25	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 12, Chapter 6,	is amended to add an
26	26 additional subchapter to read as follows:

30	30 (a) As used in this section:	
31	(1) "In the course of employment" means	at any time when a law
32	enforcement officer is on duty as a law enforcement officer or is performing

2	(3) "State law enforcement agency" means a state agency that is

5	(b)(1) A state law enforcement agency may award one (1) United States	
6	flag to the family of a law enforcement officer who lost his or her life in	
7	the course of employment with the state law enforcement agency.	
8	(2) "Family" shall be defined by the rules of the state law

11	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the	
12	$\underline{\text{General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that law enforcement officers } \mathbf{risk}$	
13	their lives every day in the course of their employment; that the state	
14	values the dedication and efforts of these law enforcement officers; that the	
15	safety and well-being of Arkansas citizens depend on the ability and	
16	willingness of men and women to serve in state law enforcement agencies; and	
17	that this act is immediately necessary because it is in the state's best	
18	interests to do everything possible to encourage and recognize service in	
19	state law enforcement agencies without delay. Therefore, an emergency is	
20	declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the	
21	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective	
22	on:	
23	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;	
24	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,	
25	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the	
26	bill; or	
27	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is	
28	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
