29	<u>17-26-502</u> . Legislative	findings.	
30	The General Assembly fi	nds that:	
31	<u>(l) Natural hair</u>	braiding is a traditional p	ractice that is
32	safe;		
33	<u>(2) Natural hair</u>	braiding presents no signif	ficant health and
34	safety risks to customers or	<pre>practitioners;</pre>	
35	(3) Occupational	regulation harms consumers	by limiting their
36	choices or by forcing consumers to forgo braiding services or enter the		

I	underground economy;	
2	(4) Occupational regulation and occupational licenses cause	
3	unnecessary difficulties for natural hair braiders to earn an honest living	
4	through their practice, to provide for themselves and their families, to	
5	offer their services to and compete for customers, and to create new	
6	employment and business opportunities through their entrepreneurism; and	
7	(5) It is the public policy of this state to protect economic	
8	<pre>liberty.</pre>

10	17-26-503. Definitions.	
11	As used in this subchapter:	
12	(1) "Mechanical device" means clips, combs, curlers, curling	
13	irons, hairpins, rollers, scissors, needles, thread, and hair binders; and	
14	(2)(A) "Natural hair braiding" means a service of twisting,	
15	wrapping, weaving, extending, locking, or braiding hair by hand or with a	
16	mechanical device that includes without limitation:	
17	(i) The use of natural or synthetic hair extensions,	
18	natural or synthetic hair fibers, decorative beads, and other hair	
19	accessories;	
20	(ii) The minor trimming of natural hair or hair	
21	extensions incidental to twisting, wrapping, weaving, extending, locking, or	
22	braiding hair;	
23	(iii) The use of topical agents such as	
24	conditioners, gels, moisturizers, oils, pomades, and shampoos; and	
25	(iv) The making of wigs from natural hair, natural	
26	fibers, synthetic fibers, and hair extensions.	
27	(B) Natural hair braiding does not include:	
28	(i) The application of dyes, reactive chemicals, or	
29	other preparations to alter the color of the hair or to straighten, curl, or	
30	alter the structure of the hair follicle; or	
31	(ii) The use of chemical hair joining agents such as	
32	synthetic tape, keratin bonds, or fusion bonds.	
33	(C) Natural hair braiding is commonly known as "African-	
34	style hair braiding" but is not limited to any particular cultural, ethnic,	
35	racial, or religious form of hairstyle.

1	17-26-504. Exemption.
2	The practice of natural hair braiding is exempt from regulation under
3	this chapter and is exempt from the authority of the Cosmetology Technical
4	Advisory Committee, the State Board of Health, and the Department of Health.
