19	TO AMEND THE LAW REGARDING THE REAL-TIME

24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:	
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26	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 5-64-1106(a), concerning the real-time	
27	electronic logbook for ephedrine and other drugs, is amended to read as	
28	follows:	
29	(a)(1)(A) Subject to available funding, on On or before May 15, 2008	
30	2015, the Arkansas Crime Information Center shall provide pharmacies in this	
31	state access to a real-time electronic logbook for the purpose of entering	
32	into the real-time electronic logbook any transaction required to be reporte	d
33	by § 5-64-1104.	
34	(B) The real-time electronic logbook shall be installed,	
35	operated, and maintained free of any one-time or recurring charge to a	
36	pharmacy, law enforcement, agency, or the state.

1	(C) The real-time electronic logbook shall be able to
2	communicate in real time with similar systems operated in other states and
3	similar systems containing information from more than one (1) state.
4	(2) The real-time electronic logbook shall have the capability
5	to calculate both state and federal ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, or
6	phenylpropanolamine purchase limitations, and shall be able to prevent the
7	completion of a sale of a product containing ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, or
8	phenylpropanolamine that would violate state or federal law regarding the
9	purchase of a product containing those ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, or
10	phenylpropanolamine.
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12	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
13	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the State of Arkansas has
14	implemented its own state-operated real-time electronic logbook for
15	pseudoephedrine sale tracking that cannot share data from this system with
16	other states; that a real-time electronic logbook with the ability to be
17	shared across state lines could eliminate the ability of individuals to
18	travel from state to state to purchase pseudoephedrine for the purpose of
19	manufacturing methamphetamine; and that this act is immediately necessary
20	because this act could save the lives of citizens of Arkansas by reducing or
21	eliminating domestic manufacturing of methamphetamine and may spare thousands
22	of Arkansans from the devastation caused from methamphetamine addiction.
23	Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately
24	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall
25	become effective on:
26	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
27	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
28	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
29	bill; or
30	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
31	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
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
