22 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
23 INNOVATION AND PROJECT DEVELOPMENT FUND TRANSFERS. The Department of
24 Information Systems is a cost recovery agency subject to the requirements of
25 the United States Office of Management and Budget Circular A-87 Cost
26 Principles for State, Local and Indian Tribal Government (A-87) and Cost
27 Principles for Developing Cost Allocation Plans and Indirect Cost Rates for
28 Agreements with the Federal Government Implementation Guide for the Office of
29 Management and Budget Circular A-87 (ASMBC-10). To comply with these federal
30 rules, it is necessary to establish an Innovation and Project Development
31 appropriation and general revenue fund account within the Department of
32 Finance and Administration Disbursing Officer for the Department of
33 Information Systems. This fund shall be used for state enterprise innovation
34 projects that would enhance the technology operations of the State that
35 cannot be cost allocated to federal programs. The Department of Information
36 Systems will maintain documentation for projects billed for these purposes.

1 Fund transfers may be made from the General Revenue Fund Account, upon the
2 approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and prior review of the
3 Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee, to reimburse the
4 Department of Information Systems for the amounts billed.

5 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
6 2015 through June 30, 2016.

7
8 SECTION 77. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
9 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. WORK
10 FORCE 2000 DISTRIBUTION. After the amounts to be made available to the
11 various technical institutes or comprehensive lifelong learning centers have
12 been determined as set out in Arkansas Code 26-51-205(d)(2)(A) and 26-51-
13 205(d)(2)(B), such documents as may be necessary shall be processed so that
14 funds may be transferred from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund to the
15 State Treasury fund or fund account from which the technical institute or
16 comprehensive lifelong learning center draws its general revenue support.
17 Such funds as may be transferred shall not exceed 6.309% of the total funds
18 available from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund during each fiscal year.

19 In the event that a technical college, community college or educational
20 institution which receives support from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund
21 as determined by law transfers from the Arkansas Technical College and
22 Community College System for which Work Force 2000 Development Fund monies
23 are determined by law, then the actual amount of support from the Work Force
24 2000 Development Fund in the preceding fiscal year for such educational
25 institution shall be made available irrespective of any other provision of
26 law which sets out maximum levels of support from such fund.

27 The Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall submit a report for
28 review to the Arkansas Economic Development Commission prior to July 1, ~~2014~~
29 2015 of the proposed distribution of the increase in the amount of funds in
30 the Work Force 2000 Development Fund as set out in Arkansas Code 26-51-
31 205(d)(2)(C) in excess of those amounts collected and distributed prior to
32 June 30, 2014. The funds distributed under Arkansas Code 26-51-205(d)(2)(C)
33 in excess of those amounts collected and distributed prior to June 30, 2014
34 shall be used only for the operation, support, and improvement of
35 occupational, vocational, technical, and workforce development programs. The
36 distributions of funds under Arkansas Code 21-51-205(d)(2)(C) in excess of

1 those amounts collected and distributed prior to June 30, 2014 shall not
2 apply to proceeds allocated to schools, colleges and educational institutions
3 under Arkansas Code 26-51-205(d)(2)(A) and 26-51-205(d)(2)(B).

4 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2014
5 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

6
7 SECTION 78. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
8 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER
9 PROCEDURES – EXTRA HELP. In the event that there is not sufficient
10 appropriation provided for by the General Assembly for payment of Extra Help
11 for any state agency for the period ending June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016, said agency
12 may request a transfer from appropriations provided for Extra Help in Section
13 2, Miscellaneous Transfers, herein, from the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
14 State, stating clearly the amount required. Upon approval of the Chief
15 Fiscal Officer of the State, and after seeking prior review by the Arkansas
16 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee, the State Auditor shall be
17 notified as to the amount and the purposes for which said appropriation is to
18 be made. The appropriation shall then be established upon the books of the
19 Department of Finance and Administration and the State Auditor. Provided
20 further, that if desired, said appropriation shall be supplemental to those
21 regularly appropriated for such purposes by the General Assembly for the
22 agency.

23 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2014
24 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

25
26 SECTION 79. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
27 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. INTRASTATE
28 METRO PLANNING GRANTS. As referenced in Section 9 of Act 637 of 1995, the
29 authorized funding for Intrastate Metro Planning Grants that are evenly
30 distributed among planning and development districts under Section 3 of this
31 act shall include the West Central Arkansas Economic Development District.

32
33 SECTION 80. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
34 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL, OR TEMPORARY LAW. FUNDING
35 TRANSFER. Immediately upon the effective date of this section, and
36 notwithstanding the provisions of A.C.A. 18-28-213(c)(2) regarding the

1 transfer of funds from the Unclaimed Property Proceeds Trust Fund to the
2 general revenues of the state, the Auditor of the State shall transfer on his
3 or her books and those of the State Treasurer and the Chief Fiscal Officer of
4 the State the sum of two million six hundred thousand dollars (\$2,600,000)
5 from the Unclaimed Property Proceeds Trust Fund to the "Rainy Day Set-Aside"
6 portion of the 89th Session Projects Account of the General Improvement Fund
7 established by A.C.A. 19-5-1005.

8
9 SECTION 81. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
10 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
11 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
12 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
13 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
14 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
15 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
16 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
17 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

18
19 SECTION 82. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
20 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
21 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
22 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
23 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
24 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
25 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
26 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

27
28 SECTION 83. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
29 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
30 appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
31 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2015 is essential to the operation of
32 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
33 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
34 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2015 could work irreparable harm
35 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
36 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act

1 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
2 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2015,
3 with the exception of Section 80, which shall be in full force and effect
4 from and after the date of its passage and approval. If the bill is neither
5 approved nor vetoed by the Governor, Section 80 shall become effective on the
6 expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto a bill.
7 If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and overridden, Section 80 shall become
8 effective on the date the last house overrides the veto.
