8	(b) The intent of this act is to regulate individuals who practice	
9	surgical technology.

11	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Title 17 is amended to add an additional	
12	chapter to read as follows:	
13		
14	<u>Chapter 108</u>	
15	<u>Surgical Technologists</u>	
16		
17	17-108-101. Title.	
18	This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Arkansas Surgical	
19	Technologists Act".	
20		
21	17-108-102. Definitions.	
22	As used in this chapter:	
23	(1) "Office-based surgery" means surgery that:	
24	(A) Is performed by a physician in a medical office that	
25	is not a hospital, outpatient clinic, or other facility licensed by the State	
26	Board of Health;	
27	(B) Requires the use of general or intravenous	
28	anesthetics; and	
29	(C) In the opinion of the physician, does not require	
30	hospitalization;	
31	(2) "Supervising practitioner" means a doctor of medicine	
32	licensed by the Arkansas State Medical Board, registered nurse licensed by	
33 24	the Arkansas State Board of Nursing, or other licensed healthcare	
34 25	practitioner who supervises a surgical technologist and assumes	
35 26	responsibility for the services rendered by the surgical technologist;	
36	(3) "Surgical technologist" means an individual who performs the	

1	skills and techniques of surgical technology under the direction and	
2	supervision of a supervising practitioner other than in the course of	
3	practicing as a licensed healthcare professional; and	
4	(4) "Surgical technology" means surgical patient care that	
5	includes without limitation:	
6	(A) Preparing an operating room and a sterile field for	
7	surgical procedures by ensuring that surgical equipment is assembled and	
8	functioning properly and safely;	
9	(B) Preparing sterile supplies, instruments, and equipment	
10	using sterile technique; and	
11	(C) Performing tasks in a sterile field, including:	
12	(i) Maintaining asepsis and a sterile operating	
13	<pre>field;</pre>	
14	(ii) Passing supplies, equipment, or instruments	
15	according to the needs of the surgical team;	
16	(iii) Sponging or suctioning an operative site;	
17	(iv) Preparing and cutting suture material;	
18	(v) Providing irrigation solutions to the	
19	supervising physician and irrigating an operative site;	
20	(vi) Providing drugs within the sterile field for	
21	administration by the supervising physician;	
22	(vii) Handling specimens;	
23	(viii) Holding retractors and other instruments;	
24	(ix) Applying electrocautery to clamps on blood	
25	vessels;	
26	(x) Connecting drains to a suction apparatus;	
27	(xi) Applying dressings to closed wounds; and	
28	(xii) Performing counts of supplies such as sponges,	
29	needles, and instruments with the registered nurse circulator.	
30		
31	<u>17-108-103.</u> Certification.	
32	(a) The Arkansas State Medical Board shall certify as a surgical	
33	technologist an applicant who:	
34	(1) Holds a current credential as a certified surgical	
35	technologist from the National Board of Surgical Technology and Surgical	
36	Assisting or its successor or a national organization approved by the	

1	Arkansas State Medical Board;	
2	(2) Has successfully completed a surgical technologist training	
3	program during the person's service as a member of any branch of the United	
4	States Armed Forces; or	
5	(3) Has been employed to practice as a surgical technologist in	
6	a healthcare facility on or before January 1, 2016.	
7	(b) The Arkansas State Medical Board may require an initial	
8	application fee for the certification of a surgical technologist.	
9	(c) A provisional certification may be granted to a person who	
10	receives credentials from the licensed hospital in which the person is to	
11	perform surgical technology on the condition that the person obtains full	
12	certification within one (1) year of the effective date of this subchapter.	
13		
14	17-108-104. Exemptions.	
15	This chapter does not restrict:	
16	(1) The practice of surgical technology by:	
17	(A) An individual who is employed by the federal	
18	government or by a bureau, division, or agency of the federal government and	
19	while the individual is in the discharge of the employee's official duties;	
20	(B) A student enrolled in:	
21	(i) A surgical technology education or training	
22	program; or	
23	(ii) A nursing program, doctor of medicine program,	
24	or physician's assistant education or training program; or	
25	(C) A student participating in:	
26	(i) A surgical technology work experience program or	
27	internship approved by the Arkansas State Medical Board;	
28	(ii) A nursing work experience program or	
29	<pre>internship;</pre>	
30	(iii) A doctor of medicine work experience program	
31	or internship; or	
32	(iv) A physician's assistant work experience program	
33	or internship;	
34	(2) A licensed healthcare practitioner from engaging in the full	
35	scope of practice of the practitioner's profession or from doing work within	
36	the standards and athics of the practitioner's profession.	

1	(3) The practice of surgical technology during office-based	
2	surgery;	
3	(4)(A) The practice of surgical technology by a person brought	
4	from the office of a physician or across state lines to assist a physician	
5	who has experience working with the person.	
6	(B) A person exempt under subdivision (3) of this section	
7	<u>shall:</u>	
8	(i) Receive credentials from the licensed hospital	
9	where the person is to perform surgical technology; or	
10	(ii) Obtain a provisional certification; or	
11	(5) The practice of surgical technology by a person who is an	
12	employee or contractor of a healthcare facility if:	
13	(A) The healthcare facility is unable to employ or	
14	contract with a sufficient number of qualified surgical technologists who	
15	meet the requirements of this chapter after making a diligent and thorough	
16	<pre>effort;</pre>	
17	(B) The healthcare facility makes a written record of its	
18	efforts under subdivision (4)(A) of this section and retains the record at	
19	the healthcare facility; and	
20	(C) The person meets the requirements of this chapter	
21	within two (2) years of the start of employment or contracting for the	
22	performance of surgical technology.	
23		
24	17-108-105. Renewal of certification.	
25	To remain certified to practice as a surgical technologist, an	
26	individual certified under this chapter shall renew his or her certification	
27	every four (4) years by:	
28	(1) Submitting a nominal renewal fee and renewal application to	
29	the Arkansas State Medical Board; and	
30	(2) Completing sixty (60) hours of continuing education approved	
31	by the board within the four (4) year certification period.	
32		
33	17-108-106. Supervision.	
34	Supervision of a surgical technologist shall be continuous but does not	
35	require the physical presence of the supervising practitioner at the time and	
36	place that services of the surgical technologist are rendered if the	

1	supervising practitioner and the surgical technologist are or can be easily	
2	available to respond.	
3		
4	17-108-107. Title and practice protection.	
5	An individual not certified under this chapter is guilty of a Class A	
6	misdemeanor and is subject to penalties applicable to the unlicensed practice	
7	of medicine if he or she:	
8	(1) Holds himself or herself out as a surgical technologist;	
9	(2) Uses any combination or abbreviation of the terms "surgical	
10	$\underline{\text{technologist", "certified surgical technologist", "ST", or "CST" to indicate}$	
11	or imply that he or she is a surgical technologist;	
12	(3) Practices surgical technology without a certification or	
13	during any time that his or her certification is suspended; or	
14	(4) Otherwise violates this chapter or rules promulgated under	
15	this chapter.	
16		
17	17-108-108. Violation.	
18	The Arkansas State Medical Board may discipline an applicant for	
19	certification as a surgical technologist or a surgical technologist who:	
20	(1) Fraudulently or deceptively obtains or attempts to obtain a	
21	certification as a surgical technologist;	
22	(2) Fraudulently or deceptively uses a certification as a	
23	surgical technologist;	
24	(3) Violates this chapter or any rules adopted by the board	
25	pertaining to this chapter;	
26	(4) Is convicted of a felony;	
27	(5) Is a habitual user of intoxicants or drugs to such an extent	
28	that he or she is unable to safely perform as a surgical technologist;	
29	(6) Has been adjudicated as mentally incompetent or has a mental	
30	condition that renders him or her unable to safely perform as a surgical	
31	technologist; or	
32	(7) Represents himself or herself as a physician, physician's	
33	assistant, or other healthcare practitioner for which the person is not	
34	<u>licensed or certified.</u>	
35		
36	17-108-109. Disciplinary and rulemaking authority.	

1	(a) Upon finding that an applicant for certification as a surgical	
2	technologist or a surgical technologist has committed any offense described	
3	in § 17-108-107 or § 17-108-108, the Arkansas State Medical Board may:	
4	(1) Refuse to grant a certification as a surgical technologist;	
5	(2) Administer a public or private reprimand;	
6	(3) Revoke, suspend, limit, or otherwise restrict a	
7	certification as a surgical technologist;	
8	(4) Require a surgical technologist to submit to the care,	
9	counseling, or treatment of a physician or physicians designated by the	
10	board;	
11	(5) Suspend enforcement of the finding of the board and place	
12	the surgical technologist on probation with the right to vacate the	
13	probationary order for noncompliance; or	
14	(6) Restore or reissue, at the discretion of the board, a	
15	certification as a surgical technologist and rescind any disciplinary or	
16	corrective measure that the board has imposed.	
17	(b) The board shall promulgate and adopt rules that are reasonable and	
18	necessary to implement this chapter.	
19		
20	17-108-110. Effective date.	
21	This subchapter shall be effective on and after January 1, 2016.
