21	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:	
22		
23	SECTION 1. DO NOT CODIFY. <u>Legislative intent.</u>	
24	(a) The General Assembly finds that:	
25	(1) Members of county boards of election commissioners have an	<u>a</u>
26	essential role in the fair and proper administration of elections in this	
27	state; and	
28	(2) The current method of the election of members of county	
29	boards of election commissioners does not adequately address a situation in	<u>a</u>
30	which one (1) political party does not hold a majority of the constitution	<u>al</u>
31	offices in this state.	
32	(b) It is the intent of the General Assembly that the:	
33	(1) Political parties of the members of county boards of	
34	election commissioners reflect the political parties of the voting citizens	<u>3</u>
35	of this state as their associations change over time; and	
36	(2) Majority and minority parties reflect the two (2) politica	<u>al</u>

2	vote for the constitutional offices of this state if no political party holds
3	a majority of the constitutional offices in this state.
4	
5	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 7-1-101(17), concerning the definition of
6	"majority party", is amended to read as follows:
7	(17) $\underline{(A)}$ "Majority party" means that political party in the State
8	of Arkansas whose candidates were elected to a majority of the constitutional
9	offices of this state in the last preceding general election:
10	(B) If no political party's elected candidates under
11	subdivision (17)(A) of this section constitute a majority of the
12	constitutional offices, "majority party" means the political party that
13	received the greatest total number of votes for all of its candidates for the
14	constitutional offices of this state in the last preceding general election;
15	
16	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 7-1-101(20), concerning the definition of
17	"minority party", is amended to read as follows:
18	(20) $\underline{(A)}$ "Minority party" means that political party whose
19	candidates were elected to less than a majority of the constitutional offices
20	of this state in the last preceding general election or the political party
21	that polled the second greatest number of votes for the office of Governor in
22	the last preceding general election if all of the elected constitutional
23	officers of this state are from a single political party;.
24	(B)(i) If candidates of more than one (1) political party
25	were elected to less than a majority of the constitutional offices, "minority
26	party" means the political party whose candidates were elected to the higher
27	number of constitutional offices when compared with the remaining political
28	parties whose candidates were elected to less than a majority of the
29	constitutional offices.
30	(ii) If candidates of more than one (1) political party
31	were elected to less than a majority of the constitutional offices and the
32	candidates were elected to an equal number of constitutional offices,
33	"minority party" means the political party that received the second greatest
34	total number of votes for all of its candidates for the constitutional
35	offices of this state in the last preceding general election;
