16	(ii) Students with medically fragile conditions are
17	those who have the daily possibility of a life-threatening emergency and
18	require daily monitoring by a nurse; and
19	(E)(i) Level 5 for students who are nursing dependent at a
20	ratio of one (1) school nurse per one (1) student.
21	(ii) Students who are nursing dependent require
22	twenty-four-hour nursing care for survival.
23	(3) In a district that provides a center for profoundly disabled
24	students, the ratio should be one (1) school nurse per one hundred twenty-
25	five (125) students at that center.
26	(d)(l) School nurses may be employed or provided by contract or

25	compensation of acts involving the care of the ill, injured, or infirm or the
26	delegation of certain nursing practices to other personnel as set forth in
27	regulations $rules$ established by the board under the direction of a
28	professional registered nurse, an advanced practice registered nurse, a
29	licensed physician, or a licensed dentist, which acts do not require the
30	substantial specialized skill, judgment, and knowledge required in
31	professional nursing ;
32	(B) The board shall establish a process to ensure that a
33	practical nurse working in a school district is performing under the
34	supervision of a professional registered nurse, an advanced practice
35	registered nurse, a licensed physician, or a licensed dentist;
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
