- 27 (4) "Public official" means a federal, state, or local elected
- 28 official with the executive responsibility in the jurisdiction in which an

- 30 (5) "Public safety official" means an appointed or elected
- 31 <u>federal</u>, state, or local official with the executive responsibility to
- 32 coordinate public safety in the jurisdiction in which an emergency or event
- 33 has occurred; and
- 34 (6) "Registered architect" means a person licensed under a
- 35 state's architectural licensure laws as a registered architect.
