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20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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22 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES. There is hereby established for the
23 Department of Information Systems for the 2015-2016 fiscal year, the
24 following maximum number of regular employees.

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SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP. There is hereby authorized, for the Department of Information Systems for the 2015-2016 fiscal year, the following maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be known as "Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such purposes: nine (9) temporary or part-time employees, when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the appropriate classification.

SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - OPERATIONS. There is hereby appropriated, to the Department of Information Systems, to be payable from the Department of Information Systems Revolving Fund, for personal services and operating expenses of the Department of Information Systems for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016, the following:

SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION - UNANTICIPATED SERVICES. There is hereby appropriated, to the Department of Information Systems, to be payable from the Department of Information Systems Revolving Fund, for operating expenses incurred in the provision of unanticipated services to state agencies, unusual growth in applications or due to uncontrollable increases in payments to public utilities necessary for the continual provisions of services by the

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8 SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION - EQUIPMENT ACQUISITIONS AND INFORMATION
9 TECHNOLOGY IMPROVEMENTS. There is hereby appropriated, to the Department of
10 Information Systems, to be payable from the Information Technology Reserve
11 Fund, for major equipment acquisitions and information technology
12 improvements, as set out in Arkansas Code 25-4-122 and 25-4-123 by the
13 Department of Information Systems for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016,
14 the following:

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22 SECTION 6. APPROPRIATION - BROADBAND SERVICES AND ENHANCEMENTS - CASH
23 FUNDS. There is hereby appropriated, to the Department of Information
24 Systems, to be payable from the cash fund deposited in the State Treasury as
25 determined by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, the following:

26 (A) for operating expenses, services enhancements, and grants, in a sum
27 not to exceed.....\$10,000,000.

28

29 SECTION 7. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
30 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. REPORTING
31 REQUIREMENTS. The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall annually file with
32 the Arkansas Legislative Council and the Joint Committee on Advanced
33 Communications and Information Technology a report summarizing all receipts
34 and expenditures made from the Unanticipated Services appropriation in this
35 Act.

36 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~

1 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

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3 SECTION 8. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
4 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
5 CONTINGENCY RESTRICTIONS. In the event of unforeseen conditions, additional
6 appropriations become necessary that are not authorized or contemplated in
7 Section 3 of this Act and such events make it necessary that the Department
8 of Information Systems receives additional appropriations to carry out the
9 objectives of the agency, the Director of the Department of Information
10 Systems is hereby authorized to request the approval of the Governor and the
11 Chief Fiscal Officer of the State, as hereinafter provided, for transfer of
12 the additional appropriation provided the Department by Section 4, but in no
13 event shall the transfers exceed the appropriation provided in Section 4 of
14 this Act. Whenever the Director of the Department of Information Systems
15 deems it necessary to establish additional appropriations as authorized
16 herein, a written report shall be filed with the Governor accompanied by
17 necessary supporting documents setting forth the facts, justifications, and
18 circumstances that necessitate such appropriation. Upon receipt of such
19 reports and supporting documents, the Governor, or his designee, shall study
20 the same, and if he shall determine that such additional appropriations are
21 being sought in strict compliance with this Act, the Governor, after seeking
22 prior review by the Joint Committee on Advanced Communications and
23 Information Technology, may approve or modify such request for additional
24 appropriations as in his judgment he deems necessary, and shall forward a
25 copy thereof to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State. Upon receipt thereof,
26 the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State after receiving prior approval by the
27 Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee shall direct the State
28 Auditor to process said transfer upon his books in accordance with the
29 provisions as set out herein. If the agency requests continuation of
30 appropriation as established herein during the next biennium, the
31 appropriation must be requested as new appropriation in the agency's biennial
32 budget request.

33 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of
34 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year
35 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by
36 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and

1 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by
2 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly
3 has determined that the Department of Information Systems may operate more
4 efficiently if some flexibility is provided to the Department of Information
5 Systems authorizing broad powers under this section. Therefore, it is both
6 necessary and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight by
7 requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee
8 as provided by this section. The requirement of approval by the Legislative
9 Council or Joint Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section.
10 If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget
11 Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction,
12 this entire section is void.

13 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~
14 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

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16 SECTION 9. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
17 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. REPORTING
18 REQUIREMENTS.

19 (a)(1) The Director of the Department of Information Systems will report
20 periodically to the Joint Committee on Advanced Communications and
21 Information Technology and the Executive Chief Information Officer regarding
22 the status of the Department of Information Systems' information technology
23 responsibilities in state government.

24 (2) The director will forward to the joint committee any statutory changes
25 that the department may recommend sufficiently in advance of the convening of
26 the session of the General Assembly.

27 (3) The director may report any factors that are outside the scope of the
28 department but are deemed to inhibit or to promote the department's
29 responsibilities.

30 (b)(1) By October 31, January 31, April 30, and July 31 of each fiscal
31 year, the Director of the Department Information Systems shall compile and
32 submit a report to:

33 (A) The Arkansas Legislative Council, if submitted between regular
34 sessions of the General Assembly;

35 (B) The Joint Budget Committee, if submitted during a session of the
36 General Assembly; and

1 (C) The Joint Committee on Advanced Communications and Information
2 Technology.

3 (2) The report shall:

4 (A) Detail all requests from state agencies, boards, and commissions for
5 advice regarding information technology planning, implementation,
6 installation, rates or fees, utilization of products, services, and
7 integrations or upgrades to be added to all existing technology plans; and

8 (B) Provide a full report of all corresponding recommendations made by the
9 Department of Information Systems to the requesting state agencies, boards,
10 and commissions.

11 (3) The report shall include:

12 (A) The name of the state agency, board, or commission requesting the
13 advice;

14 (B) The name and scope of the project for which advice is being sought;

15 (C) The type of advice sought, for example: technical, product or service
16 utilization, planning, implementation, installation, integration, or
17 upgrades;

18 (D) A detailed explanation of all recommendations provided by the
19 Department of Information Systems;

20 (E) How the recommendation fits into the information technology plan of
21 the agency, board, or commission;

22 (F) How the recommendation fits into the state's information technology
23 plan and shared technical architecture; and

24 (G) Other information as may be useful for policy making decisions by the
25 Legislative Council or Joint Committee on Advanced Communications and
26 Information Technology.

27 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
28 2015 through June 30, 2016.

29
30 SECTION 10. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
31 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

32 COMPLIANCE WITH STATE AND FEDERAL REGULATIONS.

33 1. In order to effect compliance with the requirements of state and federal
34 statutory and regulatory provisions, the Director shall adjust billing rates
35 or issue billing adjustments to be federally compliant, notwithstanding the
36 provisions of ACA §25-4-105 and §25-4-119 or funds sufficient to effect

1 compliance shall be provided the Department from General Revenues, Special
2 Revenues or such other fund sources as may become available. These actions
3 shall be subject to the approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and
4 approval by the Arkansas Legislative Council.

5 2. The Director shall have authority to transfer funds between the
6 Information Technology Reserve Fund established by ACA §25-4-123 and the
7 Department of Information Systems Revolving Fund established by ACA §25-4-121
8 for cash management purposes.

9 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of
10 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year
11 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by
12 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and
13 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by
14 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly
15 has determined that the Department of Information Systems may operate more
16 efficiently if some flexibility is provided to the Department of Information
17 Systems authorizing broad powers under this Section. Therefore, it is both
18 necessary and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight by
19 requiring prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee

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28 SECTION 11. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
29 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. GIFTS,
30 GRANTS AND DONATIONS. The Director may accept on behalf of the Department of
31 Information Systems, from any source, the donation of gifts, grants, cash,
32 bequeaths, devices, donations, real or personal property and equipment for
33 the establishment, maintenance, operations, or improvement of broadband
34 services, enhancements and grants.

35 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
36 2015 through June 30, 2016.

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2 SECTION 12. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
3 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
4 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
5 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
6 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
7 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
8 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
9 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
10 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

11
12 SECTION 13. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
13 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
14 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
15 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
16 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
17 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
18 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
19 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

20
21 SECTION 14. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
22 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
23 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
24 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2015 is essential to the operation of
25 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
26 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
27 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2015 could work irreparable harm
28 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
29 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
30 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
31 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2015.
