4	(2) "Supervising practitioner" means a doctor of medicine
5	licensed by the Arkansas State Medical Board, registered nurse licensed by
6	the Arkansas State Board of Nursing, or other healthcare practitioner who
7	supervises a surgical technologist and assumes responsibility for the
8	services rendered by the surgical technologist;
9	(3) "Surgical technologist" means an individual who performs the
10	skills and techniques of surgical technology under the direction and
11	supervision of a supervising practitioner other than in the course of
12	practicing as a licensed healthcare professional; and
13	(4) "Surgical technology" means surgical patient care that
14	includes without limitation:
15	(A) Preparing an operating room and a sterile field for
16	surgical procedures by ensuring that surgical equipment is assembled and
17	functioning properly and safely;
18	(B) Preparing sterile supplies, instruments, and equipment
19	using sterile technique; and
20	(C) Performing tasks in a sterile field, including:
21	(i) Maintaining asepsis and a sterile operating
22	field;
23	(ii) Passing supplies, equipment, or instruments
24	according to the needs of the surgical team;
25	(iii) Sponging or suctioning an operative site;
26	(iv) Preparing and cutting suture material;
27	(v) Providing irrigation solutions to the
28	supervising physician and irrigating an operative site;
29	(vi) Providing drugs within the sterile field for
30	administration by the supervising physician;
31	(vii) Handling specimens;
32	(viii) Holding retractors and other instruments;
33	(ix) Applying electrocautery to clamps on blood
34	vessels;
35	(x) Connecting drains to a suction apparatus;
36	(vi) Applying dressings to closed wounds, and

1	(xii) Performing counts of supplies such as sponges,
2	needles, and instruments with the registered nurse circulator.
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4	17-108-103. Certification.
5	(a) The Arkansas State Medical Board shall certify as a surgical
6	technologist an applicant who:
7	(1) Holds a current credential as a certified surgical
8	technologist from the National Board of Surgical Technology and Surgical
9	Assisting or its successor or a national organization approved by the
10	Arkansas State Medical Board;
11	(2) Has successfully completed a surgical technologist training
12	program during the person's service as a member of any branch of the United
13	States Armed Forces; or
14	(3) Has been employed to practice as a surgical technologist in
15	a healthcare facility on or before July 1, 2015.
16	(b) The Arkansas State Medical Board may require an initial
17	application fee for the certification of a surgical technologist.
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19	17-108-104. Exemptions.
20	This chapter does not restrict:
21	(1) The practice of surgical technology by:
22	(A) An individual who is employed by the federal
23	government or by a bureau, division, or agency of the federal government and
24	while the individual is in the discharge of the employee's official duties;
25	(B) A student enrolled in:
26	(i) A surgical technology education or training
27	program; or
28	(ii) A nursing program, doctor of medicine program,
29	or physician's assistant education or training program; or
30	(C) A student participating in:
31	(i) A surgical technology work experience program or
32	internship approved by the Arkansas State Medical Board;
33	(ii) A nursing work experience program or
34	<pre>internship;</pre>
35	(iii) A doctor of medicine work experience program
36	or internship; or

1	(iv) A physician's assistant work experience program
2	or internship;
3	(2) A licensed healthcare practitioner from engaging in the full
4	scope of practice of the practitioner's profession or from doing work within
5	the standards and ethics of the practitioner's profession;
6	(3) The practice of surgical technology during office-based
7	surgery; or
8	(4) The practice of surgical technology by a person who is an
9	employee or contractor of a healthcare facility if:
10	(A) The healthcare facility is unable to employ or
11	contract with a sufficient number of qualified surgical technologists who
12	meet the requirements of this chapter after making a diligent and thorough
13	<pre>effort;</pre>
14	(B) The healthcare facility makes a written record of its
15	efforts under subdivision (4)(A) of this section and retains the record at
16	the healthcare facility; and
17	(C) The person meets the requirements of this chapter
18	within two (2) years of the start of employment or contracting for the
19	performance of surgical technology.
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21	17-108-105. Renewal of certification.
22	To remain certified to practice as a surgical technologist, an
23	individual certified under this chapter shall renew his or her certification
24	annually by:
25	(1) Submitting a nominal renewal fee and renewal application to
26	the Arkansas State Medical Board; and
27	(2) Completing fifteen (15) hours of continuing education
28	approved by the board.
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30	17-108-106. Supervision.
31	Supervision of a surgical technologist shall be continuous but does not
32	require the physical presence of the supervising practitioner at the time and
33	place that services of the surgical technologist are rendered if the
34	supervising practitioner and the surgical technologist are or can be easily
35	in contact by radio, telephone, or other electronic or telecommunication
36	device.

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2	17-108-107. Title and practice protection.
3	An individual not certified under this chapter is guilty of a Class A
4	misdemeanor and is subject to penalties applicable to the unlicensed practice
5	of medicine if he or she:
6	(1) Holds himself or herself out as a surgical technologist;
7	(2) Uses any combination or abbreviation of the terms "surgical
8	technologist", "certified surgical technologist", "ST", or "CST" to indicate
9	or imply that he or she is a surgical technologist;
10	(3) Practices surgical technology without a certification or
11	during any time that his or her certification is suspended; or
12	(4) Otherwise violates this chapter or rules promulgated under
13	this chapter.
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15	17-108-108. Violation.
16	The Arkansas State Medical Board may discipline an applicant for
17	certification as a surgical technologist or a surgical technologist who:
18	(1) Fraudulently or deceptively obtains or attempts to obtain a
19	certification as a surgical technologist;
20	(2) Fraudulently or deceptively uses a certification as a
21	surgical technologist;
22	(3) Violates this chapter or any rules adopted by the board
23	pertaining to this chapter;
24	(4) Is convicted of a felony;
25	(5) Is a habitual user of intoxicants or drugs to such an extent
26	that he or she is unable to safely perform as a surgical technologist;
27	(6) Has been adjudicated as mentally incompetent or has a mental
28	condition that renders him or her unable to safely perform as a surgical
29	technologist; or
30	(7) Represents himself or herself as a physician, physician's
31	assistant, or other healthcare practitioner for which the person is not
32	licensed or certified.
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34	17-108-109. Disciplinary and rulemaking authority.
35	(a) Upon finding that an applicant for certification as a surgical
36	technologist or a surgical technologist has committed any offense described

1	in § 1/-108-10/ or § 1/-108-108, the Arkansas State Medical Board may:
2	(1) Refuse to grant a certification as a surgical technologist;
3	(2) Administer a public or private reprimand;
4	(3) Revoke, suspend, limit, or otherwise restrict a
5	certification as a surgical technologist;
6	(4) Require a surgical technologist to submit to the care,
7	counseling, or treatment of a physician or physicians designated by the
8	board;
9	(5) Suspend enforcement of the finding of the board and place
10	the surgical technologist on probation with the right to vacate the
11	probationary order for noncompliance; or
12	(6) Restore or reissue, at the discretion of the board, a
13	certification as a surgical technologist and rescind any disciplinary or
14	corrective measure that the board has imposed.
15	(b) The board shall promulgate and adopt rules that are reasonable and
16	necessary to implement this chapter.
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
