20 21	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 14-272-101(b)(1), concerning the creation	
22	of the Rural Fire Departments Study Committee, is amended to read as follows: (b)(1) The following shall be nonvoting ex officio members of the	
23	committee Rural Fire Departments Study Committee:	
24	(A) One (1) member representing the Arkansas Farm Bureau	
25	Federation, to be recommended by the Arkansas Farm Bureau Federation and	
26	appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;	
27	(B) One (1) member representing the Independent Insurance	
28	Agents of Arkansas, to be recommended by the Independent Insurance Agents of	
29	Arkansas and appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;	
30	(C) One (1) member representing the <u>Arkansas</u> County Judges	3
31	Association, to be recommended by the <u>Arkansas</u> County Judges Association and	
32	appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;

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1 (E) One (1) member representing the Arkansas Council of 2 Professional Fire Fighters, to be recommended by the Arkansas Council of Professional Fire Fighters and appointed by the Speaker of the House of 3 4 Representatives; 5 (F) One (1) member representing the Arkansas Municipal 6 League, to be recommended by the Arkansas Municipal League and appointed by 7 the Speaker of the House of Representatives; 8 (G) One (1) member appointed by the Speaker of the House 9 of Representatives to represent be recommended by the Arkansas State 10 Firefighters Association; 11 (H) The Director of the Arkansas Forestry Commission or the 12 director's his or her designee; (I) The Director of the Department of Rural Services or 13 14 the director's his or her designee; and 15 (J) The Manager of the Rural Fire Protection Program of 16 the Arkansas Association of Resource Conservation and Development Councils; 17 (K) The State Fire Marshal or his or her designee; 18 (L) The Insurance Commissioner or his or her designee; 19 (M) The State Fire Service Coordinator of the Arkansas 20 Department of Emergency Management or his or her designee; 21 (N) The President of the Arkansas Forestry Association or 22 his or her designee; 23 (0) The State Geographic Information Officer or his or her 24 designee; 25 (P) Two (2) firefighters representing volunteer fire 26 departments, to be recommended by the cochairs of the Rural Fire Departments 27 Study Committee and appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; 28 (Q) Two (2) fire chiefs representing volunteer fire 29 departments, to be recommended by the Arkansas Association of Fire Chiefs and 30 appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; 31 (R) One (1) member representing nonprofit fire 32 departments, to be recommended by the cochairs of the Rural Fire Departments 33 Study Committee and appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; 34 and 35 (S) Two (2) fire department consultants, to be recommended 36 by the cochairs of the Rural Fire Departments Study Committee and appointed

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3	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 14-272-103, concerning studies and findings
4	of the Rural Fire Departments Study Committee, is amended to add an
5	additional subsection to read as follows:
6	(c) The committee shall:
7	(1) Study, review, and analyze potential incentives and methods
8	to recruit and retain volunteers for nonmunicipal fire departments;
9	(2) Study and review the number of nonmunicipal fire departments
10	and any available resources in the state to determine the most efficient
11	operation of nonmunicipal fire departments and evaluate if consolidation of
12	fire departments or other measures are necessary to improve efficiency;
13	(3) Study and review all types of nonmunicipal fire departments,
14	including without limitation countywide fire departments, and the potential
15	conversion of the departments to fire protection districts;
16	(4) Study and develop a comprehensive plan to bring all
17	nonmunicipal fire departments' Insurance Services Office, Inc.'s Public
18	Protection Classification rating to Class 6 or less by January 1, 2024,
19	including without limitation a review of:
20	(A) Numbers of volunteers for each nonmunicipal fire
21	department;
22	(B) Number of nonmunicipal fire department locations;
23	(C) Equipment at each nonmunicipal fire department
24	location; and
25	(D) Essential equipment necessary at each nonmunicipal
26	fire department location;
27	(5) Study and review the financial solvency of nonmunicipal fire
28	departments and analyze the impact of an increase in funding to the
29	nonmunicipal fire departments;
30	(6) Study and review the role of nonmunicipal fire departments,
31	including without limitation response to fires, nonstructural fires, medical
32	assistance calls, rescues, and other emergency services; and
33	(7) Study and review other nonmunicipal fire department matters
34	as deemed necessary by the committee.
