1	(1) "Approved institution" means a public or private nonprofit
2	institution of higher education located in Arkansas that:
3	(A) Is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission of the
4	North Central Association of Colleges and Schools; and
5	(B) Is approved or seeking approval by the United States
6	Department of Education as a comprehensive transition and postsecondary
7	program;
8	(2)(A) "Arkansas resident" means a recipient or a recipient's
9	parent or guardian who is domiciled in Arkansas for at least twelve (12)
10	months before applying for the Building Better Futures High School Program.
11	(B) A recipient or a recipient's parent or guardian may be
12	asked to provide proof of domicile as evidenced by one (1) of the following:
13	(i) Information from the Free Application for
14	Federal Student Assistance;
15	(ii) Valid Arkansas driver's license;
16	(iii) Documentation of current payment for personal
17	or real property taxes for the previous year;
18	(iv) Current vehicle registration;
19	(v) Current voter registration; or
20	(iv) Other forms that establish residency;
21	(3) "Eligible student" means a person who satisfies the criteria

23	(4) "Home school" means an educational program provided by the
24	student's parent or guardian as permitted under §6-15-501 et seq.;

3	To be eligible for selective admission into a Building Better Futures
4	High School Program, a student shall:
5	(1)(A) Be a current student at a public high school who is
6	currently served under an individual education program.
7	(B)(i) The parent or guardian of the student shall notify
8	the student's individual education program committee at least one (1)
9	calendar year in advance of the Building Better Futures High School Program's
10	application deadline of the parent or guardian's desire for the student's
11	individual education program to include participation, if admitted, in the
12	nearest Building Better Futures High School Program.
13	(ii) The student's individual education program
14	committee shall notify the parent of guardian within sixty (60) days of the
15	parent or guardian making the request of whether or not participation in the
16	Building Better Futures High School Program is deemed appropriate for the
17	student to receive a free appropriate public education.
18	(C) If the student's individual education program committee
19	<u>determines that seeking admission to a Building Better Futures High School</u>
20	Program should be part of the student's individual education program, the

27	are openings available after all Arkansas residents are admitted;

29	(5) Be selected for admission by an approved institution into
30	the institution's comprehensive transition and postsecondary program or a
31	program in the process of becoming a Comprehensive Transition and
32	Postsecondary Program;

6	(1) Have a selective admission process for students with
7	documented intellectual disabilities;

30	(b) The Department of Higher Education shall provide information on
31	the options for postsecondary education for students with intellectual

32	higher rate for secondary school students than for other students from the

3	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
4	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the Building Better Futures
5	High School Program will be established by the 2015-2016 school year; that
6	immediate adoption is essential to ensure that eligible students are aware of
7	the program and have the information necessary to apply; and that this act is
8	immediately necessary to allow the Department of Higher Education time to
9	implement the program and disseminate information to potentially eligible
10	students. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being
11	immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and
12	safety shall become effective on:
13	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
14	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
15	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
16	bill; or
17	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
18	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
