22	(a)(1) The State Board of Education shall cease participation and its
23	role as a governing state with the Partnership for Assessment of Readiness
24	for College and Careers (PARCC) no later than June 30, 2015.
25	(2) The state board may not require the use of the PARCC
26	assessment or participate in a PARCC-related activity or event after June 30,
27	<u>2015</u> ,
28	(3) This subsection does not prevent the Department of Education
29	from completing activities with PARCC in order to conclude the 2014-2015

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5	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
6	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that there is substantial
7	controversy and questions regarding the assessments associated with the
8	Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers (PARCC); that
9	until more information and understanding about the assessments are gleaned,
10	the assessment program that was used during the 2012-2013 school year should
11	be used; and that this act is immediately necessary to ensure students are
12	assessed this current school year. Therefore, an emergency is declared to
13	exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the
14	public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:
15	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
16	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
17	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
18	<u>bill; or</u>
19	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
20	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
