3	(c) As used in this section, "search and rescue dog" means any dog:		
4	(1) In training for or trained for the purpose of search and		
5	rescue;		
6	(2) Owned by an independent handler or a member of a search and		
7	rescue team; and		
8	(3) Used in conjunction with local law enforcement or emergency		
9	services organizations for the purpose of locating missing persons or		
10	evidence of arson.		
11	(a) As used in this chapter, "service animal" means an animal that is		
12	trained specifically to do work or to perform tasks for the benefit of an		
13	individual with a disability, including without limitation:		
14	(1) A guide dog or a trained dog that serves as a travel		
15	assistant for an individual who has severe visual impairment or is blind;		
16	(2) A signal dog or a dog trained to alert when a sound occurs		
17	<u>an individual who has a significant hearing loss or is deaf;</u>		
18	(3) A service dog or a dog trained to perform tasks that assist		
19	an individual with a disability;		
20	(4) An assistance animal or an animal trained and used to assist		
21	an individual with a disability;		
22	(5) A seizure alert animal or an animal trained to assist an		
23	individual with a seizure disorder when a particular medical event is about		
24	to occur or to respond to a medical event that has occurred;		
25	(6) A mobility animal or an animal that is being or has been		
26	trained to assist an individual with a disability caused by physical		
27	impairments;		
28	(7) A psychiatric service animal or an animal trained to assist		
29	an individual with a disability to detect the onset of psychiatric episodes		
30	and lessen the effects of the psychiatric episodes; or		
31	(8) A sensory service animal or an animal trained to assist an		
32	individual with autism or other sensory disorder.		
33	(b) A person who has a physical disability, mental disability,		
34	intellectual disability, or sensory disability shall have the right to be		
35	accompanied by a service animal on public ways, in public places, and in		
36	other public accommodations and housing accommodations prescribed in § 20-14-		

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1 303 and shall not be required to pay an extra fee or charge for the service 2 animal. 3 (c) However, a person who has a physical disability, mental 4 disability, intellectual disability, or sensory disability and who is 5 accompanied by a service animal on a public way, in a public place, in a 6 public accommodation, or in a housing accommodation is liable for any damage 7 caused to the premises or facilities by the service animal. 8 (d) Any A person who without just cause purposely kills or injures any 9 service animal described in this section or any search and rescue dog is 10 guilty of a Class D felony. 11 (e) Any A person who kills or injures any service animal described in 12 this section or any search and rescue dog shall make restitution to the owner 13 of the animal. 14 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 20-14-308, concerning guide dog and service 15 16 dog access, is amended to read as follows: 17 20-14-308. Guide dog and service dog Service animal access. 18 (a) An individual with visual, hearing, or other physical disabilities 19 a physical disability, mental disability, intellectual disability, or sensory 20 disability and his or her guide, signal, or service dog service animal or a 21 dog trainer in the act of training a guide, signal, or service dog service 22 animal shall not be denied admittance to or refused access to the following 23 because of the dog animal: 24 (1) Any A street or highway; 25 (2) Any A sidewalk or walkway; 26 (3) Any A common carrier, airplane, motor vehicle, railroad 27 train, bus, streetcar, boat, or any other public conveyance or mode of 28 transportation; 29 Any \underline{A} hotel, motel, or other place of lodging; (4) Any A public building maintained by any unit or subdivision 30 (5) 31 of government; 32 (6) Any A building to which the general public is invited; 33 (7) Any An educational facility or college dormitory; 34 (8) Any A restaurant or other place where food is offered for 35 sale to the public; or 36 Any other place Other places of public accommodation, (9)

4	(b) The individual with visual, hearing, or other physical		
5	disabilities, <u>A person who has a physical disability, mental disability,</u>		
6	intellectual disability, or sensory disability or dog a trainer in the act of		
7	training a guide, signal, or service dog service animal shall not be required		
8	to pay any additional charges for his or her guide, signal, or service dog		
9	service animal but shall be is liable for any damage done to the premises by		
10	the dog <u>animal</u> .		
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12	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code Title 20, Chapter 14, Subchapter 3, is		
13	amended to add additional sections to read as follows:		
14	20-14-309. Service animal inquiry.		
15	(a) If the service that the animal provides to an individual is not		
16	obvious to the staff of the public accommodation, the staff may make		
17	inquiries regarding only the following:		
18	(1) Whether the service animal is required because of a		
19	disability; and		
20	(2) What work or task the service animal has been trained to		
21	perform.		
22	(b) The staff of a public accommodation listed in § 20-14-308 shall		
23	not:		
24	(1) Make inquiries regarding the nature or extent of an		
25	individual's disability;		
26	(2) Require medical documentation of the individual's		
27	<u>disability;</u>		
28	(3) Require a special identification card or training		
29	documentation; or		
30	(4) Request the service animal to demonstrate its ability to		
31	perform the work or task.		
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33	<u>20-14-310. Control.</u>		
34	(a)(1) A service animal shall be under the control of its handler.		
35	(2) A service animal shall have a harness, leash, or other		
36	tether unless either:		

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1	(A) The handler is unable because of a disability to use a		
2	harness, leash, or other tether; or		
3	(B) The use of a harness, leash, or other tether would		
4	interfere with the service animal's safe, effective performance of the work		
5	or task.		
6	(3) If a service animal is unattached to a harness, leash, or		
7	other tether, the service animal shall be otherwise under the handler's		
8	control by voice controls, signals, or other effective means.		
9	(b)(1) A public entity or accommodation may request that a service		
10	animal be removed from the premises if:		
11	(A) The service animal is not acting under the control of		
12	the handler and the handler does not take effective action to control the		
13	<u>service animal; or</u>		
14	(B) The service animal is not housebroken.		
15	(2) If a public entity or accommodation properly excludes a		
16	service animal under subdivision (b)(l) of this section, the public entity or		
17	accommodation shall give the individual with a disability the opportunity to		
18	participate in the service, program, or activity without the service animal		
19	on the premises.		
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
