- 21 ensure that the fetal remains and all parts thereof are disposed of in a
- 22 fashion similar to that in which other tissue is disposed.
- 23 (b)(1) No A person shall not perform any biomedical or behavioral
- 24 research on:
- 25 (1) $\frac{\Delta}{\Delta}$ fetus born alive as the result of a legal abortion
- 26 unless the research is for the exclusive benefit of the fetus so born+; or
- 27 (2) No person shall perform any biomedical or behavioral
- 28 research on any A fetus born dead as the result of a legal abortion or on any
- 29 fetal tissue produced by the abortion without permission of the mother.
- 30 (c) No $\underline{\Lambda}$ person shall <u>not</u> buy, sell, give, exchange, or barter or
