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2	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 14-272-103, concerning studies and findings		
3	of the Rural Fire Departments Study Committee, is amended to add an		
4	additional subsection to read as follows:		
5	(c) The committee shall:		
6	(1) Study, review, and analyze potential incentives and methods		
7	to recruit and retain volunteers for nonmunicipal fire departments;		
8	(2) Study and review the number of nonmunicipal fire departments		
9	and any available resources in the state to determine the most efficient		
10	operation of nonmunicipal fire departments and evaluate if consolidation of		
11	fire departments or other measures are necessary to improve efficiency;		
12	(3) Study and review all types of nonmunicipal fire departments,		
13	including without limitation countywide fire departments, and the potential		
14	conversion of the departments to fire protection districts;		
15	(4) Study and develop a comprehensive plan to bring all		
16	nonmunicipal fire departments' Insurance Services Office, Inc.'s Public		
17	Protection Classification rating to Class 6 or less by January 1, 2024,		
18	including without limitation a review of:		
19	(A) Numbers of volunteers for each nonmunicipal fire		
20	department;		
21	(B) Number of nonmunicipal fire department locations;		
22	(C) Equipment at each nonmunicipal fire department		
23	location; and		
24	(D) Essential equipment necessary at each nonmunicipal		
25	fire department location;		
26	(5) Study and review the financial solvency of nonmunicipal fire		
27	departments and analyze the impact of an increase in funding to the		
28	nonmunicipal fire departments;		
29	(6) Study and review the role of nonmunicipal fire departments,		
30	including without limitation response to fires, nonstructural fires, medical		
31	assistance calls, rescues, and other emergency services; and		
32	(7) Study and review other nonmunicipal fire department matters		
33	as deemed necessary by the committee.
