1 (C) If a real-time electronic logbook required by this 2 section is no longer available to pharmacies, law enforcement agencies, and the state at no cost, the Arkansas Crime Information Center shall select 3 4 another real-time electronic logbook through the state procurement process. 5 (D) The real-time electronic logbook shall be able to 6 communicate in real time with similar systems operated in other states and 7 similar systems containing information from more than one (1) state. 8 (2) The real-time electronic logbook shall have the capability 9 to calculate both state and federal ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, or 10 phenylpropanolamine purchase limitations, and shall be able to prevent the 11 completion of a sale of a product containing ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, or 12 phenylpropanolamine that would violate state or federal law regarding the purchase of a product containing those ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, or 13 14 phenylpropanolamine. 15 16 SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the 17 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the State of Arkansas has implemented its own state-operated real-time electronic logbook for 18 pseudoephedrine sale tracking that cannot share data from this system with 19 other states; that a real-time electronic logbook with the ability to be 20 shared across state lines could eliminate the ability of individuals to 21 22 travel from state to state to purchase pseudoephedrine for the purpose of 23 manufacturing methamphetamine; and that this act is immediately necessary 24 because this act could save the lives of citizens of Arkansas by reducing or 25 eliminating domestic manufacturing of methamphetamine and may spare thousands 26 of Arkansans from the devastation caused from methamphetamine addiction. 27 Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall 28 29 become effective on: 30 (1) The date of its approval by the Governor; (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, 31 32 the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the 33 bill; or 34 (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is 35 overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
