUPPORT FOR THE BALLOT TITLES AND POPULAR
18 NAMES SELECTED BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE
19 FOR THE PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL
20 AMENDMENTS REFERRED TO THE PEOPLE AT THE
21 2013 REGULAR SESSION.

24 WHEREAS, at a January 23, 2014 meeting of the House Committee on State
25 Agencies and Governmental Affairs and Senate Committee on State Agencies and
26 Governmental Affairs, the Secretary of State stated his plan of action for
27 the ballot titles and popular names of the three (3) proposed constitutional
28 amendments referred to the people of Arkansas by the General Assembly at its
29 2013 regular session; and

31 WHEREAS, the Secretary of State plans to use the title of the
32 respective joint resolution as the ballot title and will use a popular name
33 provided by the Attorney General for that purpose; and

35 WHEREAS, the intentions of the Secretary of State are consistent with
36 the intent of the House of Representatives when voting to refer the



1 respective joint resolutions to the people of Arkansas and reflect the law in
2 place when the joint resolutions were adopted by the General Assembly,

4 NOW THEREFORE,

5 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-NINTH GENERAL
6 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

8 THAT the House of Representatives expresses its agreement with the
9 decision of the Secretary of State to use the title of each respective joint
10 resolution as the ballot title and a popular name provided by the Attorney
11 General.

13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the House of Representatives declares that
14 the use of the title of the joint resolution as the ballot title and a
15 popular name proposed by the Attorney General is consistent with the intent
16 of the House of Representatives when voting to refer the proposed amendments
17 to the people of Arkansas for their consideration.
