5	amended to add an additional section to read as follows:		
6	23-18-108. Prepaid energy program.		
7	(a) The Arkansas Public Service Commission shall develop and implemen		
8	a prepaid energy program to:		
9	(1) Provide temporary assistance to maintain access to		
10	electrical service for personal and household use to qualified citizens		
11	through public and private resources;		
12	(2) Establish qualifications for participation in the program;		
13	(3) Establish an application and decision-making process to		
14	select qualified applicants and program partners;		
15	(4) Determine the rules and procedures for participation in the		
16	program; and		
17	(5) Maximize public and private resources for the benefit of the		
18	program.		
19	(b)(1) The commission shall file an annual report with the Legislative		
20	Council and the House and Senate cochairs of the Joint Committee on Energy of		
21	or before October 1.		
22	(2) The report shall include without limitation:		
23	(A) A summary of the program;		
24	(B) The number and location of program participants;		
25	(C) Funding sources and funding needs to adequately reach		
26	the target population for the program;		
27	(D) Providers of electricity that participate in the		
28	program; and		
29	(E) Recommendations to improve the program.		
30	(c) The commission may promulgate rules to implement this section.
