29	(B)	When the permitted premises is a	-retail liquor store	
30	that sells alcoholic beverages for off-premises consumption, an employee of			
31	the retail liquor store that is licensed to carry a concealed handgun by the

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35	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 5-73-119(e)(11), concerning permissible			
36	possession of a handgun or firearm on school property or in a church or other			



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1 place of worship, is amended to read as follows: 2 (11) The person has a license to carry a concealed handgun under 3 § 5-73-301 et seq. and is carrying a concealed handgun on the developed 4 property of a kindergarten through grade twelve (K-12) private school 5 operated by a church or other place of worship that: 6 (A) Is located on the developed property of the 7 kindergarten through grade twelve (K-12) private school; 8 (B) Allows the person to carry a concealed handgun into 9 the church or other place of worship under § 5-73-306; and 10 (C) Allows the person to possess a concealed handgun on 11 the developed property of the kindergarten through grade twelve (K-12) 12 private school. The person is carrying a concealed handgun and has a license to carry a concealed handgun under § 5-73-301 et seq. 13 14 15 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 5-73-122 is amended to read as follows: 16 5-73-122. Carrying a firearm in publicly owned buildings or 17 facilities. 18 (a)(1) Except as provided in § 5-73-322, it It is unlawful for any 19 person other than a law enforcement officer or a security guard in the employ 20 of the state or an agency of the state, or any city or county, or any state 21 or federal military personnel, to knowingly carry or possess a loaded firearm 22 or other deadly weapon in any publicly owned building or facility or on the 23 State Capitol grounds. 24 (2) It is unlawful for any person other than a law enforcement 25 officer or a security guard in the employ of the state or an agency of the 26 state, or any city or county, or any state or federal military personnel, to 27 knowingly carry or possess a firearm, whether loaded or unloaded, in the 28 State Capitol Building or the Arkansas Justice Building in Little Rock. 29 (3) However, the provisions of this subsection do does not apply 30 to<u>:</u> 31 (A) a A person carrying or possessing a firearm or other 32 deadly weapon in a publicly owned building or facility or on the State 33 Capitol grounds for the purpose of participating in a shooting match or 34 target practice under the auspices of the agency responsible for the publicly 35 owned building or facility or the State Capitol grounds or; 36 (B) A person carrying or possessing a firearm or other

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1 deadly weapon in a publicly owned building or facility or on the State 2 Capitol grounds if necessary to participate in a trade show, exhibit, or 3 educational course conducted in the publicly owned building or facility or on 4 the State Capitol grounds-; 5 (C) A law enforcement officer or a security guard in the 6 employ of the state, an agency of the state, or a city or county; 7 (D) State or federal military personnel; or 8 (E) If not otherwise prohibited by § 5-73-306, a person 9 carrying a concealed handgun on the State Capitol grounds who has a license to carry a concealed handgun under § 5-73-301 et seq. 10 11 (4) As used in this section, "facility" means a municipally owned 12 or maintained park, football field, baseball field, soccer field, or another 13 similar municipally owned or maintained recreational structure or property. 14 (b)(1) Any person other than a law enforcement officer, officer of the 15 court, or bailiff, acting in the line of duty, or any other person authorized 16 by the court, who possesses a handgun in the courtroom of any court of this 17 state upon conviction is guilty of a Class D felony. 18 (2) Otherwise, any person violating a provision of this section 19 upon conviction is guilty of a Class A misdemeanor. 20 21 SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 5-73-306 is amended to read as follows: 22 5-73-306. Prohibited places. 23 No A license to carry a concealed handgun issued pursuant to under this 24 subchapter authorizes any does not authorize a person to carry a concealed 25 handgun into: 26 (1) Any police station, sheriff's station, or Department of 27 Arkansas State Police station; 28 (2) Any Arkansas Highway Police Division of the Arkansas State 29 Highway and Transportation Department facility; 30 (3) (A) Any building of the Arkansas State Highway and 31 Transportation Department or onto grounds adjacent to any building of the 32 Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department. 33 (B) However, subdivision (3)(A) of this section does not 34 apply to a rest area or weigh station of the Arkansas State Highway and 35 Transportation Department; 36 (4)(3) Any detention facility, prison, or jail;

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1 (5)(4) Any courthouse; 2 (6)(A)(5)(A) Any courtroom. 3 (B) However, nothing in this subchapter precludes does not 4 preclude a judge from carrying a concealed weapon or determining who will 5 carry a concealed weapon into his or her courtroom; 6 (7) Any polling place; 7 (8) Any meeting place of the governing body of any governmental 8 entity; 9 (9) Any meeting of the General Assembly or a committee of the 10 General Assembly; 11 (10) Any state office; 12 (11) Any athletic event not related to firearms; 13 (12) Any portion of an establishment, except a restaurant as 14 defined in § 3-5-1202, licensed to dispense alcoholic beverages for 15 consumption on the premises; 16 (13) Any portion of an establishment, except a restaurant as 17 defined in § 3-5-1202, where beer or light wine is consumed on the premises; 18 (14)(A)(6)(A) A school, college, community college, or 19 university campus building or event, unless for the purpose of participating 20 in an authorized firearms-related activity or otherwise provided for in § 5-21 73-322. 22 (B) However, subdivision (14)(A)(6)(A) of this section 23 does not apply to a kindergarten through grade twelve (K-12) private school 24 operated by a church or other place of worship that: 25 (i) Is located on the developed property of the 26 kindergarten through grade twelve (K-12) private school; 27 (ii) Allows the licensee to carry a concealed 28 handgun into the church or other place of worship under this section; and 29 (iii) Allows the licensee to possess a concealed 30 handgun on the developed property of the kindergarten through grade twelve 31 (K-12) private school under § 5-73-119(e); 32 (15)(7) Inside the The passenger terminal of any airport, except 33 that no a person is not prohibited from carrying any legal firearm into the 34 passenger terminal if the firearm is encased for shipment for purposes of 35 checking the firearm as baggage to be lawfully transported on any aircraft; 36 or

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1 (16)(A) Any church or other place of worship. 2 (B) However, this subchapter does not preclude a church or other place of worship from determining who may carry a concealed handgun 3 4 into the church or other place of worship; 5 (17)(8) Any place where the carrying of a firearm is prohibited 6 by federal law; or 7 (18) Any place where a parade or demonstration requiring a 8 permit is being held, and the licensee is a participant in the parade or 9 demonstration: or 10 $(19)(\Lambda)(i)$ (9)(A)(i) Any place at the discretion of the person or 11 entity exercising control over the physical location of the place by placing 12 at each entrance to the place a written notice clearly readable at a distance of not less than ten feet (10') that "carrying a handgun is prohibited". 13 14 (ii)(a) If the place does not have a roadway 15 entrance, there shall be a written notice placed anywhere upon the premises 16 of the place. 17 (b) In addition to the requirement of 18 subdivision (19)(A)(ii)(a) (9)(A)(i)(a) of this section, there shall be at 19 least one (1) written notice posted within every three (3) acres of a place 20 with no roadway entrance. 21 (iii) A written notice as described in subdivision 22 (19)(A)(i) (9)(A)(i) of this section is not required for a private home. 23 (iv) Any licensee entering a private home shall 24 notify the occupant that the licensee is carrying a concealed handgun. 25 (B) Subdivision (19)(A)(9)(A) of this section does not 26 apply if the physical location is a public university, public college, or 27 community college, as defined in § 5-73-322, and the licensee is carrying a 28 concealed handgun as provided under § 5-73-322. 29 30 31 32 33 34 35 36

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
