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1	(3) "Direct supervision" means the on-site, personal supervision
2	by an anesthesiologist who is present in the office when the procedure is
3	being performed in that office, or by an anesthesiologist who is present in
4	the surgical or obstetrical suite when the procedure is being performed in
5	the surgical or obstetrical suite, and who is in all instances immediately
6	available to provide assistance and direction to the anesthesiologist
7	assistant while anesthesia services are being performed.
8	
9	17-108-103. Powers and duties.
10	(a) The Arkansas State Medical Board shall:
11	(1) Examine, license, and renew the licenses of qualified
12	applicants;
13	(2)(A) Maintain an up-to-date list of every person licensed to
14	practice under this chapter.
15	(B) The list shall show the licensee's last known place of
16	employment, last known place of residence, and the date and number of the
17	license;
18	(3) Prosecute persons who violate this chapter and incur
19	necessary expenses of the prosecution;
20	(4) Keep a record of all proceedings of the board and make the
21	record available to the public for inspection during reasonable business
22	hours;
23	(5) Conduct hearings regarding discipline of a licensee or
24	denial, revocation, or suspension of a licensee; and
25	(6)(A) Share information on a case-by-case basis of a person
26	whose license has been suspended, revoked, or denied.
27	(B) The information shall include the following:
28	(i) The name of the person whose license has been
29	suspended, revoked, or denied;
30	(ii) The Social Security number of the person whose
31	license has been suspended, revoked, or denied;
32	(iii) The type and cause of the action;
33	(iv) The date of a penalty incurred;
34	(v) The penalty incurred; and
35	(vi) The length of the penalty incurred.
36	(C) The information shall be available for public

1	inspection during reasonable business hours and shall be supplied to similar
2	boards in other states upon request.
3	(b) The board may:
4	(1) Promulgate rules as necessary to enforce the provisions of
5	this chapter consistent with the state law;
6	(2) Employ personnel as necessary to assist the board in
7	performing its function under this chapter;
8	(3) Establish license renewal requirements and procedures as
9	deemed appropriate;
10	(4)(A) Secure the services of resource consultants as deemed
11	necessary by the board.
12	(B) Resource consultants shall be reimbursed for all
13	actual and necessary expenses incurred while engaged in consultative service
14	to the board;
15	(5)(A) Enter into agreements or contracts, consistent with state
16	law, with outside organizations for the purpose of developing, administering,
17	grading, or reporting the results of the licensing examinations.
18	(B) The outside organization shall be capable of providing
19	an examination that meets the standards of the National Commission for
20	Certification of Anesthesiologist Assistants or its equivalent; and
21	(6) Establish license examination fees by rule.
22	
23	17-108-104. Licensing.
24	(a) A person applying for licensure as an anesthesiologist assistant
25	shall submit an application to the Arkansas State Medical Board on forms
26	approved by the board.
27	(b)(1) The application shall not be used for more than one (1) year
28	from the date of original submission of the application and fee.
29	(2) After one (1) year from the date that the original
30	application and fee have been received in the office of the board, a new
31	application and fee shall be required from any applicant who desires
32	licensure as an anesthesiologist assistant.
33	(c) Application information shall be submitted no later than fifteen
34	(15) days before the meeting at which the applicant desires the application
35	to be considered.

1	17-108-105. Application for licensure.
2	(a)(l) An applicant for licensure as an anesthesiologist assistant
3	shall submit an application approved by the Arkansas State Medical Board.
4	(2)(A) The applicant shall submit two (2) personalized and
5	individualized letters of recommendation from anesthesiologists.
6	(B)(i) Letters of recommendation shall be composed and
7	signed by the applicant's supervising physician or, for recent graduates, the
8	faculty physician, and give details of the applicant's clinical skills and
9	ability.
10	(ii) Each letter shall be addressed to the board and
11	shall have been written no more than six (6) months before the filing of the
12	application for licensure.
13	(b)(1) The applicant shall have obtained a passing score on the
14	examination administered through the National Commission for Certification of
15	Anesthesiologist Assistants.
16	(2) The passing score shall be established by the National
17	Commission for Certification of Anesthesiologist Assistants.
18	(c) The applicant shall be certified in advanced cardiac life support.
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20	17-108-106. Supervisory relationship.
21	(a) An anesthesiologist or a group of anesthesiologists, upon entering
22	into a supervisory relationship with an anesthesiologist assistant, shall
23	file with the Arkansas State Medical Board a written protocol, including
24	without limitation:
25	(1) The name, address, and license number of the
26	anesthesiologist assistant;
27	(2) The name, address, license number, and Drug Enforcement
28	Administration registration number of each anesthesiologist who will
29	supervise the anesthesiologist assistant;
30	(3) The address of the anesthesiologist assistant's primary
31	practice location and any other locations where the assistant may practice;
32	(4) The date the protocol was developed and the dates of all
33	revisions;
34	(5) The designation and signature of the primary supervising
35	anesthesiologist;
36	(6) The signatures of the anesthesiologist assistant and all

T	supervising anesthesiologists;
2	(7) The duties and functions of the anesthesiologist assistant;
3	(8) The conditions or procedures that require the personal
4	provision of care by an anesthesiologist; and
5	(9) The procedures to be followed in the event of an anesthetic
6	emergency.
7	(b) The protocol shall be filed with the board before the time the
8	anesthesiologist assistant begins practice with the anesthesiologist or the
9	anesthesiology group.
10	(c) The protocol shall be updated biennially.
11	(d) Anesthesiologist assistants may perform the following duties under
12	the direct supervision of an anesthesiologist:
13	(1) Obtain a comprehensive patient history and present the
14	history to the supervising anesthesiologist;
15	(2) Pretest and calibration of anesthesia delivery systems and
16	monitor, obtain, and interpret information from the systems and monitors;
17	(3) Assist the anesthesiologist with implementation of
18	monitoring techniques;
19	(4) Establish basic and advanced airway interventions, including
20	intubations of the trachea and perform ventilator support;
21	(5) Administer intermittent vasoactive drugs and start and
22	adjust vasoactive infusions;
23	(6) Administer anesthetic drugs, adjuvant drugs, and accessory
24	drugs;
25	(7) Assist the anesthesiologist with the performance of epidural
26	anesthetic procedures and spinal anesthetic procedures;
27	(8) Administer blood, blood products, and supportive fluids;
28	(9) Support life functions during anesthesia health care,
29	including induction and intubation procedures, the use of appropriate
30	mechanical supportive devices, and the management of fluid, electrolyte, and
31	blood component balances;
32	(10) Recognize and take appropriate corrective action for
33	abnormal patient responses to anesthesia, adjunctive medication, or other
34	forms of therapy;
35	(11) Participate in management of the patient while in the post-
36	anesthesia recovery area, including the administration of supporting fluids:

2	(12) Place special peripheral and central venous and arterial
3	lines for blood sampling and monitoring as appropriate.
4	(e)(1) The supervising anesthesiologist shall delegate only tasks and
5	procedures to the anesthesiologist assistant that are within the supervising
6	anesthesiologist's scope of practice.
7	(2) The anesthesiologist assistant may work in any setting that
8	is within the scope of practice of the supervising anesthesiologist's
9	<pre>practice.</pre>
10	(f) Continuity of supervision in practice settings requires the
11	anesthesiologist assistant to document in the anesthesia record any change in
12	supervisor.
13	(g) The tasks and procedures performed by the anesthesiologist
14	assistant shall be documented in the appropriate medical record.
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16	17-108-107. Licensure without examination.
17	(a) A person who was engaged in anesthesiology work for at least one
18	(1) year before the effective date of this chapter is entitled to receive a
19	license without examination.
20	(b) A person seeking licensure under this section shall register with
21	the Arkansas State Medical Board before December 31, 2016, and shall pay the
22	license fee.
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24	SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This act shall become effective on and
25	after January 1, 2016.
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
