3	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Title 25 is amended to add an additional
4	chapter to read as follows:
5	CHAPTER 43
6	ARKANSAS SUNSET ACT OF 2015
7	
8	25-43-101. Title.
9	This chapter shall be known as and may be cited as the "Arkansas Sunset
10	Act of 2015".
11	
12	25-43-102. Definition.
13	As used in this chapter "state agency" means any department, agency,
14	board, commission, office, or other authority of the State of Arkansas.
15	
16	25-43-103. Sunset Review Subcommittee.
17	(a) There is created the Sunset Review Subcommittee that shall be a
18	subcommittee of the Joint Performance Review Committee.
19	(b) The voting membership of the subcommittee shall be composed of:
20	(1) No more than seven (7) members of the House of
21	Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives from
22	the membership of the House Joint Performance Review Committee; and
23	(2) No more than seven (7) Senate members appointed by the
24	President Pro Tempore of the Senate.
25	(3)(A) The President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall determine
26	the Senate cochair and vice chair of the subcommittee from the membership of
27	the Senate Performance Review Committee.
28	(B) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall
29	determine the House cochair and the vice chair of the subcommittee from the
30	membership of the House Performance Review Committee.
31	(4) For the interim meetings, legislative members shall be
32	entitled to reimbursement for expenses and per diem at the same rate and from
33	the same source as provided by law for attending other meetings of the
34	interim committee and interim subcommittee.
35	
36	<u>25-43-104. Staff.</u>

1	The Bureau of Legislative Research and Legislative Council shall
2	provide staff support for the Sunset Review Subcommittee.
3	
4	25-43-105. State agency report to the Sunset Review Subcommittee.
5	(a) Before October 30 of every odd-numbered year before the year in
6	which a state agency is to be reviewed under this chapter, the state agency
7	shall file a written report with the Sunset Review Subcommittee
8	(b) The written report under this section shall:
9	(1) Address the following:
10	(A) Efficiency and effectiveness of the agency's advisory
11	boards or committees;
12	(B) Success in achieving the agency's mission, goals, and
13	objectives;
14	(C) Performance of any duties not authorized by statute;
15	(D) Authority for specific duties performed by the agency;
16	(E) Necessity of the duties performed by the agency;
17	(F) The agency's authority related to fees, inspections,
18	enforcement, and penalties;
19	(G) Ways the agency's functions and operations can be less
20	burdensome or restrictive and still adequately protect and serve the public;
21	(H) The extent that the agency's programs and jurisdiction
22	duplicate those of other agencies and how well the agency coordinates with
23	those agencies;
24	(I) How well the agency complied with state and federal
25	requirements regarding equal employment opportunity, the rights and privacy
26	of individuals, and purchasing guidelines for historically underutilized
27	businesses;
28	(J) How effectively the agency enforces rules on potential
29	conflicts of interest of its employees;
30	(K) How effectively and efficiently the agency complies
31	with the Freedom of Information Act of 1967, § 25- 19-101 et seq.;
32	(L) Whether abolishing the agency would cause federal
33	government intervention or loss of federal funds;
34	(M) Whether the agency's statutory reporting requirements
35	effectively fulfill a useful purpose;
36	(N) If the agency is a professional licensing agency.

1	whether:
2	(i) The agency's professional licensing program
3	serve a meaningful public interest and provide the least restrictive form of
4	regulation needed to protect the public interest;
5	(ii) The program's regulatory objective be achieved
6	through market forces, private certification, and accreditation programs or
7	through enforcement of other law;
8	(iii) The skill and training requirements for a
9	license are consistent with a public interest, whether they impede
10	applicants, particularly those with moderate or low incomes, from entering
11	the occupation; and
12	(iv) There is an impact of the regulation on
13	competition, consumer choice, and the cost of services;
14	(2) Recommend less restrictive or alternate methods of
15	performing agency functions that could adequately protect the public; and
16	(3) Include any other information that:
17	(A) The state agency considers appropriate; or
18	(B) Is requested by the subcommittee.
19	
20	25-43-106. Subcommittee duties.
21	(a) Before September 1 of every even-numbered year before the year in
22	which a state agency subject to this chapter is to be reviewed under this
23	chapter, the Sunset Review Subcommittee shall:
24	(1) Review and take action necessary to verify the reports
25	submitted by the state agency under § 25-43-105;
26	(2) Consult the Legislative Council, the office of the Governor,
27	the Legislative Auditor, and the Director of the Department of Finance and
28	Administration concerning the reports filed under § 25-43-105 and the
29	criteria under § 25-43-108;
30	(3) Conduct a performance evaluation of the state agency based
31	on the criteria provided in § 25-43-108 and prepare a written report;
32	(4) Hold one (1) or more public meetings at which public comment
33	and explanation by the agency are allowed; and
34	(5) Review the implementation of subcommittee recommendations
35	contained in the reports presented to the General Assembly during the
36	preceding legislative session.

1	(b) The written report prepared by the subcommittee under subdivision
2	(a)(3) of this section shall be considered a public record.
3	
4	25-43-107. Subcommittee report.
5	(a)(1) At each regular session of the General Assembly, the Sunset
6	Review Subcommittee shall present to the General Assembly a:
7	(A) Report on the state agencies scheduled to be reviewed
8	on June 30 of the year in which the regular session occurs; and
9	(B) The subcommittee's recommendations based on the
10	matters prescribed by § 25-43-109.
11	(2) The General Assembly shall forward a copy of the report to
12	the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor, and the Legislative Auditor for their
13	review.
14	(b) The subcommittee's report shall include:
15	(1) Its specific findings regarding each of the criteria
16	prescribed by § 25-43-108; and
17	(2) Any other information the subcommittee deems necessary for a
18	complete evaluation of the state agency.
19	
20	25-43-108. Criteria for review.
21	The Sunset Review Subcommittee and its staff shall consider the
22	following criteria in determining whether the state agency remains cost
23	effective and performs its intended functions:
24	(1) The efficiency with which the state agency operates;
25	(2) An identification of the objectives intended for the state
26	agency;
27	(3) An identification of the public interest that the state
28	agency was intended to address;
29	(4) An identification of the extent to which the objectives of
30	the agency have been achieved,
31	(5) An identification of the activities of the state agency and
32	the legal authority for these activities;
33	(6) An assessment of less restrictive or alternate methods of
34	performing any regulation that the state agency performs that could
35	adequately protect the public;
36	(7) The extent to which the state agency is needed and is used:

1	(8) The extent to which the jurisdiction of the state agency and
2	the programs administered by the state agency overlap or duplicate those of
3	other state agencies and the extent to which the programs administered by the
4	state agency can be consolidated with the programs of other state agencies;
5	(9) Whether the state agency has recommended to the legislature
6	statutory changes calculated to be of benefit to the public rather than to an
7	occupation, a business, or an institution that the state agency regulates;
8	(10) The promptness and effectiveness with which the state
9	agency disposes of complaints concerning persons affected by the state
10	agency;
11	(11) The extent to which the state agency has encouraged
12	participation by the public in making the state agency's rules and decisions
13	as opposed to participation solely by those the state agency regulates and
14	the extent to which the public participation has resulted in rules compatible
15	with the objectives of the state agency;
16	(12) The extent to which the state agency has complied with the
17	applicable requirements of:
18	(A) An agency of the United States or of this state
19	regarding equality of employment opportunity and the rights and privacy of
20	individuals; and
21	(B) State law and applicable rules of any state agency
22	regarding purchasing goals and programs for historically underutilized
23	businesses;
24	(13) The extent to which changes are necessary in the enabling
25	statutes of the state agency so that the state agency can adequately comply
26	with the criteria listed in this section;
27	(14) The extent to which the state agency issues and enforces
28	rules relating to potential conflicts of interest of its employees;
29	(15) The extent to which the state agency follows record
30	management practices that enable it to respond efficiently to requests for
31	<pre>public information;</pre>
32	(16) The effect of federal intervention or loss of federal funds
33	if the state agency is abolished; and
34	(17) Any other factor the subcommittee deems relevant.
35	
36	25-43-109. Recommendations.

I	(a) In its report on a state agency, the Sunset Review Subcommittee
2	shall:
3	(1) Make recommendations on the continuation, termination, or
4	reorganization of each affected state agency and on the need for the
5	performance of the functions of the state agency;
6	(2) Make recommendations on the consolidation, transfer, or
7	reorganization of programs within state agencies not under review when the
8	programs duplicate functions performed in state agencies under review;
9	(3) Recommend appropriation levels for each state agency for
10	which termination or reorganization is recommended under subdivision (a)(1)
11	or subdivision (a)(2) of this section; and
12	(4) Include drafts of legislation necessary to carry out the
13	subcommittee's recommendations under subdivisions (a)(1) and (2) of this
14	section.
15	(b)(1) The General Assembly shall forward a copy of the report to the
16	Legislative Auditor.
17	(2) Based on a risk assessment of and subject to the Legislative
18	Joint Auditing Committee's approval of the recommendations, including the
19	examination in the audit plan under § 25-43-110, the Legislative Auditor may
20	examine the recommendations that do not require a statutory change and
21	include as part of the next approved audit of the state agency a report on
22	whether the state agency has implemented the recommendations and, if so, in
23	what manner.
24	
25	25-43-110. Review of certain state agencies.
26	In the two-year period preceding the date scheduled for the review of a
27	state agency under this chapter, the Sunset Review Subcommittee may by
28	majority vote of the subcommittee exempt from the provisions of this chapter
29	relating to staff reports, hearings, and evaluations a state agency that has
30	been inactive for a period of two (2) years preceding the date the state
31	agency is scheduled for review.
32	
33	25-43-111. Monitoring of recommendations.
34	During each regular legislative session, the Sunset Review Subcommittee
35	shall monitor legislation affecting state agencies that have undergone review
36	under this chapter.

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2	25-43-112. Subpoena power.
3	(a)(1) The Sunset Review Subcommittee may issue process to compel the
4	attendance of witnesses and the production of books, records, papers, and
5	other objects necessary or proper for the purposes of the subcommittee
6	proceedings.
7	(2) The process may be served on a witness at any place in this
8	state.
9	(b) If a majority of the subcommittee directs the issuance of a
10	subpoena, the chair of the subcommittee shall issue the subpoena in the name
11	of the subcommittee.
12	(c) If the chair is absent, the chair's designee may issue a subpoena
13	or other process in the same manner as the chair.
14	(d)(l) If necessary to obtain compliance with a subpoena or other
15	process, the subcommittee may issue attachments.
16	(2) The attachments may be addressed to and served by any peace
17	officer in this state.
18	(e) Testimony taken under subpoena shall be reduced to writing and
19	given under oath subject to the penalty of perjury.
20	(f) A witness who attends a subcommittee proceeding under process is
21	entitled to the same mileage and per diem as a witness who appears before a
22	grand jury in this state.
23	
24	25-43-113. Assistance and access to state agencies.
25	(a)(1) The Sunset Review Subcommittee may request the assistance of
26	state agencies and officers.
27	(2) When assistance is requested, a state agency or officer may
28	assist the subcommittee.
29	(b) In carrying out its functions under this chapter, the subcommittee
30	or its designated staff member may inspect the records, documents, and files
31	of any state agency.
32	
33	25-43-114. Records protected from disclosure.
34	A record held by another entity that is confidential by law and that
35	the Sunset Review Subcommittee receives in connection with the performance of
36	the subcommittee's functions under this chanter or another law remains

1	confidential and is excepted from the Freedom of Information Act of 1967, §
2	<u>25-19-101</u> et seq.
3	
4	25-43-115. Gifts and grants.
5	(a) The Sunset Review Subcommittee may accept gifts, grants, and
6	donations from any organization described in Section 501(c)(3) of the
7	Internal Revenue Code, 26 U.S.C. § 501(c)(3), as it existed on January 1,
8	2005, for the purpose of funding any activity under this chapter.
9	(b) All gifts, grants, and donations shall be:
10	(1) Accepted in an open meeting by a majority of the voting
11	members of the subcommittee; and
12	(2) Reported in the public record of the subcommittee with the
13	name of the donor and the purpose of the gift, grant, or donation.
14	
15	25-43-116. Attrition.
16	Whenever possible, state government is encouraged to utilize attrition
17	as a long-term approach to reducing state agency costs and as a means of
18	saving taxpayer money.
19	
20	25-43-117. Review of proposed legislation creating regulatory state
21	agency.
22	(a) Each bill filed in the General Assembly that would create a new
23	state agency having regulatory authority shall be forwarded to the Sunset
24	Review Subcommittee.
25	(b) The subcommittee shall review the bill to determine if:
26	(1) The proposed regulatory functions or other functions of the
27	state agency or committee may be administered by one (1) or more existing
28	state agencies;
29	(2) The form of regulation, if any, proposed by the bill is the
30	least restrictive form of regulation that will adequately protect the public;
31	(3) The bill provides for adequate public input regarding any
32	regulatory function proposed by the bill; and
33	(4) The bill provides for adequate protection against conflicts
34	of interest within the state agency.
35	(c) After reviewing the bill, the subcommittee shall forward a written
36	comment on the legislation to the sponsor of the hill and to the chair of the

1	committee to which the bill is referred.
